“And whereas by Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th day of August, 1920, the 8th day of December, 1924, and the 25th day of June, 1925, provision has been made, subject to certain conditions and restrictions, for the increase on a percentage basis of certain pensions granted before the 4th day of August, 1914:

“And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and certain subsequent Orders, new scales of retired pay for service were instituted for all Officers retired on or after the 1st day of April, 1919, and approval has been given subject to certain conditions to the application

of the said scales as from the 1st day of April, 1919, to Officers previously retired, who had served during the late war in any service capacity:

“And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of October, 1923, scales of additional retired pay and disability retired pay were introduced for Officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and certain of the Royal Naval Reserve Forces who are invalided out of the Service on or after the 1st day of October, 1921, on account of injury or sickness certified by the competent medical authority as attributable to the conditions of service:

“And whereas we are of opinion that further provision should be made for the benefit of Officers who before the dates on which any of the aforesaid Orders came into operation were retired or discharged from the service on account of peace time injuries and granted injury pensions and whose total means are below the maximum limits prescribed by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of August, 1920:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to empower us at our discretion and with effect from the 1st day of April, 1920, to increase the retired pay or pension of any such Officer by such sum as may be necessary to bring his total means up to the maximum limits prescribed for an unmarried person or for a married person, as the case may be, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of August, 1920, provided that

“(a) the amount of the pension and

injury pension originally granted together with any increase previously granted under Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th day of August, 1920, and the 8th day of December, 1924, and any increase granted under this Order shall in no case exceed the retired pay and additional retired pay which might have been granted to him had he been invalided for the same injury on the date of this Order:

"(b) that in determining the rate of additional retired pay which might have been granted to him had he been invalided on the date of this Order, regard shall be had to the present degree of disablement as determined by the competent medical authority after medical examination, if such be deemed necessary, and

"(c) that no increase under this Order be granted to any pensioner with effect from a date earlier than the 7th day of August, 1924, unless he was resident in the British Islands before that date.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas certain of the duties formerly performed by Your Majesty's Coastguard under the Board of Admiralty, have, since the first day of April, 1923, been carried out by employees of the Board of Trade and Board of Customs:

“And whereas it was provided by Your Majesty's Order in Council, bearing date the 26th day of May, 1925, that the Force performing at Admiralty Shore Signal Stations certain of the duties formerly carried out by the Coastguard, New Force, should in future be designated the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service, and that the titles of the various ranks and ratings of the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service should be as follows, viz.:—Senior Chief Officers, Chief Officers, Petty Officers and Signalmen:

“And whereas it is desirable to alter the designation of and to specify the conditions of service of the Officers and men of the Royal Navy employed under the Admiralty at Shore Wireless Telegraphy and Direction Finding Stations in the United Kingdom on certain other of the duties formerly carried out by Your Majesty's Coastguard:

“And whereas the full pay and retiring allowances of Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines are subject to revision periodically, and we are of opinion that the full pay and retiring allowances of Officers serving at

the above Stations should be subject to revision in the same manner and at the same dates:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that the Force consisting of Officers and men of the Royal Navy (other than those formerly belonging to the Coastguard, New Force) employed under the Admiralty at Shore Wireless Telegraphy and Direction Finding Stations in the United Kingdom shall, as from the 20th day of June, 1924, be designated the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service, and that the titles of the various ranks and ratings of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service shall, as from that date, be as follows, viz.:—Senior Chief Officers, Chief Officers, Petty Officer Telegraphists, Leading Telegraphists and Telegraphists, in lieu of the titles formerly used in Your Majesty's Coastguard, viz.:—Divisional Chief Officers, Chief Officers, Petty Officers, Leading Boatmen and Boatmen respectively.

“We beg leave further to recommend that the Officers and men of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service shall serve, as from that date, from time to time with the rates of pay set forth in the Schedule hereto, and under the conditions set forth in the Coastguard Instructions, 1911, as amended to the date of this Memorial, except in so far as these conditions may be inconsistent with the provisions of the Schedule hereto, in which case the provisions of the said Schedule shall prevail.

“We beg leave further to recommend that the Officers and men formerly belonging to the Coastguard, New Force, and employed under the Admiralty at Shore Wireless Telegraphy and Direction Finding Stations in the United Kingdom shall, as from the twenty-sixth day of May, 1925, be transferred to the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service with the titles and rates of pay, and under the conditions of service, laid down for the various ranks and ratings of the said Service in Your Majesty's Order in Council of that date, notwithstanding that they may continue to be employed at Shore Wireless Telegraphy and Direction Finding Stations as aforesaid.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“SCHEDULE.

“The rates of pay and allowances of Officers and men of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service, as from the 20th June, 1924, to be as follows, the standard rates of pay and retiring allowances of Senior Chief Officers and Chief Officers being subject to further revision on the 1st July, 1927, and triennially thereafter:

" *Marriage Allowance* to be payable to ratings of the Shore Wireless Service at the rates promulgated from time to time by the Admiralty in accordance with Order in Council of the 13th August, 1920.

" *Allowance for work done in connection with the Works Department.*—Men of the Shore Wireless Service employed on work in

connection with the Works Department to be eligible, as from the 20th June, 1924, to the 16th October, 1924, for the special rate of extra pay of 6d. per hour sanctioned for the Coastguard by Order in Council of the 29th June, 1900. Such men, as from the 17th October, 1924, to be eligible for a special rate of extra pay of 9d. per hour in lieu of the above rate.

