PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of August, 1925 (C.W. 6308/25), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the sixth day of February, 1925, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to direct that the rate of half pay for Warrant Officers, Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank and Officers promoted therefrom for long and zealous service or after examination both in the Royal Navy and in the Royal Marines should be half the rate of full pay applicable to their rank and seniority, subject to the proviso in the case of Officers of the Royal Navy whose

full pay is on the Mechanical scale, that the rate of half pay should be half the rate of full pay applicable to their rank and seniority on the Non-Mechanical scale:

“And whereas Officers of the Royal Navy promoted for acts of gallantry or daring and Officers of the Royal Marines promoted for specially meritorious service or distinguished war service are under existing regulations entitled to full pay at the same rates as Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, promoted for long and zealous service:

“And whereas we are of opinion that their rates of half pay should likewise be assimilated to those of Officers promoted from Warrant rank or from Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank for long and zealous service, subject to the same proviso as regards Naval Officers whose full pay is on the Mechanical scale:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction this proposal which has received the assent of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of September, 1925 (C.W./2797/25), in the words following, viz. :—

“ Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“ And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 16th day of February, 1903, provision was made for the half pay time served by Naval or Marine Officers as Secretary or Aide-de-Camp to a Naval Officer appointed as Governor of a self-governing Colony to be allowed to count in full for all Naval purposes :

“ And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 1st day of April, 1922, authority was given to us to allow the service of such Officers as Aide-de-Camp to a Governor-General or Governor to count at our discretion for all purposes as though it were service in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, irrespective of whether half pay is issued from Naval funds or not :

“ And whereas we are of opinion that half pay should not be issued to Officers of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines appointed as Aides-de-Camp, or Secretaries on the personal staff of a Governor-General or Governor of a Dominion or Colony, and that the conditions applicable to such appointments should be more clearly defined :

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ 1. An Officer of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines allowed to accept an appointment as Secretary or Aide-de-Camp, on the personal staff of the Governor-General or Governor of a British Dominion or Colony shall not receive half pay or other emoluments from Naval funds during the tenure of such appointment.

“ 2. Time served in an appointment as aforesaid may be allowed at the discretion of the Admiralty to count for all purposes as though it were service in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, subject to the following limitations.

“ 3. The time will not count for purposes of retired pay unless the Officer remains on the Active List for a period of three years subsequent to the termination of the appointment; this rule may however be waived if failure to complete the three years is due to causes beyond the Officer's own control.

“ 4. The period of time served as Secretary, Aide-de-Camp, etc., which may be allowed to count as service under paragraph 2 will not exceed three years.

“ 5. Time served as an ‘ extra ’ Aide-de-Camp will not count as service in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, or for retired pay, but will count for seniority, or promotion which normally takes place according to seniority, and for increment of full and half pay which depend on seniority.

“ 6. The foregoing rules not to be applicable to any appointment of the nature referred to therein which may have commenced prior to the date of this Order.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make regulations for any matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation, and for giving full effect to any of the provisions of the said Act; and in particular His Majesty is empowered amongst other things by any such Order in Council to make such adaptations of any enactments, so far as they relate to Northern Ireland, as may appear to Him necessary or proper, in order to give effect to the provisions of the said Act; and also to make any adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to England or Scotland as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of any change effected by the provisions of the said Act :

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

Short Title and Commencement.

1. This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Petitions of Right Acts) Adaptation Order, 1925.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) In this Order, the expression “ the Act of 1860 ” means the Petitions of Right Act, 1860.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Adaptation of the Act of 1860.

3.—(1) If in relation to any petition of right, the subject matter of which arises in Northern Ireland,—

(a) any question arises whether the petition relates wholly to matters within the powers of the Parliament or Government of Northern Ireland, or partly to matters within and partly to matters outside those powers, or wholly to matters outside those powers; or

(b) any question arises whether the relief to which the suppliant may be entitled is to be afforded, or any costs against the suppliant are to be recovered, by the Government of the United Kingdom or the Government of Northern Ireland or both Governments, or as to the apportionment or adjustment of any such joint liability or right as between the two Governments;

the question shall be determined in such manner as the Treasury and the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland may agree.

