Prohibition of Landing of Hay and Straw from States of California and Texas.

1. Hay and Straw brought from the States of California and Texas in the United States of America, shall be subject to the prohibition of landing contained in the Foreign Hay and Straw Order of 1912.

Revocation.

2. The Foreign Hay and Straw (Amendment) Order of 1925 (No. 3) is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation forthwith.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOREIGN HAY AND STRAW (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 4).

5. For the purposes of the above rates the expression "summer" shall mean the period from the first Monday in March to the last Saturday in October, and the expression "winter" shall mean the rest of the year.

6. For the purposes of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.
