#### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTIONS 1 AND 2 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, ALTERING THE DESCRIPTION OF THE BUTTON MAKING TRADE CONTAINED IN THE APPENDIX TO THE MINISTER'S SPECIAL ORDER DATED AUGUST 6TH, 1924.

Whereas it is provided by Sub-Section 4 of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that, if the Minister of Labour is of the opinion that it is desirable to alter or amend the description of any of the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, he may make a Special Order altering or amending the said Schedule accordingly;

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable to alter the description of the trade specified in the Appendix to his Special Order dated August 6th, 1924;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour in pursuance of the powers in him vested as before cited does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the seventh day of September, 1925, the following provisions shall have effect, that is to say:—

Article I.—The description of the trade specified in the said Appendix to the said Special Order dated August 6th, 1924, shall be altered by the substitution therefor of the description set out in the Appendix to this Order.

Article II.—This Order may be cited as the TRADE BOARDS (BUTTON MANUFACTURING) ORDER, 1925.

#### APPENDIX.

##### TRADE.

1. Subject to the provisions of this Appendix the following operations and processes shall constitute the Button Manufacturing Trade:—

(a) All processes and operations in the making from any material other than precious metals and precious stones of buttons, button moulds, metal fancy buttons, button-headed studs, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding in all cases, except as hereinafter provided, the making of the shanks), or in the covering of button-moulds.

(b) All processes and operations in the making of the following articles when done in association with or in conjunction with the work specified in sub-paragraph (a) above—

- (i) shanks;
- (ii) studs, links or parts thereof from any material other than metal;
- (iii) clasps, slides, ornaments and similar articles used on wearing apparel when such articles are made—

(1) wholly or mainly from any material other than metal, and

(2) in a branch or department in which articles mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) are made or carded.

(c)—(i) the carding wherever carried on of any of the articles specified in sub-paragraph (a) above;

(ii) the carding of any of the articles specified in sub-paragraph (b) above except when done apart from any of the making which is included in the trade herein specified and from the carding of articles specified in sub-paragraph (a).

(d) The manufacture of metal small-wares as specified in paragraphs (1) to (6) of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1924, when carried on in an establishment mainly engaged in any of the processes or operations mentioned above.

(e) All processes and operations in the (i) assembling or (ii) finishing of articles specified above when done in association with or in conjunction with any of the above mentioned processes or operations.

(f) All processes and operations in the warehousing, packing, or despatching of any of the articles specified above when done in association with or in conjunction with any of the above-mentioned processes or operations.

2. Notwithstanding anything in this Appendix the following processes or operations shall not be processes or operations of the Button Manufacturing Trade:—

(a) The manufacture of wooden button-moulds where not carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;

(b) The making of buttons or the covering of button-moulds in an establishment in which (i) such work is performed in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel, and (ii) the majority of the buttons made or of the button-moulds covered are for use on such wearing apparel.

(c) The making of buttons or the covering of button-moulds when done in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of embroidery and trimmings, unless such making of buttons or covering of button-moulds is done (i) by machine process, and (ii) in a separate department by workers exclusively engaged thereon.

(d) The processes or operations specified in paragraph 1 above when performed in an establishment mainly engaged in the manufacture of articles or real or imitation jewellery except when performed by a worker who during the whole time that he works in any week in such establishment is wholly or mainly employed on such processes or operations.

(e) Any work which by paragraph 7 of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1924, is included in the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares trade.

LONDON AND HOME COUNTIES ELECTRICITY  
DISTRICT ORDER, 1925.

JOINT AUTHORITY: REPRESENTATIVES OF  
WORKERS IN THE INDUSTRY.

The Ministry of Labour hereby gives notice that as soon as may be after the 29th day of August, 1925, he will designate to the Electricity Commissioners, in accordance with Section 2 (10) of Part I. of the First Annex to the First Schedule to the London and Home Counties Electricity District Order, 1925, the employees' organisations having members in the employment of authorised Undertakers in the district, in order that the organisations so designated may choose two representatives of persons employed in connection with the supply of electricity in the district to be members of the Joint Authority.

