FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (AMEND-MENT) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Additional Rule for Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place.

1. Article 4 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Amendment) Order of 1922 shall be read and have effect as if the following additional rule were included in the Rules for Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Places therein prescribed:—

"Rule 2 (a). No live poultry, hare, or rabbit, or the carcase of any head of poultry, hare, or rabbit, shall be removed from an Infected Place except with the permission in writing from an Inspector or officer of the Ministry, or an Inspector of the Local Authority, and then only in accordance with such conditions as may be stipulated in the permission authorising such movement. For the purposes of this Rule, poultry includes domestic fowls, turkey, geese, ducks, guineafowls and pigeons."

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, and may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 3).

In the administrative county of Radnor.

The parishes of Abbeycwmhir, Llanbadarn-Fynydd, Llanbister, Llananno, and Llandewi-Ystradenny, and such parts of the parishes of Beguildy, Heyop and Llangunllo which lie to the North of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway between the point where the railway crosses the road leading from Llangunllo to Llanbister, and the railway bridge at Knucklas.

Inverness.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner-Hebrides.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller island adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

NOTE.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.
