## NOTICE.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD)
. REGULATIONS, 1925.

The Minister of Health gives notice, in pursuance of the above named Regulations, that he hereby recognises for the purposes of item (b) of the Second Schedule to the Regulations, i.e. Lard dripping, edible tallow and similar rendered fats, each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the package containing the meat, and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

The label hereby recognised as an Official Certificate for meat imported from ITALY is in substitution for the label of which particulars were given in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of 22nd May, 1925.
