COUNTY BOROUGH OF BIRKENHEAD.

Public Health Acts (Amendment) Act, 1907.

BY an Order dated the 16th September, 1925, the Secretary of State, in pursuance of the powers thereunto him enabling, has declared the following sections of the Public Health Acts (Amendment) Act, 1907, to be in force in the County Borough of Birkenhead subject to the conditions set out opposite those sections:—

Part VII (Police):-

Section 81 (Extending definition of public place and streets for certain purposes); provided that any unfenced ground on the Estate of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board shall not be deemed to be a street for so much of the purposes of the provisions of section 28 of the Town Police Clauses Act, 1847, as relate to the throwing or laying of dirt, litter, rubbish, ashes, or night soil, or any carrion, fish, offal, or rubbish,

Section 85 (Registries for Servants), Section 86 (As to dealers in old metal and marine stores) so far as it relates to dealers in old metal,