(2) Where any such petition relates wholly to matters within the powers of the Parliament or Government of Northern Ireland, sections eleven, thirteen and fourteen of and the Schedule to the Act of 1860 shall, in their application to the petition and proceedings consequent thereon be subject to the following modifications:—

(a) the certificate to be made under section thirteen of the Act of 1860 shall be a certificate to the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland; and accordingly in the Schedule to that Act the reference to the Treasury shall be construed as a reference to the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland;

(b) the amount of any moneys and costs as to which a judgment or decree, rule or order, is given or made that the suppliant is entitled, shall be paid by the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland and accordingly in section fourteen of the Act of 1860 references to the Treasury and to Parliament shall respectively be construed as references to the Ministry of Finance and to the Parliament of Northern Ireland;

(c) any costs recovered on behalf of His Majesty shall be paid into the Exchequer of Northern Ireland and shall become part of the Consolidated Fund of Northern Ireland, and accordingly in section eleven of the Act of 1860 references to the Exchequer and to the Consolidated Fund shall respectively be construed as references to the Exchequer and to the Consolidated Fund of Northern Ireland.

(3) Where any such petition relates partly to matters within and partly to matters outside the powers of the Parliament or Government of Northern Ireland, sections eleven, thirteen and fourteen of and the Schedule to the Act of 1860 shall, in their application to the petition and proceedings consequent thereon, be subject to the following modifications:—

(a) the certificate to be made under section thirteen of the Act of 1860 shall be a certificate to the Treasury and to the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland; and accordingly in the Schedule to that Act

the reference to the Treasury shall be construed as including a reference also to the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland;

(b) the amount of any money and costs as to which a judgment or decree, rule or order is given or made that the suppliant is entitled, shall, to such extent as the same may be determined in manner aforesaid to be payable by the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, be paid by that Ministry; and accordingly, as respects the amount so payable by that Ministry, in section fourteen of the Act of 1860, references to the Treasury and to Parliament shall respectively be construed as references to the Ministry of Finance and to the Parliament of Northern Ireland;

(c) any costs recovered on behalf of His Majesty shall to such extent as the same may be determined in manner aforesaid to be payable to the Exchequer of Northern Ireland, be paid into that Exchequer and shall become part of the Consolidated Fund of Northern Ireland; and, accordingly, in section eleven of the Act of 1860, as respects that amount, references to the Exchequer and to the Consolidated Fund shall respectively be construed as references to the Exchequer and to the Consolidated Fund of Northern Ireland.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in His Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman, or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, as amended by section 1 of the War Pensions Act, 1920, it is enacted that there shall be transferred to the Minister of Pensions (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister"), certain powers and duties of the Admiralty with respect to pensions and grants to persons who have served as officers or men, and to their widows, children, and other dependants:

And whereas provision was made in His Majesty's Order in Council of 11th June, 1920, and by Regulations thereto annexed (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations of 1920") for pensions to certain seamen and marines disabled in consequence of the Great War (hereinafter referred to as "the war"), and to the widows, children and dependants of seamen and marines whose death was due to or occurred during service in the war:

And whereas His Majesty by Order in Council dated 16th April, 1924, and by Regu-

lations thereto annexed (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations of 1924 (Widows)") substituted a new Article for Article 17 of the Regulations of 1920:

And whereas His Majesty by Order in Council similarly dated 16th April, 1924, and by Regulations thereto annexed (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations of 1924 (Parents)") substituted a new Article for Article 21 of the Regulations of 1920:

And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty by the Minister that it is desirable to make further provision concerning the pensions of the widows, children and parents of such seamen and marines deceased:

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said proposals into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and hereby amends the said Orders in Council, by amending the Regulations of 1920, the Regulations of 1924 (Widows) and the Regulations of 1924 (Parents) in accordance with the Regulations hereto annexed.

Further Regulations for Pensions of widows, children and parents of British seamen and marines deceased in consequence of the war.

PART I.—(WIDOWS, ORDINARY ENTITLEMENT).

