# PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 28th day of September, 1925 (C.W. 8597/25), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1918, to sanction the grant, at our discretion, of Temporary Commissions as Acting Chaplains to Ministers of Religious Bodies, not in conformity with the Church of England, who rendered full time service in the Royal Navy during the period of the late war:

"And whereas the Reverend Hamilton Macdonald, M.A. and the Reverend Anthony Cecil Hungerford Pollen, D.S.C., were granted

Temporary Commissions as Acting Roman Catholic Chaplains with seniority of 2nd August, 1914, and 16th March, 1915, respectively, under the terms of Your Majesty's aforesaid Order in Council, and served in Your Majesty's Naval Service until the 25th August, 1925, and 13th August, 1925, respectively:

"And whereas we consider that such service should render these Officers eligible for

retired pay:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

"(1) The retired pay granted to each Officer to be based on a standard rate of £225 a year, and to be awarded at the rate of £212 10s. a year as from the date of their respective retirements:

"(2) The standard rate of £225 a year to be regarded as comparable with rates authorised in Schedule V, Section IX of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and to be subject to revision at the same dates and in the same manner as retired pay authorised by that Order.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.'

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 737 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is provided that where, under that Act, anything is authorized to be done by, to, or before, a British Consular Officer, and in any place outside His Majesty's Dominions in which His Majesty has jurisdiction there is no such Officer, such thing may be done in that place by, to, or before, such Officer as His Majesty in Council may direct:

And whereas the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, has been from time to time amended by various Acts of Parliament, which Acts are construed as one with the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and may be cited together with the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, as the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1925:

And whereas Tawao and Sandakan, in the State of North Borneo, are places outside His Majesty's Dominions in which His Majesty has jurisdiction, but in which there is no Consular Officer:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of January, 1916, His Majesty was pleased to direct that anything which is, under the Merchant Shipping Acts, authorized to be done by, to, or before, a British Consular Officer may be done in the State of North Borneo by, to, or before, the Officer for the time being acting as District Officer, Tawao, North Borneo:

"5. The said John Francis William Deacon is Patron of the said Benefice of Bidborough.

"6. The Reverend David Macklin Braby Chapman is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Stephen Tonbridge. "7. The Reverend Matthew Sweetnam is

the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of.

Bidborough.

'8. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth Section of the said Act, I, the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the said District of the said Parish of Saint Stephen Tonbridge proposed to be annexed to the said Parish of Bidborough and the mode in which it appears to me the alteration may be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes Dues Rates and payments, and in respect of Patronage, and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents of the said respective Parishes and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents of the said respective Patrons and Incumbents thereto to His Majesty in Council.

The following Statute made by the University of Cambridge Commissioners, on the 24th day of July, 1925, for King's College, Cambridge, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 '':-

#### KING'S COLLEGE, CAMBRIDGE.

Whereas there is in the King's College of our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge a fund called the Martin Thackeray Fund and WHEREAS the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 has established a body styled the University of Cambridge Commissioners for the purpose of making statutes and regulations for the University its colleges and halls and any emoluments endowments trusts foundations gifts offices or institutions in or connected with the University in general accordance with recommendations contained in the Report of the Royal Commission referred to in the preamble of the said Act:

NOW WE the University of Cambridge Commissioners being assembled on the twenty-fourth day of July nineteen hundred and twenty-five at a meeting at which more than three Commissioners are present do hereby in the exercise of the powers conferred upon us by the said last mentioned Act (and of any other powers thereto enabling us) make the Statute following wholly for the said College.

#### STATUTE O .- MARTIN THACKERAY FUND.

- 1. The Fund shall be devoted to the provision of one or more Studentships to be awarded for the encouragement of study or research either in Mathematics including applications of Mathematics, or in Natural Sciences, or in Mechanical Sciences.
- 2. The Studentship shall be open to members of the College educated at Eton School who shall satisfy such conditions as to standing, attainments, course of study or research, tenure of other emoluments, as may be determined from time to time by the Governing Body.
- 3. If in the opinion of the Electors to the Studentship there is no suitable candidate satisfying the conditions of clause 2, the Studentship may be awarded to a suitable candidate not educated at Eton School, but satisfying the other conditions of clause 2; provided that if in the opinion of the Electors there is no such suitable candidate, the Studentship shall not be awarded.

- 4. If in any year the net income of the Fund after providing for all expenses including the share of the University Contribution exceeds the amount paid to the Student, the excess shall either be added to the capital of the Fund or be held as a Reserve, which may be used to augment the value of the Studentship or for the provision of further Studentships or for both these purposes.
- 5. The Governing Body shall have power to make from time to time regulations for the qualifications of the candidates, the emoluments and length of tenure of the Studentship, the time and method of award, and other regulations for the administration of the Fund, provided that none of these regulations are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Statute.
- 6. This Statute shall apply, in lieu of the scheme contained in the codicil dated 25th September 1862 to the Will of the late Martin Thackeray, to the funds bequeathed to the College by that codicil.

#### Whitehall, October 8, 1925.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Robert Pearson, a labourer employed at the works of Messrs. H. Marsland Ltd., at Stockport, in the following circumstances:—

On July 11th, 1925, while two boys named Stothert and Bowden were working in a vat

at the works of Messrs. H. Marsland, Ltd., at Stockport, there was a sudden inrush of scalding liquid and steam owing to a mistake made in opening the pipe of another vat. screams of the scalded boys attracted the attention of other workers and attempts were made to extricate them through the manholes. Bowden was successfully drawn out but Stothert after reaching the manhole fell back into the vat owing to the burnt flesh of his hand giving way. Pearson, a labourer employed at the works, then came upon the scene. He saw Bowden pulled out terribly scalded and on hearing that Stothert was still in the vat he at once ran to it. He jumped down the manhole and after groping about Stothert with some difficulty and hoisted him sufficiently to enable those outside to drag him to the surface. Pearson's feet were severely scalded during his efforts and he was practically unconscious on being drawn to the top.

Both boys succumbed to their injuries but Pearson's effort to save Stothert's life was a very gallant one. Though the steam had been turned off when Pearson entered the vat he was unaware of this and so far as he could tell the vat might have been full of boiling liquid. He had never been inside one of these vats before: all he knew was that he had seen one boy terribly scalded and that there was another boy inside and he faced the risk of attempting the rescue without any regard to his own safety, while neither the scalding he experienced nor the intense pain which he suffered deterred him from persisting in his efforts to get the lad out.

# WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1906.
