WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of November, 1925 (C.(2)8333/25), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 5 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 5th July, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that it shall be lawful for Your Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, to appoint such pensions as seem fit to Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, for the time being entitled to the benefits of

Greenwich Hospital, and to prescribe the conditions on which such pensions are to be held :

“And whereas by Orders in Council bearing date the 9th September, 1865, and 4th February, 1875, provision was made for the grant, under certain conditions, of an extra pension of 5d. a day to certain Naval life pensioners over 55 years of age, and an extra pension of 9d. a day to certain Naval life pensioners over 65 years of age; the same to be called ‘Greenwich Pensions’ :

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 7th February, 1921, to sanction, *inter alia*, the funds of Greenwich Hospital being supplemented from Naval Funds so as to provide that every eligible life pensioner of good character should be granted the aforesaid Pensions on reaching the qualifying ages :

“And whereas the increase of the said Pensions at the age of 65 was intended to meet the increasing infirmities of age, and we are of opinion that in view of the better provision now made for this purpose by the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act, 1925, it will not be necessary to grant this increase in future :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to discontinue the award of the Greenwich Pension at the increased rate of 9d. a day at the age of 65, in the case of men joining or re-entering the Naval Service on or after the 4th October, 1925, provided nevertheless that men serving

on the 3rd October, 1925, who may execute re-engagements on or after that date, without a break in their service, shall remain eligible therefor.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of November, 1925, N.P. (2) 3688/25, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Orders in Council of the 27th May, 1921, and the 10th August, 1921, to sanction, *inter alia*, an allowance of 2s. 6d. a day to a rating of the Writer Branch or Supply Branch employed as Writer to the Senior Naval Officer of a Division of a Naval Station:

"And whereas we are of opinion that under certain conditions a reduced allowance should be paid:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to grant, as from 1st May, 1925, at our discretion, an allowance within the maximum of 2s. 6d. a day for this service.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th day of November, 1925, N.P. (2) 3581/25 in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Order in Council of the 4th May, 1911, authorized certain advances of pay to Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, Men and Boys of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines when in debt to the Crown:

"And whereas we consider that the arrangements for the recovery of debts need revision:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following arrangements for advances of pay to men in debt and for allotments of pay to their wives and dependants:—

"(a) Where men incur small debts which can be liquidated within three months without disturbing any allotment in force, advances of pay to be allowed at the discretion of the Commanding Officer, up to a maximum of 50 per cent. of the balance of pay and allowances remaining after payment of the allotment.

"(b) Where the debt is so large that recovery cannot be so effected within three months, advances of pay to be restricted to one-seventh of pay and allowances, and allotments to wives and dependants to be limited to five-fourteenths thereof. No other allotments to be permitted.

"(c) Where debts are incurred in special circumstances the rate of recovery of the debt to be at the discretion of the Admiralty.

"(d) Men undergoing sentences of detention or imprisonment as defined at Section F (a) of Appendix III, Part II E, King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, to be allowed to allot and (when pay recommences) to receive advances as at (b) above, provided the total indebtedness can be cleared within three months of the date of sentence; otherwise only a nominal allotment of 2s. 6d. per week to be permitted in addition to the advance of pay.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay & Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Orders in Council bearing the dates 13th day of December, 1921, 28th day of November, 1923, and 26th day of May, 1925, to sanction regulations relative to the counting of service (after retirement) of retired officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines in the Inspection, Experimental, and Compass Departments in the Admiralty for increase of retired pay:

“And whereas we consider it desirable that any retired officer of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines who may be appointed (a) to the staff of the Hydrographic Department of the Admiralty or (b) as Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of the Royal Naval Cordite Factory, Holton Heath, should be subject to the provisions of the aforesaid Orders in Council:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to sanction the addition of the posts on the Staff of the Hydrographic Department of the Admiralty and the posts of Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent of the Royal Naval Cordite Factory, Holton Heath, to the list of appointments to which the provisions of Your Orders in Council dated the 13th day of December, 1921, 28th day of November, 1923, and 26th day of May, 1925, apply.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, His Majesty, in Council, was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, and various Orders amending the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order, as amended, should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920 (as amended), for paragraph (xvi) of Article One thereof there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(xvi) It shall be lawful for the Clearing Office or the Administrator to deduct from any sum payable by the Clearing Office or Administrator to a creditor or any other person such commission, not exceeding two and a half per cent. of the total amount paid or payable, as may be fixed by the Clearing Office or Administrator.”

2. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Austria) (Amendment) Order, 1925, and the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1924, and this Order may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1920 to 1925.

