By virtue of an Act passed in the 24th year of the Reign of His Majesty King George III, intituled, "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the 10th § 15th years of the Reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes The Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out Writs for the Election of Members to serve in Parliament in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes;" And of an Act passed in the 26th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess."

NON-CONTENTIOUS PROBATE RULES.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the President of the Probate, Divorce and Admiralty Division of the High Court of Justice, with the concurrence of the Lord Chancellor and the Lord Chief Justice of England proposes to make Rules for regulating the procedure and practice of the High Court in regard to non-contentious or common form probate business.

1. For the purposes of the Administration of Estates Act, 1925, and the Administration of Justice Act, 1925,

(a) Amending Rules Nos. 30, 37, 39, 50, 62, 66 and 76 of the Principal Probate Registry Non-Contentious Rules, and Rules Nos. 36, 43, 46, 61, 72, 74, 75 and 89 of the District Registries Non-Contentious Probate Rules.

(b) Introducing new Rules.

2. Introducing new forms of Administration Bonds to come into force on the 1st day of October, 1925.
