Naples, June 24. N. S.

THE Popes and Maltese Galleys are failed together to join the Venetian Fleet in the *Levant*; with the latter are gone about 1200 Land Forces, and a great many Knights of *Malta*, as Volunteers. The Galleys of this Kingdom are now fitting out, being ordered to join with those of *Sicily*, and to sail towards *Genoa* and *Final*, to convoy some Regiments that are intended to be sent from the last of these Places to *Catalonia*.

Genoua, June 30. On the 28th of this month arrived here 3 Galleys of the Duke of *Tursis's* Squadron, and the Galleys of *Sicily* are daily expected in this Port. A Vessel is arrived here from the Coast of *Barbary*, the Master whereof reports, that the War continues between the King of *Morocco* and the Government of *Argiers*, and that the Dey was gone into the Field with a considerable Army; The Algerines have sent several Men of War to join the Ottoman Fleet in the *Levant*; and the Tunifins and Tripolins have the like, the Turks supplying them Money for this Service.

Genoa, July 5. The last week thence several Vessels, having on board about 300 Soldiers, with a Supply of Ammunition for *Dalmatia*: And a Convoy is now getting ready, to convey Provisions and other Necessaries for the Venetian Fleet and Army in the *Levant*; According to the last Advices thence the Captain-General intended to go to Sea about the latter end of *June*, and in the mean time had sent

some of the Principal Officers of the Land Forces to view the new Fortifications he had ordered to be made near the Isthmus of *Corinth*, and to give such further Directions as should be found necessary for the Security of that Pass; Tho, considering how small a number of Troops the Enemy are in a condition to bring together in those parts, there is very little reason to apprehend their making any Attempt against the *Morea*. The *Morlaques* give the Turks a great deal of Disturbance; and the last Letters from *Dalmatia* say, they had made Incursions in 3 several Bodies, and were all returned with good store of Booty. The Letters from *Rome* give an account of the Death of Cardinal *Denhoff*, so that there are now Eight Vacancies in the College of Cardinals, and there is a Discourse, that the Pope will shortly make a Promotion.

Centa in *Barbary*, July 1. The Governor of this Place has received several Advices of the great Desire the Moors have at present to make a Peace or Truce with this Garrison, having occasion to make use elsewhere of the Troops now employed in this Siege; There have already passed some Messages between the Alcayde *Ali*, who commands them, and our Governor, and we have ground to believe 'twill not be long before the Enemy withdraw from before this place.

Kinsale, July 16. This day arrived here the *Hastings*, Capt. *Draper* Commander, from *Wexford*, with several Merchant Vessels under his Convoy. The last week came in here the *New-Nasbit* of *London*, burthen 300 Tuns, from *Newis*.

Dublin, July 20. The Lords Justices and Council have prepared and transmitted

mitted to England divers Bills to be laid before the Parliament, which is to meet here the 27th of this month. We have an account from *Armagh*, by Letters of the 17th Instant, that notice being brought thither, that one *Macnally* and other Rapparees, who had for a long time infested that Road, and lately murdered Capt. *Groves* after being several days their Prisoner, were got together in a House about 3 or 4 miles from *Armagh*; Capt. *Macblin*, with about 12 of his Company, went out in order to surprize them, but the Rapparees being informed thereof by a Spy they had placed at some distance, they got to their Horses, and made away as fast as they could; Capt. *Macblin* pursued them, and the Rapparees fired many Shots, but after an hours pursuit, *Macnally* and *Mushans*, two of the Chiefest of them, were killed, and their Heads were brought to *Armagh*, and fixed upon the Seffions House there.

Newcastle, July 20. On Sunday last came to our Bar the *Diligence of London* from *Virginia*, having on Board above 600 Hogheads of Tobacco; She came in Company of 3 more, from whom she was separated in bad Weather.

Yarmouth, July 21. Yesterday came into this Road about 80 Sail of Light Colliers from the Southward, and passed through our Road with a fair Wind, but it changing this morning they are all put back again; Here are now above 150 Sail of Light Colliers. The *Oxford* and *Dreadnought* Anchored this day off of *Lowestoff*, being to convoy a Fleet of Laden Ships to *Holland*.

Yarmouth, July 23. Yesterday failed out of this Road about 200 Sail of Light Colliers, with their Convoy the *Henry-Prince*; as also the Fleet for *Holland* under Convoy of the *Oxford* and *Dreadnought*. The *Sweetshakes* is come into this Road.

Westminster, July 22. The Parliament met this day, and was again Prorogued to the 26th day of *August* next.

Whitehall, July 24. By Letters from the Fleet under the command of Sir *George Ruks*, dated the 21th of this month about 18 Leagues N. E. from the *Lizard*, we are informed, that they were then sailing towards *Torbay*; and that Rear-Admiral *Berbow* had left the Fleet, and was gone in His Majesties Ship the

Newarke, towards *Dunkirke*, to command the Squadron that lies before that place.

There are Two Mails due from *Holland* besides that of *Friday* last.
