HUDDERSFIELD CORPORATION (GENERAL POWERS) ACT, 1920.

Motor Omnibus Service, Huddersfield-RAVENSTHORPE—DEWSBURY.

WHEREAS by Sub-section 2 of Section 27 of the Huddersfield Corporation (General Powers) Act, 1920, it is provided that the Corporation of Huddersfield (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") may with the consent of the Minister of Transport and of the Road Authority run omnibuses along any road; notice is hereby given, that in pursuance of the said Sub-section the Corporation have made application to the Minister of Transport for his consent to the running by them of motor omnibuses on the roads comprised in the following route that is to say:

From the present terminus in Huddersfield Road, Dewsbury, of the motor omnibus service run by the Corporation from thence along Huddersfield (066) Huddersfield,

Road, Webster Hill, Aldams Road, Church Street, Westgate and Market Place to a stand in Longcauseway, Dewsbury, returning from Longeauseway by Vicarage Road, Church Street, Aldams Road, Webster Hill and Huddersfield Road to the present terminus in Huddersfield Road, all within the County Borough of Dewsbury.

And notice is hereby further given, that objection to the giving of such consent may be sent in writing to the Assistant Secretary (Roads Department) Ministry of Transport, 7, White-hall Gardens, London, S.W. 1, on or before the 3rd day of October, 1925. A copy of any objection should at the same time be sent by the objector to the Town Clerk, Town Hall, Huddersfield.