1. For Article 11 of the Regulations of 1920 there shall be substituted the following Article:—

" 11. The widow of a seaman or marine who—

(a) is killed while in the performance of naval or military duty during the war; or

(b) dies as a result of wounds or injuries received in the performance of such duty within seven years of receiving such wounds or injuries; or

(c) dies of disease, certified as contracted or commencing while on active service during the war, or as having been aggravated by such active service, within seven years of his removal from duty on account of such disease; or

(d) dies within seven years of the receipt of the wound or injury which caused his death, or of his removal from duty on account of the disability which caused his death, or of the termination of his active service during the war (whichever is earliest), of a disability in respect of which a claim has been admitted under Article 1 of these Regulations, and which is certified to have been attributable to or aggravated by such service; or, if no such claim has been made and admitted, dies within the same period of a disability which, a continuous medical history thereof being shown from the termination of such active service, can be certified to have been attributable to or aggravated by such service;

may, provided the man's death has not been caused by his serious negligence or misconduct, be granted a widow's pension at the following weekly rates:—

The pension granted to the widow of a seaman or marine who held paid acting rank at the time he was killed or was removed from duty owing to wounds, injuries or disease from which he subsequently died, may be at the rate appropriate to that rank."

2. Article 24 of the Regulations of 1920 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof:—

" (13) An injury or disease shall not be deemed to be 'aggravated' by naval or military service, or by active service, as the case may be, unless it was sustained or contracted before the date of mobilisation (or

enlistment if later), and was and remains worsened by such service, or, having been sustained or contracted during such naval, military or active service, as the case may be, was and remains worsened thereby; and 'aggravation' shall bear a corresponding meaning.

(14) 'Removal from duty' means the first authorised absence from duty during the war; and 'removed from duty' shall bear a corresponding meaning."

PART II.—(WIDOWS, SPECIAL ENTITLEMENT).

3. For Article 17 of the Regulations of 1920, as amended by the Regulations of 1924

(Widows), there shall be substituted the following Articles:—

“ 17A.—(1) The widow of a seaman or marine who was at the time of his death in receipt of a pension in respect of disablement assessed at the rate of 40 per cent. or over, may, if ineligible for a pension under Article 17B of these Regulations and if in the opinion of the Minister the circumstances of the man's death and other conditions of the case justify the grant, be awarded a pension which shall not exceed one-half of the pension granted under Article 1 (1) of these Regulations to her deceased husband, together with a prescribed addition in respect of his rank and an allowance in respect of any child of the deceased man at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate provided in Article 12 of these Regulations: provided that the grant of any pension or allowance shall be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine, and shall cease on re-marriage.

(2) The motherless children of a man whose widow was in receipt of a pension under this Article, or who would have been granted a pension under this Article, may, subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine, be granted pensions not exceeding the rates provided in Article 12 of these Regulations.

(3) Subject to the proviso to sub-section (1) above, a pension or allowance granted to or in respect of a child under this Article may continue up to the age of 16, and the provisions of sub-section (2) and (4) of Article 2 of these Regulations shall, as far as they are applicable, apply to any such pension or allowance.

(4) ‘Widow’ in this Article means a widow (a) the circumstances of whose husband's death do not entitle her to a pension under Article 11 of these Regulations, and (b) who, if her husband had died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11 of these Regulations, would have been eligible for a pension under that Article.

(5) ‘Child’ in this Article means a child (a) the circumstances of whose father's death do not render it eligible for an allowance under Article 12 of these Regulations, and (b) who, if the father had died in the circumstances set forth in Article 11 of these Regulations, would have been eligible for an allowance under Article 12.”

“ 17B.—(1) The widow of a seaman or marine who was at the time of his death in receipt of a pension or allowance under Article 1 of these Regulations may, if she is ineligible for a pension under Article 11 of these Regulations solely by reason of the fact that her husband did not die within seven years of the receipt of his wound or injury, or removal from duty, or termination of active service, be granted a pension at the weekly rates set forth in Article 11, together with an allowance as in Article 12 in respect of any child of the deceased man, if it is certified that the death of her husband was wholly due to the nature or condition of the disability in respect of which the said pension or allowance was awarded, such nature or condition having resulted directly from his

war service: provided that any such pension shall cease on re-marriage.

(2) The provisions of Article 24A of these Regulations shall apply in the case of a grant of pension under this Article as though the pension had been granted under Article 11.

(3) The motherless children of a man whose widow was in receipt of, or might have been granted, a pension under this Article, may be granted pensions in accordance with the terms and subject to the limitations of Article 18 of these Regulations.”

PART III.—(PARENTS, SPECIAL ENTITLEMENT, ETC.).

