The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day shifts, of women of 18 years of age and over in mechanical operations connected with the manufacture of spectacle frames at the works of The Hadley Company (Mr. A. Hadley, Proprietor), Portsmouth Road, Long Ditton, Surrey, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom, messroom and washing accommodation and facilities for sitting shall be provided; and that arrangements shall be made for the effective and regular supervision, by a responsible forewoman, of the women employed on each shift.
