APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR SIX HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for six Hackney Carriages at Woodberry Down, Stoke Newington, in two portions, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

First Portion.—On South side of roadway, commencing at a point 4 yards West of Tramway Standard No. 27, and extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles towards the West.

Second Portion.—On North side of roadway, commencing at a point 5 yards East of the apex of railings surrounding the Green of St. Olave's Parish Hall, and extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for two carriages.

Front of vehicles towards the West.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.
