TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 30th October, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £40,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd November, 1925, to Saturday, the 7th November, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on

which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 2nd October, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd November, 1925, to Saturday, the 7th November, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1926, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

(4) Nothing in this Order shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Amendment Order of 1924 as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks and other railway vehicles used for the conveyance of animals on a railway.

(5) If anything is omitted to be done in contravention of this Order the railway company using the vehicle as aforesaid, or owning the loading bank or dock, in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is omitted to be done, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

ORDER DEFINING THE BENEFITS OR ADVANTAGES WHICH MAY BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF PAYMENT IN CASH.

(b) Potatoes—the wholesale price prevailing in the district on the preceding November 1st.

(c) and (d) Lodging and board as above defined for:—

Workers of 16 years and under 17, 12s. per week of 7 days.

Workers of 15 years and under 16, 10s. per week of 7 days.

Workers of 14 years and under 15, 9s. per week of 7 days.

(e) Cottage—3s. per week, less any rates which may be paid by the occupier provided as follows:—

In the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee on an application by or on behalf of the worker have certified that by reason of want of repair or sanitation or lack of water supply the value of such cottage is less than 3s. the value shall be such sum less than 3s. as the Committee shall determine on a consideration of the defects, less any rates paid by the occupier.

3. In pursuance of their said powers the said Committee hereby Order that except as in this Order provided no benefit or advantage shall be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of cash.

4. This Order shall come into operation as from 1st November, 1925.
