NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE AND CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, acting jointly with the Minister of Health and the Scottish Board of Health, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, and the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act, 1925, to make regulations as to the payment and collection of contributions in respect of members of the mercantile marine.