4. The following Articles shall be added as part of the Regulations of 1920:—

“ 21A. The parent of a seaman or marine who was at the time of his death in receipt of a pension in respect of disablement assessed at the rate of 40 per cent. or over may, if ineligible for a pension under Article 21B of these Regulations and wholly or partly incapable of self-support from age or infirmity and in pecuniary need, and if in the opinion of the Minister the circumstances of the man's death and other conditions of the case justify the grant, be awarded a pension which shall not exceed one-half of the pension granted under Article 1 (1) of these Regulations to the deceased man together with a prescribed addition in respect of his rank or 20s. a week, whichever is the less. The grant of any pension under this Article shall be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine, but any such pension shall not be less than 5s. a week, shall in the case of a female parent cease on re-marriage, and shall not exceed the sum of 20s. a week whether both parents are concerned or there is only one parent.”

“ 21B. The parent of a seaman or marine who was at the time of his death in receipt of a pension or allowance under Article 1 of these Regulations may, if ineligible for a pension under Article 21 of these Regulations solely by reason of the fact that the deceased man did not die within seven years of the receipt of his wound or injury, or removal from duty or termination of active service, be granted a pension as under Article 21 if it is certified that the death of the man was wholly due to the nature or condition of the disability in respect of which the said pension or allowance was awarded, such nature or condition having resulted directly from his war service: provided that any such pension shall, in the case of a female parent, cease on re-marriage.”

5. Article 21 of the Regulations of 1920, as substituted by the Regulations of 1924 (Parents), is hereby amended by substituting “not less than 5s. a week” for “not less than 4s. 2d. a week.”

6. Article 2 of the Regulations of 1924 (Parents) is hereby amended with effect on and from the 1st April, 1922, by deleting in sub-section (3) the words “prior to the 1st April, 1922”.

7. A pension duly awarded to one of two parents of a seaman or marine and payable by

virtue of Article 2 of the Regulations of 1924 (Parents), as amended by these Regulations, may, on the death of such parent, be paid, as from the date of application therefor under these Regulations, to the surviving parent; but so that the surviving parent does not receive a pension of more than 18s. a week.

PART IV—(DATES OF OPERATION).

8.—(1) The provisions of Part I hereof shall have effect as though they were and always had been part of the Regulations of 1920, and any reference to Article 11 in such Regulations shall mean the Article substituted by these Regulations.

(2) The provisions of Part II hereof shall take effect on and from the 7th January, 1924.

(3) The provision of Part III hereof shall, with the exception of Article 6, take effect on and from the 1st April, 1924.

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, it is (amongst other things) enacted as follows:—

“ Where His Majesty is satisfied that the law in force in any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom makes due provision for the publication of banns or for the giving of notice in respect of marriages between British Subjects intended to be solemnised or contracted in the United Kingdom, and for the recognition of certificates for marriage issued by Superintendent Registrars in England and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars, and certificates of proclamation of banns, in Scotland, and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars in Ireland as sufficient notice in respect of marriages between British Subjects intended to be solemnised or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that this Section shall apply to that part of His Dominions, and in such case:—

“ (a) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnised or contracted in the United Kingdom between a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland and a British Subject resident in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, a certificate of the publication of banns or a certificate of notice of marriage issued in accordance with such law shall in England have the same effect as a certificate for marriage issued by a Superintendent Registrar, and in Scotland and Ireland have the same effect as a certificate for marriage issued by a Registrar in Scotland and Ireland respectively; and

“ (b) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnised or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions between a British Subject resident in that part and a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, a certificate for marriage may be issued in England by a Superintendent Registrar, or in Scotland or Ireland by a Registrar, in the like manner as if the marriage was to be solemnised or contracted under circumstances requiring the issue of such a certificate, and as if both such British Subjects were resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, as the case may be ”:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Amendment Act, 1916, it is enacted as follows:—

“ If His Majesty is satisfied that, for the purposes of a marriage to be solemnised or contracted in any part of His Dominions outside the United Kingdom between a British Subject resident in that part and a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, no notice of the marriage is, under the law in force in that part of His Dominions, required on the part of the person resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, shall apply to that part of His Dominions, notwithstanding that the law in force in that part does not make provision for the recognition of certificates for marriage issued in England, Scotland, and Ireland, and of certificates of proclamation of banns issued in Scotland, as sufficient notice in respect of such marriages as aforesaid, provided that the other conditions required by that Section are fulfilled ”:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that, for the purposes of a marriage to be solemnised or contracted in the part of His Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned between a British Subject resident therein and a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, no notice of the marriage is under the law in force in that part of His Dominions required on the part of the person resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, and that under the said law the other conditions required by the hereinbefore recited Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, are fulfilled:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Acts in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, shall apply to the part of His Majesty's Dominions, outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

The Isle of Man.

