NON-CONTENTIOUS PROBATE RULES.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Mrs. Lilian Peyto, employed by Messrs. Holdsworth Bros., at White Hart Road, Plumstead, in the following circumstances:—

Mrs. Lilian Peyto is employed at the Factory of Messrs. Holdsworth Bros., at White Hart Road, Plumstead, where flock is manufactured. The flock is delivered from rag grinding machines and falls to the floor in heaps and is then packed by women into large sacks. On the 17th June, 1925, a woman named Rose Wade was working at one of these machines, which was placed in a corner, and the woman was between the machine and the wall of the Factory. The flock which was being delivered from the machine suddenly caught fire and the fire spread immediately to the heap of flock which was being placed in the bag by Rose Wade. The woman's clothes, which were covered with small particles of flock, caught fire and there was fire all round the machine. Rose Wade tried to run out from behind the machine but stumbled and fell. Mrs. Peyto, who was working on the other side of the machine, rushed to her assistance, caught hold of her and tried to drag her clear. A heavy sack of waste material which was suspended behind the machine and which had itself caught fire fell down on the girl and

forced Mrs. Peyto to leave go. She again, however, went to Rose Wade's assistance and this time was able to drag her out of the flames a good distance. All the other women working in the neighbourhood appear to have been too horror-stricken to render help and left the dangerous area as quickly as possible. After Mrs. Peyto had dragged the burning woman away from the fire, a foreman came up and covered her with sacks, but Rose Wade died as a result of her injury.

Mrs. Peyto's attempt at rescue was attended with grave risks, as Rose Wade was surrounded with flames and the clothing of Mrs. Peyto herself might easily have caught fire. Her second and successful attempt to get the woman clear after the burning bag of material had fallen on her showed special courage.

SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT SIDMOUTH AND SALCOMBE REGIS.

PROHIBITION OF REMOVAL OF MATERIALS.

Whereas the Board of Trade acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, found it necessary for the protection of the port of Exeter to issue an Order dated the 17th day of December, 1908, prohibiting the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast on the shores or banks of the sea between the points situate respectively about 266 yards east and 1,870 yards west of the seaward end of Fore Street, Sidmouth, within the said port.

And whereas for the further protection of the said port the Board of Trade did by an Order dated the 7th day of August, 1924, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea at Salcombe Regis between the eastern boundary of the Urban District of Sidmouth (being approximately the mouth of the River Sid) and Salcombe Mouth (being about one mile 123 yards eastward from the mouth of the River Sid) in the parish of Salcombe Regis in the County of Devon within the said port.

And whereas the Urban District Council of Sidmouth desire to construct certain sea defence works at Sidmouth, and to remove for the purposes of the said sea defence works a quantity of 2,500 cubic yards or thereabouts of sand shingle or ballast from the shore adjacent to the said Urban District and adjoining it on the east in the parish of Salcombe Regis such shore being part of the shores or banks within the limits specified in the said Orders of the 17th day of December, 1908, and the 7th day of August, 1924.

Now therefore the Board of Trade do by this Order revoke the said Orders of the 17th

December, 1908, and the 7th August, 1924, so far only as those Orders prohibit the taking or removing by the said Urban District Council their servants or workmen for the purposes of the said sea defence works of any shingle or ballast (not exceeding in all 2,500 cubic yards thereof) from the shore at Sidmouth and Salcombe Regis between a point 100 yards eastward of the River Sid and the western groyne at the western end of the esplanade, being about 470 yards westward of the seaward end of Fore Street, Sidmouth, and the Board of Trade do hereby declare that in all other respects the said Orders of the 17th December, 1908, and the 7th August, 1924, shall remain in full force and effect.

LONDON TRAFFIC.

RESTRICTED STREETS.

London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Regulations, 1925, dated the 24th day of August, 1925, made by the Minister of Transport under the London Traffic Act, 1924. (14 & 15 Geo. 5, c. 34.)

Whereas by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Order, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925, No. 648), the Minister of Transport declared certain streets within the London Traffic Area to be and the same are hereinafter referred to as "restricted streets."

Now therefore the Minister of Transport, under and in pursuance of the powers given to him under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and without prejudice to any further exercise of the said powers, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Regulations, 1925."

2. Subject as in these Regulations provided, it shall not be lawful for any person to use or allow to be used at any time upon a week day in any restricted street or part thereof for the purpose of plying for hire along that street or part thereof any greater number of omnibuses than might, under and in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him under that Section with the licensing authority and in force on the fourth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, have been used by him at that time on that week-day in that street or part thereof for the purpose of maintaining along that street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules.

3. The restrictions and limitations imposed by the foregoing Regulation shall be subject to the following modifications and exceptions:—

(a) The provisions of Regulation 2 hereof shall not apply on Good Friday, the day following Good Friday, Bank Holidays and days appointed by Proclamation to be Bank Holidays.

(b) On Saturdays, from and after 12 o'clock noon, the number of omnibuses which it shall be lawful under Regulation 2 hereof for any person to use for the purpose of plying for hire along any restricted street or part of a restricted street shall be increased by 10 per cent.

4. The Minister of Transport may, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, by notice published in the London Gazette, dispense with or relax on any occasion the restrictions imposed by these Regulations, either generally or in the case of particular streets or parts thereof.

THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

THE LONDON TRAFFIC (RESTRICTED STREETS) REGULATIONS, 1925, AND THE LONDON TRAFFIC (RESTRICTED STREETS) (No. 2) REGULATIONS, 1925.
