The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an order authorising the employment on two day shifts of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in the bottle washing room and the boiling, wrapping and packing of boiled sweets room at the works of Messrs. T. W. Parker and Company, County Confectionery Works, Old Infirmary Buildings, Newcastle-on-Tyne, subject to the conditions that no worker shall be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; with suitable protective clothing for those employed in the bottle washing room, and that a woman or young person shall not be allowed to lift, carry or move anything so heavy as to be likely to cause injury to such women or young person.

Fletcher, Derby Road, Heanor, Derbyshire, subject to the conditions that no worker shall be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided; and that suitable arrangements shall be made for conveying to and from the works any women or young persons employed in shifts who live at a distance from the factory.