And the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson Hicks, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 36 of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the said Act shall apply as if, subject to the conditions, exceptions and qualifications (if any) contained in the Order, any place out of His Majesty's dominions in which His Majesty has jurisdiction and which is named in the Order, were a British possession, and to provide for carrying into effect such application:

And whereas New Guinea and Nauru are places out of His Majesty's dominions in which His Majesty has jurisdiction:

And whereas it is expedient to extend to those territories the provisions of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in the exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the New Guinea and Nauru (Fugitive Offenders) Order in Council, 1925.

2. On and after the 1st day of November, 1925, the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, shall apply to New Guinea and Nauru as if those territories were British possessions, subject to the provisions following.

3. In the application of the Act to the said territories:—

(a) Every reference in the Act to the Governor of a British possession shall be read as a reference to the Administrator or other chief executive officer of each of the said territories.

(b) Every reference in the Act to a Magistrate shall be read as a reference to a Judge or other judicial officer possessing criminal jurisdiction within each of the said territories, and every such Judge or other officer may exercise accordingly the jurisdiction conferred by the Act upon a Magistrate.

4. So much of the fifth section of the said Act as relates to the information to be given by the Magistrate to a fugitive shall have no application within the said Territories, and in lieu of such information the person acting as the Magistrate shall inform the fugitive that in any British possession to which he may be conveyed he has the right to apply for a writ of habeas corpus or other like process.

5. So much of the sixth section of the said Act as requires the expiration of fifteen days before the issue of a warrant shall have no application within the said Territories.

6. For the purpose of Part II. of the said Act the said territories of New Guinea and Nauru shall, with the Commonwealth of Australia, Papua and Norfolk Island, be deemed to be one group of British possessions.

WHEREAS by an Order of Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, bearing date the 23rd day of August, 1863, it was ordered that Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, should apply to the group of British Possessions therein mentioned, that is to say, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, New Zealand, Tasmania, Western Australia and Fiji:

And whereas on the 1st day of January, 1901, the Commonwealth of Australia was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament passed in the sixty-third and sixty-fourth years of Her Majesty Queen Victoria's Reign, and shortly entitled "The Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act," and each of the British Possessions hereinbefore mentioned other than New Zealand and Fiji is now a State forming part of the Commonwealth established as aforesaid:

And whereas Papua and Norfolk Island are British Possessions which have been placed under the authority of the said Commonwealth:

And whereas by Royal Proclamation, bearing date the 9th day of September, 1907, His late Majesty King Edward VII ordained declared and commanded that, on and after the 26th day of September, 1907, the Colony of New Zealand and the territory belonging thereto should be called and known by the title of the Dominion of New Zealand:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the 10th day of November, 1915, and known as the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Order in Council, 1915, the Gilbert and Ellice Islands were annexed to His Majesty's Dominions and constituted a Colony:

And whereas by certain Orders in Council mentioned in the second column of the Schedule to this Order, and respectively set opposite to the names of the territories specified in the first column thereof, the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, has been applied to the said territories respectively as if each of them were a British Possession:

And whereas by reason of the contiguity of the Dominions, Colonies and Territories hereinafter mentioned and the frequent inter-communication between them, it seems expedient to His Majesty and conducive to the better administration of Justice therein that Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, should apply to the said Dominions, Colonies and Territories as hereinafter provided:

And whereas it is desirable to revoke the first hereinbefore recited Order in Council, bearing date the 23rd day of August, 1863, and to substitute other provisions in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) As from the 1st day of November, 1925, the hereinbefore recited Order in

Council of the 23rd day of August, 1883, shall be revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, or to any proceedings commenced before the said 1st day of November, 1925.

