HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of December, 1925 (C. (3) 10120/25), in the words following,

"Whereas it is provided by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such a manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council dated the 7th day of November, 1924, to empower us at our discretion to award pensions and gratuities to widows and allowances to children and certain other dependent relatives of Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Navy and Marines and of the Reserve Forces on the scales and under the conditions contained in the Schedule annexed thereto:

" And whereas we are of opinion that the grant of pensions and allowances to the widows, children and certain other dependent relatives of Native Petty Officers and men, other than Europeans (whether or not they were British subjects) of Your Majesty's Naval

Service, is inexpedient:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that. Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to direct that the Regulations appearing in the annexed Schedule shall be deemed to be incorporated in the above-cited Order in Council with effect from the same date and that any provision of the said Order which is inconsistent with the Regulations attached hereto shall be void and of no effect.

# " SCHEDULE.

"1. A pension or an allowance will not be issuable in respect of the death of a Native Petty Officer or man, other than a European (whether or not he was a British subject) but, provided the conditions laid down in Order in Council of the 7th November, 1924, are satisfied, a gratuity, of such amount as the Admiralty may decide but not exceeding the amount of a year's pay attaching to the substantive rating and any Good Conduct Badges held at the date of death, may be granted to the dependent relatives.

"2. Only the dependent relatives specified in the above-cited Order in Council will, under the circumstances stated therein, be eligible

for gratuities.

' And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 7th day of November, 1924, it is provided, inter alia, that Officers of the Special Reserve, Royal Marines, who may be awarded pensions by the Ministry of Pensions in respect of disability due to or aggravated by service during the great war may be retained, at our discretion, for a period not exceeding three years from the date of commencement, of payment of the disability pension, but that such Officers shall be excused training, and payment of Retaining Fee shall be suspended for such time as they continue to draw disability pensions:

And whereas it is further provided by Your . Majesty's aforesaid Order in Council that Officers of the Special Reserve, Royal Marines, who had been in receipt of such pensions for a period of three years or more should be removed from the Special Reserve as from the

7th day of November, 1924:

And whereas, before the promulgation of the foregoing alterations in the Regulations, certain Officers of the Special Reserve, Royal Marines, had performed training and would thus, but for the said alterations, have been qualified to receive Retaining Fees, and we consider that the removal of these Officers should be postponed until the date upon which they were notified of the changes, and that they should be eligible to receive Retaining Fees until such date:

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act) it is (among other things) enacted that His Majesty may, by ·Order in Council, fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities, on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of these establishments, and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (among other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by Orders in Council made on the 14th day of December, 1922, and the 26th day of June, 1923, respectively, in pursuance of the above recited powers, the clerical and engineering establishments which might be maintained by the Corporation of the Trinity House of Deptford Strond (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the amount of the salaries to be paid to the officers of the said establishments were duly fixed:

And whereas it is expedient that the engineering establishment of the Corporation varied in manner hereinafter should be

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have

consented to such variation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

- This Order may be cited as the Trinity House (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1925.
- 2. In addition to the posts specified in the said Orders in Council made on the 14th day of December 1922, and the 26th day of June, 1923, there shall, as from the 30th day of October, 1924, be included in the engineering establishment of the Corporation a post of Civil Engineering Assistant with a salary commencing at £300 per annum, and rising by annual increments of £15 to a maximum of

£500 per annum.
3. The salary payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General

Lighthouse Fund.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 26th day of November, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd

and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Livesey, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, and the said New Parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, and of the said New Parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as afore-said upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Manchester as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of

Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, now Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, and of the said New Parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions togetherwith the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and beconstituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named the District of Saint Aidan, Blackburn.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said William, Bishop of the said Diocese of Manchester, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Aidan, Blackburn, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Livesey, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the east partly by the New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, and partly by the New Parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, upon the north east by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Blackburn, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Philip, Griffin, upon the north west by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, upon the west by the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south west and upon the south east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, at the junction of New Chapel Street with St. Aidan's Avenue, and extending thence eastward along the middle of St. Aidan's Avenue for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running along the backs of the houses on the eastern side of New Chapel Street and on the

morthern side of New Wellington Street, and extending thence first south eastward and then eastward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 18% chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading past the eastern side of the house and premises known as Number 127, New Wellington Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with New Wellington Street, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of New Wellington Street for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Golden Hill Bridge over the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, from the said New Parish of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood.

'II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Francis, Fenniscliffe, which is bounded upon the north partly by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton, and partly by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, upon the east and upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, from the said New Parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, at a point in the middle of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal opposite to the middle of the road leading past the western side of the Victoria Cotton Mill, and extending thence north eastward to and along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 53 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bonsall Street and with the road leading across Primrose Hill Bridge to Marsden Street, and extending thence first northward and then north eastward along the middle of the last described road and along the middle of Marsden. Street for a distance in all of 131 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Marsden Street with the road called Primrose Terrace, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Primrose Terrace for a distance of 15 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Hawkins Street, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Hawkins Street for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Queen Victoria Street, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Witton.'

