(29) and D. (24) respectively, and in their application to certain classes of Male Apprentices commencing their apprenticeship at 18 years of age or over, and the General Minimum Time Rates for Male and Female Learners, AND TO FIX AND TO

VARY certain General Minimum Piece Rates for Male and Female Workers, AND TO VARY the Overtime Rates applicable to all Male and Female Workers, the proposed rates to be operative for periods dependent upon the "Cost of Living" figure.

The Cheshire and Yorkshire District Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Area) Order of 1925, as amended by any subsequent Order, shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were excluded from and ceased to form part of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order. Such Area shall thereupon be included in and form part of the "Regulated Area" to which the Midlands and South of England (Regulation of Movement of Animals) Order of 1925 applies.

Commencement and Short Title.

During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

Agricultural Hall, Islington, in the administrative county of London from the seventh to the eleventh day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, if such Show and Sale is authorised by the Local Authority of the county of London, and subject to the conditions hereinafter specified.

Movement of Animals to Sale.

2.—(1) No animal shall be moved to the Sale authorised under this Order unless it is accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of London.

(2) A licence granted under this Article shall not be available for the movement of the animals referred to therein unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the animals are to be moved.

(3) Animals may be moved to the Show and Sale with the necessary licence, only from premises which are not situated in any area which is for the time being an Infected Area to which the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 apply.

(4) No licence shall be granted or countersigned for movement of animals to the Sale from any premises which are the subject of any restrictive Notice served under any Order of the Minister.

(5) In the case of every movement of animals authorised by a licence under this Article the licence prescribed therein shall accompany the animals throughout the movement, and shall be produced on demand to an Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority, or a Police Constable. On the arrival of the animals at the Royal Agricultural Hall, the licences shall be delivered up to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(6) Animals moved with a licence under this Article shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by rail and be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved.

Removal of Animals from Sale.

3.—(1) The Local Authority of any district in Great Britain is hereby empowered to grant licences for the movement of any animals from the Show to any slaughterhouse in their district notwithstanding the provisions of any Order of the Minister relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

(2) Animals shall not be removed from the Sale, except direct to a slaughterhouse and then only if they are accompanied by a movement licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situated. Such licence shall not be available for the removal of the animals from the Show unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of London.

(3) On arrival at the destination specified in the licence the animals shall be there detained and kept separate from all other animals until they are slaughtered, and shall be slaughtered within ten days of their arrival thereat.

(4) The provisions of Article 2 (6) of this Order shall apply to animals moved with a licence from the Sale held under this Order.

Offences.

4. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of any licence granted thereunder, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal shall each, according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3) Animals may be moved to the Sale, with the necessary licence, only from premises which are not situated in any area which is for the time being an Infected Area to which the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 apply.

(4) No licence shall be granted or countersigned for movement of animals to the Sale from any premises which are the subject of any restrictive Notice served under any Order of the Minister.

(5) In the case of every movement of animals authorised by a licence under this Article the licence prescribed therein shall accompany the animals throughout the movement, and shall be produced on demand to an Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority, or a Police Constable. On the arrival of the animals at Bingley Hall the licences shall be delivered up to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(6) Animals moved with a licence under this Article shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by rail and be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved.

Removal of Animals from Sale.

ORDER DEFINING THE BENEFITS OR ADVANTAGES WHICH MAY BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF PAYMENT IN CASH.

The Pembroke and Cardigan Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924, do by this Order vary their Order of the 28th September, 1925, defining the benefits or advantages (not being benefits or advantages prohibited by law) which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of the application of any minimum rate of wages fixed by the said Committee in the area comprising the administrative counties of Pembroke and Cardigan, and hereby Order that such benefits or advantages and the values at which they are to be so reckoned shall be as follows:—

1. *Benefits or Advantages.*

- (a) Milk.
(b) Potato Ground.

(c) Board and Lodging.

(d) Lodging, except in any case in which the Wages Committee shall have determined that the lodging accommodation provided is so defective as to be injurious to health.

(e) Board, including any meals but not including intoxicating drink.

(f) Cottage, including any garden provided with the cottage, except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.

3. In pursuance of their said powers the said Committee hereby order that, except as in this Order provided, no benefit or advantage shall be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of any minimum rate of wages fixed under the Agri-

cultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, in the said area.

4. This Order shall come into operation on 21st November, 1925, and continue in operation until the 30th day of September, 1926.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire which for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the cities and county boroughs of Bradford, Leeds, Sheffield, Wakefield and York, and the county boroughs of Barnsley,

Dewsbury, Halifax, Huddersfield and Rotherham have in pursuance of the above Act duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 24th day of November, 1925.

SCHEDULE.

1. *Male Workers (living in and hired by the year or half-year).*

(a) The wages payable for employment in agriculture of male workers living-in (i.e. receiving board and lodging provided by the employer) and hired by the year or half-year, and employed wholly or mainly in one of the following classes, shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

(c) Where under his contract of employment the worker is entitled to and takes a week's holiday, he shall receive a sum of 15s. in lieu of his board and lodging during that week.

The wages payable for employment in agriculture of male workers employed wholly or mainly as horsemen, beastmen or shepherds engaged by the week or longer period and not living-in (i.e., not receiving board or lodging provided by the employer) shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

4. Where a whole time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are:—

(a) In the case of a worker hired by the year or half-year and living-in, or in the case of a horseman, beastman or shepherd, not living-in, less than 48 hours in winter or 52½ hours in summer and in addition 12 hours on weekdays or 3 on Sundays, or

(b) In the case of any other male worker less than 48 hours in winter or 52½ hours in summer,

the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.

5. For the purpose of the above rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Saturday in October and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

6. *Male Casual Workers.*

The wages payable for employment in agriculture of all male workers who are engaged for a shorter period than a week shall be not less than wages at the same rate per hour as would have been payable if they had been engaged by the week or longer period.

7. *Female Workers.*

The wages payable for employment in agriculture of female workers of 14 years of age and over shall be not less than 5d. per hour.

8.—(a) For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker other than a male or female casual worker, who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

(b) In the case of a male or female casual worker the hours of work shall not include meal times, but where by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work, such worker shall be entitled to not less than one hour's pay at the rate applicable to such worker.

9. The differential rates for overtime in the case of the employment of workers in agriculture shall be not less than the following minimum rates:—

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

PROVISIONAL AGRICULTURAL WAGES COMMITTEES REGULATIONS, 1925, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES UNDER THE AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924, AMENDING THE REGULATIONS MADE ON THE 24TH SEPTEMBER, 1924.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

“ Amendment of Article 17 (1) of the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924.”

1. Regulation 17 (1) of the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924 (hereinafter called “ the principal Regulation ”), is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

“ 17 (1). Before making any such Order the Committee shall, in such manner as the Minister shall in each case direct, submit to the Minister a draft of the proposed Order for approval of the form in which it is drafted, and on receipt of such approval shall

give notice of the proposed Order, and of the manner in which and of the time within which objections to the proposal may be lodged.

The Committee shall consider any objections to the proposed Order which may be lodged with them within fourteen days; provided that the Minister, on the application of the Committee, made on the ground of the limited application of a proposed Order, may exempt the proposed Order from this Regulation, and authorise the Committee to make the Order at the expiration of seven days after service of notice of the proposed Order on the persons affected by the Order."

2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the twentieth day of November, 1925.

3. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Regulations, and may be cited as the Agricultural Wages Committees (Amendment) Regulations, 1925.
