The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:—

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, Sovereign of the Imperial Service Order, to all to whom these Presents shall come: Greeting!

Whereas by Warrants under Our Royal Sign Manual, dated the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, the sixteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and the seventeenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, We were graciously pleased to Make, Ordain, and Establish Statutes and Ordinances for the government of the Imperial Service Order and the Imperial Service Medal, reserving to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating and augmenting, interpreting and dispensing with those Statutes by a notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the said Order:

And whereas We are minded to make certain amendments to the Statutes of the said Order:

Now We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, abrogate the fourteenth

and eighteenth clauses of the said Warrant of the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and in lieu thereof Make, Ordain and Establish the following Statutes and Ordinances:—

Fourteenthly.—It is ordained that it shall be competent to Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Ordinance signed by the Sovereign and on the recommendation to that effect of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State whose Department the matter doth properly concern, to cancel and annul the appointment of any person to this Order, and that thereupon his name in the Register shall be erased; but that it shall be competent for the Sovereign to restore to the Order any person whose appointment may have been so cancelled and annulled when such recommendation has been withdrawn.

Eighteenthly.—It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, by an Ordinance signed by the Sovereign and on the recommendation to that effect of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State whose Department the matter doth properly concern, to cancel and annul the award of any Imperial Service Medal, and that thereupon the name of the recipient in the Register shall be erased; but it shall be competent for the Sovereign to restore the Medal to any person whose name may have been so erased, when such recommendation has been withdrawn. And every person to whom the said Medal is awarded shall, before

receiving the same, enter into an agreement to return the Medal if his name shall be erased as aforesaid.

And it is Our Will and Pleasure that these Statutes shall be taken and received as part and parcel of the Statutes of the said Order.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, this *Fourteenth* day of *January*, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, in the sixteenth year of Our Reign.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Donald Fletcher, a miner employed at the Creswell Colliery, Derbyshire, in the following circumstances:—

On September 10th, 1925, a heavy fall of roof to a depth of 16 feet took place at the Creswell Colliery in Derbyshire completely burying a miner named Cooper. Some of the

larger pieces of the roof became interlocked affording him some protection from the full weight of the fall and thus prevented his being crushed to death. Efforts were made to discover where Cooper lay and it was found that his head was near the edge of the fall so that it was possible to free it from debris. His shoulders were next freed but his body and legs were held fast. The only way in which Cooper could be extricated was that someone should crawl under the debris and by working a passage alongside and over Cooper release him very gradually and stone by stone. Fletcher at once volunteered for this task and was successful after two hours' continuous work. Great patience and skill were required, and in the course of the work Fletcher's body was completely under the fall with his head close to Cooper's feet. Throughout the operation Fletcher was exposed to the risk of being crushed to death either by a second fall or by a settling down of the first fall, and he performed his task skilfully without regarding his own safety. Fletcher's action was a very brave one involving great risk to his own life and, indeed, in the latter stages of the work his position was more dangerous than Cooper's.