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order

and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of November, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of so much as is hereinafter mentioned of the ownership of the Advowson or right of Patronage of and presentation to each of five Benefices, all of them situate in the County of Cornwall and in the Diocese of Truro, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Charlestown, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Par, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Penponds, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Treverbyn and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint George, Kenwyn (Truro), by way of exchange for so much as is hereinafter mentioned of the Advowson or right of Patronage of and presentation to each of five other Benefices, all of them situate likewise in the said County of Cornwall and in the said Diocese of Truro, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Godolphin, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Mithian, the Benefice (being a Vicarage), of Mount Hawke, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Treleigh and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of All Saints, Tuckingmill:

'Whereas under the provisions of the 21st section of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, the right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the ten Benefices mentioned above is at present exercised alternately by Your Majesty and Your Successors and by the Bishop of Truro

for the time being:
"And whereas it has been proposed to us that the Patronage of the said ten Benefices should be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter

recommended and proposed:

" And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the

said Benefices respectively are as set forth in

the Schedule hereunto annexed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Walter, Bishop of Truro, as the alternate Patron of each of the said five Benefices of Charlestown; Par; Penponds; Treverbyn; and Saint George, Kenwyn (Truro) (in testimony of which consent he, the said Bishop, has affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), and with the consent of the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the alternate Patron of each of the said five Benefices of Godolphin; Mithian; Mount Hawke; Treleigh; and All Saints, Tuckingmill (in testimony of which consent he, the said Stanley Baldwin, has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the alternate right of Patronage of and presenta-tion to each of the said five Benefices of Charlestown; Par; Penponds; Treverbyn; and Saint George, Kenwyn (Truro), which is now as aforesaid exercised by the said Walter, Bishop of Truro, shall be transferred from him,

the said Bishop, and from his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and. thenceforth belong to and may from time to time be exercised by Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever in such manner that the whole Advowson of each of the last mentioned five Benefices shall hereafter belong to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever, and that in exchange for the same the alternate right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said five Benefices of Godolphin; Mithian; Mount Hawke; Treleigh; and All Saints, Tuckingmill, which is now exercised as aforesaid by Your Majesty shall be transferred from Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to and may from time to time be exercised by the said Walter, Bishop of Truro, and his successors, Bishops of Truro, for ever in such manner that the whole Advowson of each of the last mentioned five Benefices shall hereafter belong to the said Walter, Bishop of Truro, and his successors, Bishops. of Truro, for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions. of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any

other Act of Parliament.

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of presentation of and to the Vicarage of the Parish Church of Epsom (hereinafter called the said Benefice ') is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Arthur Moore, of Downside, Epsom, Barrister at Law:

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

# Authorisation of Landing of Animal for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the Animal described in the First Schedule hereto, which is intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

# Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto.

#### Examination before Landing.

3. No such animal as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animal has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

# Regulation Applicable to the Animal on Landing.

4. The Animal on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animal shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARA-TION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1925 (No. 15).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

### Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas.

1. The areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, as modified by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Temporary Modification of Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Revocation of Certain Orders.

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

#### Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS (DISINFECTION) ORDER OF 1925.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Prescribed Method of Disinfection

1.—(1) The provisions referred to in the Schedule hereto which relate to the use for disinfection of limewash or of a particular disinfectant, or of one of several disinfectants shall, after the commencement of this Order have effect as if, for the requirement of the use of limewash or disinfectant or disinfectants specified or described in such provisions, there were substituted a requirement of the use of either:—

(a) a five per cent. solution of standard phenol; or

(b) a disinfectant approved by the Minister for the purposes of this Order, if

used at the dilution at which such disinfectant is approved.

(2) Where under any Order mentioned in the Schedule hereto the disinfection is carried out by the use of a disinfectant specified in paragraph (1) of this Article, it shall not be necessary, notwithstanding any provision in the Order, to apply limewash to the place or thing disinfected.

#### Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

#### Revocation.

3. The Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906 is hereby revoked.

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-enle-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following

boundary, namely:-

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and southeasterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and

Note.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district tor which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.

Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

In the administrative county of Radnor.

The parishes of Abbeycwmhir, Llanbadarn-Fynydd, Llanbister, Llananno, and Llandewi-Ystradenny, and such parts of the parishes of Beguildy, Heyop and Llangunllo which lie to the North of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway between the point where the railway crosses the road leading from Llanguallo to Llanbister, and the railway bridge at Knucklas.

Ross and Cromarty.--An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller island adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.