(2) On and after the 1st day of November, 1925, Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, shall apply to the group of British Possessions and Territories hereinunder mentioned; that is to say:—

Commonwealth of Australia;
Papua;
Norfolk Island;
New Guinea;
Nauru;
New Zealand;
Western Samoa;
Fiji;
Gilbert and Ellice Islands;
British Solomon Islands.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 30th day of July, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Orcheston Saint George and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Orcheston Saint Mary, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Orcheston Saint George and Orcheston Saint Mary duly made their Report to the said

Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Orcheston Saint George and Orcheston Saint Mary are now full, the Reverend Ralph John Walter Grindle being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Orcheston Saint George and the Reverend Sydney Clement Winterton being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Orcheston Saint Mary:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Orcheston Saint George and the said Benefice of Orcheston Saint Mary, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of The Orchestons,’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Orcheston Saint George shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Orcheston Saint Mary and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net

proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation or nomination shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Orcheston Saint George having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Orcheston Saint Mary having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charges, Glebe lands and all other endowments belonging to the United Benefice or which may hereafter belong thereto shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the several hereinafter mentioned Benefices, that is to say, the Benefices of Easterton, Southbroom, West Moors, Saint Mary the Virgin and Blandford Forum all in the said Diocese of Salisbury with the annual sums or yearly rent charges hereinafter mentioned that is to say, in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of each of the said Benefices of Easterton, Southbroom, West Moors Saint Mary the Virgin and Blandford Forum, a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £45 15s. 9d. Tithe Rent Charge as determined in accordance with the statutory provisions for the time being and from time to time in force for ascertaining the sum payable in respect of Tithe Rent Charge and to be paid half-yearly as hereinafter provided and so that the amount of the said half-yearly instalment of the said yearly rent charge to be paid on each half-yearly day hereunder shall be the same or the like amount as would in accordance with the aforesaid statutory provision have become payable in respect of such sum of £45 15s. 9d. Tithe Rent Charge on the last preceding half-yearly day for payment of Tithe Rent Charge. The said yearly rent charges to be as from the date of the union taking effect due and payable to the respective Incumbents of the said Benefices of Easterton, Southbroom, West Moors Saint Mary the Virgin and Blandford Forum and the same several yearly rent charges to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of any of the said Benefices of Easterton, Southbroom, West Moors Saint Mary the Virgin and Blandford Forum or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by half-yearly instalments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year. And for the recovery of the said yearly rent charges the Incumbents of the respective Benefices of Easterton, Southbroom, West Moors Saint Mary the Virgin and Blandford Forum and their successors shall have and be entitled to all such or the like powers

and remedies as are expressed to be conferred by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in relation to rent charges within the purview of that Section; provided always that if at any time by reason of any redemption of Tithe Rent Charge belonging to the said United Benefice or any sale of or other transfer of the right to receive any such Tithe Rent Charge the endowments chargeable with the said yearly rent charges shall no longer include any sum whatsoever of Tithe Rent Charge then and in such case as from the date on which such redemption sale or transfer shall take effect the amount of the said yearly rent charges shall cease to be regulated by the value of Tithe Rent Charge and shall thereafter in each case be a fixed annual sum equivalent to the amount payable in respect of the yearly rent charge for the year ending on the half-yearly day for the payment thereof which last preceded the aforesaid date; provided also that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex or if by any other Instrument in accordance with statutory authority there shall at any time be annexed to the said Benefices of Easterton, Southbroom, West Moors Saint Mary the Virgin and Blandford Forum or any of them any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for all or any of the yearly rent charges hereby created as aforesaid then the said yearly rent charge or yearly rent charges in any case or cases in which equivalent endowments shall have been granted conveyed and annexed as aforesaid shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable; and provided also that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, or Measures, or of any other Act of Parliament or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to

such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid, to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme (1) for effecting the union of the Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh with the Benefice of Testerton and part of the Benefice of Brisley with Gateley and (2) for effecting the union of the residue of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley with the Benefice of Stanfield all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon (1) the union of the said Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh with the said Benefice of Testerton and a portion of the said Benefice of Brisley

with Gateley and (2) the union of the said Benefice of Stanfield with the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley duly made their reports to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the severance from the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley of the Benefice of Gateley and the union of the said Benefice of Gateley severed with the neighbouring Benefices of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and Testerton and therein further recommended the union of the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley with the neighbouring Benefice of Stanfield and the terms for effecting such unions and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Reports:

“ And whereas we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Reports but with the assent of the said Bishop of Norwich embodies certain modifications thereof:

“ And whereas the said Benefices of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh, Brisley with Gateley and Stanfield are now full the Reverend Frederick Hugh Tatham being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh the Reverend Arthur Cross being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley and the Reverend John Williams being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stanfield and the said Benefice of Testerton is at present vacant:

“ And whereas it is in our opinion desirable for effectually carrying out the specific proposals contained in this Scheme that the said Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and the said Benefice of Testerton should forthwith be permanently united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls pending the further unions hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley is situate in that portion of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley which it is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall be united to the said Benefice of Stanfield:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Testerton has no Parish Church and no Parsonage House:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That with the consent of the said Frederick Hugh Tatham (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and the said Benefice of Testerton shall forthwith be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and Testerton ’ and that the parishes of Great Ryburgh, Little Ryburgh and Testerton shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical

purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, provided.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Great Ryburgh shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and Testerton and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Great Ryburgh shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That the right of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and Testerton shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh.

