URBAN DISTRICT OF CALVERLEY.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BY an Order dated the 24th day of August, 1925, the Minister of Health has declared that on and after the 12th day of October, 1925, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Urban District of Calverley namely :—

- Part II (streets and buildings).
- Part III (sanitary provisions).
- Part IV (infectious diseases).
- Part V (common lodging-houses), and
- Part VI (recreation grounds).

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Sections 23, 25, 27, 30, 35, 38 and 75, to the conditions specified in the Order.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

NOTICE is hereby given that by an Order dated the 24th day of August, 1925, the Minister of Health has confirmed an Order made on the 28th day of July, 1925, by the Urban District Council of Gellygaer in pursuance of Section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by Section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, declaring the trade of a rag and bone dealer within the Urban District to be an offensive trade.

THE DIVIDED PARISHES AND POOR LAW AMENDMENT ACT, 1876: SECTION 13.

*Changing Name of Union.*

CHRISTCHURCH UNION.

THE Minister of Health, on the application of the Guardians of the Poor of the Christchurch Union, and in pursuance of the powers granted to him under section 13 of the Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876, hereby orders that the name of the Christchurch Union shall, subject to the conditions contained in the said section, be changed to the Bournemouth and Christchurch Union.

This Order shall come into operation on the 7th day of September, 1925, and the Guardians shall forthwith cause it to be published in the London Gazette, and in some newspaper circulating in their district.

This Order may be cited as the CHRISTCHURCH UNION (CHANGE OF NAME) ORDER, 1925.
