The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Provided that no Hackney Carriages shall be suffered to stand across any Street or Thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any Street or Carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the Carriageway.