" 4. That a portion of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley that is to say the Benefice of Gateley shall be severed from the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley and such severed portion of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley and the United Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and Testerton (referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Great Ryburgh and Little Ryburgh with Gateley and Testerton' but the United Parish of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and Testerton and the Parish of the said Benefice of Gateley shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 5. That the said Benefice of Stanfield and the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley that is to say the Benefice of Brisley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brisley with Stanfield' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Brisley but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Brisley and Stanfield shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 6. That with the consents of the said Frederick Hugh Tatham, the said Arthur Cross and the said John Williams (testified by their signing this Scheme) the unions recommended in clause (4) and clause (5) of this Scheme shall take effect upon the first vacation of that one of the said Benefices of Brisley with Gateley and Stanfield which shall be the first vacated after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and the said Frederick Hugh Tatham or his successor, Incumbent at that time of the United Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and Testerton shall thereupon become and be the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Great Ryburgh and Little Ryburgh with Gateley and Testerton, and the said Arthur Cross or the said John Williams (as the case may be) shall thereupon become and be the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Brisley with Stanfield.

" 7. That upon the two unions recommended in clause (4) and clause (5) of this Scheme taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Great Ryburgh and Little Ryburgh with Gateley and Testerton and the Parsonage House at present belonging to

the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Brisley with Stanfield.

" 8. That upon the said two unions taking effect the endowments of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley shall be divided as follows, that is to say, there shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Great Ryburgh and Little Ryburgh with Gateley and Testerton all that part of the endowments at present belonging to the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley which consists of glebe situate within the Parish of Gateley and Tithe Rentcharges arising within that Parish and all capital sums of money or stocks (if any) representing or being the produce of the sale redemption or other conversion of any part or parts of the said glebe or Tithe Rentcharges and there shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Brisley with Stanfield all the other or remaining endowments of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley.

" 9. That after the union recommended in clause (4) of this Scheme has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Great Ryburgh and Little Ryburgh with Gateley and Testerton from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said United Benefice of Great Ryburgh with Little Ryburgh and Testerton shall have the first and second turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley shall have the third turn.

" 10. That after the union recommended in clause (5) of this Scheme has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Brisley with Stanfield from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation or nomination shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Brisley with Gateley and Stanfield alternately and that (a) if the event upon the happening of which the said union shall take effect shall be the vacation of the said Benefice of Stanfield then the Patron of the said Benefice of Stanfield shall have the first turn of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice but (b) if such event shall be the vacation of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley the Patrons of the said Benefice of Brisley with Gateley shall have the first turn of presentation or nomination to the said United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or Measures or of any other Act of Parliament or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

“ Whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 8th day of July, 1865, and being under the Common Seal of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and under the hand and seal of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Archibald Campbell, then Bishop of London, a Particular District was assigned to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate at Shooter's Hill, in the Parish of Eltham, in the said County of Kent and at that time in the Diocese of London, but now in the said Diocese of Southwark, and such Particular District was called the Particular District of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill:

“ And whereas the said Particular District of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish, of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, shall be altered so that all that portion of the Parish of Plumstead, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Southwark, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis severed from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, being:—

“ All that portion of the Parish of Plumstead, in the said County and Diocese, which

is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the north by the New Parish of the Ascension, Plumstead, upon the south east by the parish of East Wickham, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the south partly by the New Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, partly by the District Chapelry of Saint Luke, Well Hall, Eltham, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Southwark, and partly by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, upon the west partly by the last named New Parish and partly by the New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Southwark, and upon the remaining part of the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Shooter's Hill, Plumstead, from the said Parish of Plumstead at a point in the middle of Plum Lane opposite to the middle of the private roadway leading to the house and premises known as Lowood, and extending thence south eastward to and along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to a point at the south eastern end of the said roadway and opposite to the fence forming the north western boundary of the said house and premises, and extending thence north eastward and in a straight line for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to the point near the junction of Dothill Road and Garland Road where the boundary which divides the said parish of Plumstead from the said New Parish of the Ascension, Plumstead, diverges eastward."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively either signified their assent, or offered no objection thereto:

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

"3. That by the nearest road the Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton is situate at a distance of two miles from the Parish Church of Womersley aforesaid and by the nearest road a distance of a hundred yards from the Parish Church of Kirk Smeaton aforesaid.