Any employees' organisation which is desirous of being considered by the Minister for designation under the said Section 2 (10) should make application in writing to the Minister not later than the 29th day of August, 1925, on the form provided for the purpose, of which copies may be obtained from the Secretary, Ministry of Labour, Montagu House, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

#### PEACE TREATIES.

TREATY (OF VERSAILLES) WITH GERMANY.

AMENDMENTS, DATED JULY 24, 1925, OF THE RULES OF PROCEDURE OF THE ANGLO-GERMAN MIXED ARBITRAL TRIBUNAL (S.R. & O., 1920, No. 2062) CONSTITUTED UNDER ARTICLE 304 OF THE TREATY OF VERSAILLES.

1. In Rule 1, as amended by Rule 1 of S.R. & O., 1925, No. 176, after the words "from the last mentioned date" insert:—

provided always that the period of four months hereinbefore referred to shall be extended in the case of claims from India to six months, and, in the case of claims from

the Commonwealth of Australia and the Dominion of New Zealand to nine months from the date of notification to the creditor Clearing Office of final rejection of the claim under the Agreement of the 13th September, 1924, between the British and the German Governments which became operative for India as from the 6th April, 1925, and for Australia and New Zealand as from the 1st May, 1925.

2. In Rule 22 (3), insert at the end of the Rule:—

provided that no notice of intention to refer a case to the Tribunal shall be necessary where, under the terms of the Agreement of the 13th September, 1924, between the British and German Governments, Article 4, the debtor Clearing Office has, after the 1st March, 1925, served the creditor Clearing Office with notice of the final rejection of a claim under Article 296.

(The Supply of Electricity by the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City and county of the City of Chester in the Urban District of Tarporley and parts of the Rural District of Tarvin all in the County of Chester; Further Powers to break up streets and railways in existing area of supply.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County of the City of Chester (hereinafter called "the Corporation") whose address is the Town Hall, Chester intend to apply to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply under the Chester Electric Lighting Order, 1890, and the Chester Electricity (Extension) Special Order, 1923, by adding thereto the urban district of Tarporley in the County of Chester; the parishes or Townships of Aldersey, Ashton, Barton, Beeston, Broxton, Bruen Stapleford, Burton-by-Tarporley, Burwardsley, Caldecott, Carden, Chowley, Churton-by-Aldford, Churton-by-Farndon, Churton Heath or Bruera, Clotton Hoofield, Clutton, Coddington, Crewe-by-Farndon, Duddon, Edgerley, Farndon, Foulk Stapleford, Golborn Bellow, Golborn-David, Grafton, Handley, Harthill, Hatton, Horton-by-Malpas, Horton-cum-Peele, Huxley, Iddenshall, Kelsall, King's Marsh, Lea Newbold, Mouldsworth, Newton-by-Tattenhall, Pryors Hayes, Shocklach Church, Shocklach Oviatt, Stretton, Tattenhall, Tilston, Tilston Fearnall, Tiverton and Willington in the Rural District of Tarvin in the said County of Chester; and so much of the parish or township of Aldford in the said Rural District of Tarvin as lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing at the junction of the River Dee and Pulford Brook thence proceeding in a straight line past the quarry to the fork in the Aldford to Holt Road south of Aldford School thence proceeding in a straight line to the junction of Aldford and Plowley Brooks;

The areas so proposed to be added to the said area of supply are hereinafter referred to as "the added areas."

2. To authorise the Corporation to generate and supply electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, within all portions of the added areas.

3. To extend and make applicable to the added areas all or some of the provisions contained in the Chester Electric Lighting Order 1890 and the Chester Electricity (Extension) Special Order 1923 and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

4. To incorporate in the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable and to apply such provisions to the undertaking authorised by the said Order of 1890 or to be authorised by the Order with such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

5. To authorise the Corporation to open, break up, and interfere with all streets, roads and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the area of supply, and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove either above or underground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Corporation to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity within the added areas, and to confer all such other powers upon the Corporation as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

6. To prescribe the maximum price or maximum prices that may be demanded and taken by the Corporation in respect of the supply of electrical energy within the added areas and to prescribe the minimum prices to be paid by persons supplied with electricity by the Corporation or connected to their electricity undertaking in those areas.

7. The names of the streets and parts of streets in the added areas in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down

within a period to be specified by the Order are as follows:—