WHEREAS on the 20th day of January, 1914, an International Convention for the safety of Life at Sea, and for purposes incidental thereto, was duly entered into by His Majesty and the other Signatory Powers more especially referred to and set out in the said Convention:

And whereas a Statute 4 & 5 Geo. V, c. 50, intituled “An Act to make such amendments of the law relating to Merchant Shipping as are necessary or expedient to give effect to an International Convention for the safety of Life at Sea” (being the Convention above referred to) was passed on the 10th day of August, 1914, the short title of which is “The Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914”:

And whereas by Section 29, Sub-section 5, of the said Act it was provided as follows:—

“This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915:

“Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, from time to time postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order”:

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands

postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 26th day of May, 1925, until the 1st day of January, 1926:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above-recited provision and of all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of January, 1927.

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, it is (amongst other things) enacted as follows:—

“ Where His Majesty is satisfied that the law in force in any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom makes due provision for the publication of banns, or for the giving of notice in respect of marriages, between British Subjects intended to be solemnized or contracted in the United Kingdom, and for the recognition of certificates for marriage issued by Superintendent Registrars in England, and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars, and certificates of proclamation of banns, in Scotland, and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars in Ireland, as sufficient notice in respect of marriages between British Subjects intended to be solemnized or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, declare that this Section shall apply to that part of His Dominions, and in such case:—

“(a) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnized or contracted in the United Kingdom between a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, and a British Subject resident in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, a certificate of notice of marriage issued in accordance with such law shall in England have the same effect as a certificate for marriage issued by a Superintendent Registrar, and in Scotland and Ireland have the same effect as a certificate for marriage issued by a Registrar in Scotland and Ireland respectively; and

“(b) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnized or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions between a British Subject resident in that part and a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, a certificate for marriage may be issued in England by a Superintendent Registrar, or in Scotland or Ireland by a Registrar, in the like man-

ner as if the marriage was to be solemnized or contracted under circumstances requiring the issue of such a certificate, and as if both such British Subjects were resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, as the case may be ”:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that due provision is made in respect of all the matters referred to in the hereinbefore-recited Section of the said Act by the law in force in the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, shall apply to the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

The Island of Cyprus.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS under section two of the New Ministries and Secretaries Act, 1916 (6-7 G. 5 c. 68), provision is made (amongst other things) for conferring on the Minister of Labour such powers and duties of any Government department or authority relating to labour or industry as His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer to the Minister:

And whereas by section 13 of the Trade Union Act, 1871 (34-5 Vic. c. 31), it is provided that one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State may from time to time make regulations respecting registry of Trade Unions under that Act and other matters and generally for carrying the said Act into effect:

And whereas by subsection (2) of section 2 of the Secretary for Scotland Act, 1887 (50-1 Vic. c. 52), the said powers of a Secretary of State so far as they relate to Scotland are now vested in the Secretary for Scotland:

And whereas it is expedient to transfer to the Minister of Labour the powers conferred upon or vested in a Principal Secretary of State or the Secretary for Scotland as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) On and after the date of this Order, there shall be transferred to the Minister of Labour the powers of making regulations respecting registry of Trade Unions and other matters which are conferred upon a Principal Secretary of State by Section 13 of the Trade Union Act, 1871, and the like powers under

the said section which are vested in the Secretary for Scotland by virtue of subsection (1) of Section 2 of the Secretary for Scotland Act, 1887.

(2) This new Order may be cited as the Ministry of Labour (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1925.

Registration of Title to land is to be compulsory on sale in the County Borough of Eastbourne, on and after the 1st day of January, 1926.

This Order may be amended or added to or repealed by Order in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 15th day of October, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tresmere, situate in the County of Cornwall and in the Diocese of Truro, for the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Giles in the Heath, situate in the County of Devon and in the said Diocese of Truro:

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Tresmere is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and is

exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Giles in the Heath is vested in the Bishop of Truro for the time being:

“ And whereas the Right Honourable George, Viscount Cave, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Right Reverend Walter, now Bishop of Truro, have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said two Benefices of Tresmere and Saint Giles in the Heath may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

“ And whereas each of the said two Benefices is a Vicarage for the purpose of style and designation only and is not rated in Your Majesty's Books:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George, Viscount Cave, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Walter, Bishop of Truro, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Tresmere and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Walter, Bishop of Truro, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Giles in the Heath and the Church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Walter, Bishop of Truro, and from his successors and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the said George, Viscount Cave, or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall

have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Truro.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Brafferton and of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Nunnington, both situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, for the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Burton Agnes with Harpham, also situate in the said County of York and in the said Diocese of York:

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Brafferton and Nunnington is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and is exercised on behalf of Your

Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being:

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Burton Agnes with Harpham is vested in Sir Edward Clive Coates, Baronet, of Helperby Hall, Helperby, in the said County of York, Sir Charles Edwin Bourne Hanson, Baronet, of Number 99, Gresham Street, in the City of London, John Arthur Levett, of Number 3, New Square, Lincoln's Inn, in the County of London, Solicitor, and Harold Edward Druce, of Ellesmere, Coulsdon, in the County of Surrey, Esquire (hereinafter called 'the Coates Trustees') as Trustees of the Will of the late Sir Edward Feetham Coates, Baronet, and is held by them free from all incumbrances as part of certain lands and hereditaments directed by the said will to be settled to the use of the said Sir Edward Clive Coates for his life with divers remainders over by way of settlement and the Coates Trustees are the Trustees of the Settlement created by the said Will for the purposes of the Settled Land Acts, 1882 to 1890:

"And whereas the Right Honourable George, Viscount Cave, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Coates Trustees have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said three Benefices of Brafferton, Nunnington, and Burton Agnes with Harpham may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed and in view of the premises the said Sir Edward Clive Coates in exercise of the power conferred upon him by the Settled Land Acts, 1882 to 1890, and of every other power or authority in that behalf enabling him

has agreed to the proposed exchange in his capacity of tenant for life under the Settlement created or directed by the said Will:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Field Dalling and Saxlingham are now full, the Reverend William Coates Booth being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Field Dalling and the Reverend Arthur Austin Blair being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saxlingham:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Field Dalling and the said Benefice of Saxlingham shall be

permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'the United Benefice of Field Dalling with Saxlingham' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Swanton Abbot shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Skepton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say (a) a sum not exceeding £500 of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice and (b) the balance (if any) of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

" That according to the last census the population of the said parish of Dilton Marsh was fifteen hundred and twenty-five. That the population of the said Hamlet or District was three hundred partly in Dilton Marsh and partly in Corsley, and that the population of the said parish of Corsley was seven hundred and eighty-four.

" That there is a parish Church in each of the said parishes and that there is also a consecrated Chapel of Ease and surrounding burial ground in that portion of the said Hamlet or District of Chapmanslade as lies in the parish of Dilton Marsh.

" That the parish Church of Dilton Marsh contains accommodation for six hundred persons. That the Chapel of Ease at Chapmanslade contains accommodation for one hundred and thirty persons and that the parish Church at Corsley contains accommodation for four hundred persons.

" That the net annual value of the benefice of Dilton Marsh is three hundred and fifty pounds and that the net annual value of the benefice of Corsley is three hundred and thirteen pounds or thereabouts.

" That there is in the parish of Dilton Marsh a house of residence and that there is a house of residence in the said parish of Corsley.

" That the Patronage of the said benefice of Dilton Marsh belongs to the Lord Bishop of Salisbury for the time being in right of His Bishopric and that the Reverend Leonard Robert West is the present Incumbent thereof and that the Patronage of the said benefice of Corsley belongs to the Most Honourable the Marquess of Bath and that the Reverend Frederick George Allsopp is the present Incumbent thereof.

" That it appears to me and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the portion of the said Hamlet or District known

as Chapmanslade situate in the parish of Dilton Marsh shown on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon surrounded with a red verge line may be advantageously separated from the parish of Dilton Marsh and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Corsley to which it is contiguous.

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I have drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the proposed alterations may be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe lands, tithe rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments, and in respect to patronage, and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested. Which Scheme together with the consents thereto of the before mentioned Patrons and Incumbents I do submit to Your Grace to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

" It is proposed to separate from the ecclesiastical parish of Dilton Marsh and annex to the ecclesiastical parish of Corsley the portion of the Hamlet or District known as Chapmanslade situate in the parish of Dilton Marsh shown on the plan annexed hereto and thereon surrounded with a red verge line.

" That the Incumbent of the ecclesiastical parish to which such portion of the Hamlet or District is annexed shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within such district.

" That the inhabitants of such portion of the Hamlet or District shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish of Corsley and shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the parish Church of Dilton Marsh except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the parish Church of Dilton Marsh and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

" That the inhabitants of such portion of the Hamlet or District shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the parish Church of Corsley as they might have had in the parish Church of Dilton Marsh and that the inhabitants of the ecclesiastical parish of Corsley (including the inhabitants of that portion of the Hamlet or District of Chapmanslade as has anciently been situate in Corsley) shall have and enjoy all such rights and privileges in the Chapel of Ease and surrounding Churchyard in the Hamlet or District of Chapmanslade as were formerly enjoyed by the Inhabitants of the ecclesiastical parish of Dilton Marsh.

" That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from such Hamlet or District so to be separated from Dilton Marsh shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of Corsley.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefice or either of them.