"4. That there is sufficient accommodation in the Parish Church of Kirk Smeaton for the Inhabitants of that Parish and also for the Inhabitants of the said Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton.

"5. That according to the last census the population of the said Parish of Womersley including Stubbs Walden and exclusive of the Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton was five hundred and forty-six persons and that of the said Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton was one hundred and ninety-eight persons:

"6. That the net annual value of the said Vicarage of Womersley is three hundred and ninety-six pounds and that of the said Rectory of Kirk Smeaton is four hundred and ninety pounds.

"7. That the Patronage of the said Vicarage of Womersley is vested in Charles Augustus Phillimore, Banker, of 44, Strand, London, Sir Charles Burton Barrington, of Glenstal Castle, County Limerick, Bt., and William St. Andrew Warde-Aldam, of Frickley Hall, Doncaster, as Trustees and the Reverend Arthur Edwards Hey is now Vicar thereof.

"8. That the Patronage of the said Rectory of Kirk Smeaton is vested in the Right Honourable William Charles de Meuron Earl Fitzwilliam, K.C.V.O., D.S.O., and the Reverend William Seed is the present Rector thereof.

"9. That the said Patrons and Incumbents are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed.

"10. That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the said Act of Parliament the said Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Womersley aforesaid to which it at present belongs and be united for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Kirk Smeaton.

"11. That pursuant to the directions contained in the before-mentioned Act the Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode

in which it appears to him the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereupon in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes, Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such Scheme he doth by this Report certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the Consents in writing to the said Scheme of the Patrons and Incumbents of the Parishes to be affected to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

"As witness the hand of the said Archbishop this 22nd day of July, 1925.

"SCHEME.

"1. That the Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton in the Parish of Womersley in the County and Diocese of York shall be separated from that Parish and be united to and form part of the Parish of Kirk Smeaton in the same County and Diocese for Ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. That the Vicar of the Parish of Womersley shall cease to have the cure of souls within the said Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton and the Rector of the Parish of Kirk Smeaton shall have exclusive charge of the cure of souls within the limits of the said Hamlet and Township.

"3. That the Inhabitants of the said Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Church of Womersley or any other Church or Chapel now or hereafter to be erected within the Parish of Womersley but shall be liable, subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868, as the other Inhabitants of the Parish of Kirk Smeaton for the repair of the Parish Church of Kirk Smeaton.

"4. That the Inhabitants of the said Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton shall not be entitled to accommodation in the Church of Womersley but shall have the same rights as to pews and the performance of all offices and services of the Church in the Parish Church of Kirk Smeaton and otherwise in relation to the said Church as the other Inhabitants of the Parish of Kirk Smeaton.

"5. That the Inhabitants of the said Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton shall have the same rights of burial as the other Inhabitants of the said Parish of Kirk Smeaton.

"6. That the fees for all such offices and services performed for the Inhabitants of the said Hamlet and Township of Little Smeaton aforesaid or arising within the limits of the same and usually payable to the Incumbent of the Benefice shall belong to and be received by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Kirk Smeaton aforesaid.

"7. That no alteration shall be made as to the Endowments or Patronage of either of the said two Benefices of Womersley and Kirk Smeaton.

"We, Charles Augustus Phillimore, Esq., Sir Charles Burton Barrington, Bt., and William St. Andrew Warde-Aldam, Esq., the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Vicarage and Parish Church of Womersley in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Arthur Edwards Hey, Clerk, the present Vicar thereof, and we the Right Honourable William Charles de Meuron Earl Fitzwilliam, K.C.V.O., D.S.O., the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory and Parish Church of Kirk Smeaton in case the same were now vacant, and the Reverend William Seed, Clerk, M.A., the present Rector of the said Rectory do hereby respectively signify our assents to the foregoing report and the several matters and things therein stated and proposed.