" *Retirement.*—Senior Chief Officers (S.W.S.) and Chief Officers (S.W.S.) promoted to the rank of Chief Officer of Coastguard before the 20th June, 1924, to be subject to compulsory retirement on attaining the age of 55. Senior Chief Officers (S.W.S.) and Chief Officers (S.W.S.) promoted to the rank of Chief Officer (S.W.S.) on or after that date to be subject to compulsory retirement on attaining the age of 50.

" Senior Chief Officers (S.W.S.) and Chief Officers (S.W.S.) to be retired at any age if found medically unfit for service, and to be allowed to retire voluntarily, at the discretion of the Admiralty, on or after attaining the age of 40.

" *Step in rank on retirement.*—Senior Chief Officers (S.W.S.) and Chief Officers (S.W.S.) to be eligible on retirement, at Admiralty discretion, for the grant of the rank of Lieutenant on the retired list, provided that, on the date of ceasing service, they have served 9 years from the date of promotion to Chief Officer.

" *Reversion to the Active Service.*—In the event of ratings of the Shore Wireless Service reverting to the Active Service, time served, or allowed to reckon, as Telegraphist, Leading Telegraphist, or Petty Officer Telegraphist in the Shore Wireless Service to count towards increase of pay in the equivalent Active Service rating."

WHEREAS by Section 214 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (57 & 58 Vict., c. 60) it is provided that a local authority, whose district includes a seaport, may, with the approval of the Board of Trade, make byelaws relating to seamen's lodging houses in their district, and that those byelaws shall be binding upon all persons keeping houses in which seamen are lodged, and upon the owners thereof and persons employed therein; and further, that such byelaws shall, amongst other things, provide for the licensing, inspection, and sanitary conditions of seamen's lodging houses, for the publication of the fact of a house being licensed, for the due execution of the byelaws, for preventing the obstruction of persons engaged in securing that execution, for the preventing of persons not duly licensed holding themselves out as keeping or purporting to keep licensed houses, and for the exclusion from licensed houses of persons of improper character, and shall impose sufficient fines, not exceeding fifty pounds, for the breach of any byelaw; and further, that whenever His Majesty in Council orders that in any district or any part thereof, none but persons duly licensed in pursuance of byelaws under the said Section shall keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen from a date therein named, a person acting in contravention of that order shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds:

And whereas the Council of the City of Cardiff (hereinafter called "the City Council") is the local authority in the City of Cardiff and a local authority within the meaning of the said Section:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1896 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1896, No. 966), Her late Majesty was pleased to order that none but persons duly licensed in pursuance of the Byelaws and Regulations scheduled to such Order should keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen in the district of the City Council, including the seaport of Cardiff or in any part thereof:

And whereas the City Council have, with the approval of the Board of Trade, made further Byelaws to come into force on the 1st day of January, 1926, from which date the Byelaws and Regulations scheduled to the said Order in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1896, have been revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The said Order in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1896, shall be and the same is hereby revoked.

(2) None but persons duly licensed in pursuance of the said Byelaws which came into force on the 1st day of January, 1926, or of Byelaws for the time being in force in substitution for or in modification or

variation of or in addition to such Byelaws, shall keep seamen's lodging houses or let lodgings to seamen in the district of the City Council, including the seaport of Cardiff or in any part thereof.

(3) This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Cardiff Seamen's Lodging-houses Keepers) Order, 1926.

WHEREAS by Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, provision has been made for the reciprocal enforcement of judgments in the United Kingdom and in other parts of His Majesty's Dominions:

And whereas by the said Act it is, amongst other things, provided that where His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of His Dominions of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that the said part of that Act shall extend to that part of His Dominions, and that on any such Order being made the said part of that Act shall extend accordingly:

And whereas on the 6th day of December, 1922, the Irish Free State was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament shortly entitled the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922 (Session 2):

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that part of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

The Territory of Papua.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the registration or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any judgment in pursuance of Part II of the said Act.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Colony of Kenya is a British Settlement within the meaning of the British Settlements Act, 1887:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty has

power and jurisdiction within the Uganda Protectorate and the Protectorate of Kenya:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the British Settlements Act, 1887, the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) There shall be established the office of High Commissioner for Transport for the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya and the Protectorate of Uganda.

(2) The High Commissioner for Transport (hereinafter referred to as the High Commissioner) shall be a Corporation Sole under that name with perpetual succession and an official seal and may sue and be sued under the above name, whether in contract or in tort by the ordinary procedure of law.

(3) Any damages, compensation or costs awarded by any Court to the High Commissioner shall be paid into the Railway and Harbour Fund; any damages, compensation or costs awarded by any Court against the High Commissioner shall be paid out of the Railway and Harbour Fund.

2. The person holding the Office of High Commissioner shall be the Officer administering the Government of Kenya.

3.—(1) The High Commissioner shall have the control, working and management of the Services, and for this purpose shall have all the powers necessary for and incidental thereto. The Services shall include all such railways, ports, harbours, wharves and steamship services as:—

(i) Are now or may hereafter be owned, controlled, or managed by the Government of Kenya or the Government of Uganda; and

(ii) Are declared by an Order of the High Commissioner, with the approval of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies (hereinafter referred to as the Secretary of State), to be included in the Services.

(2) All powers given to the High Commissioner by this Order shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and, in so far as is not inconsistent with the aforesaid provisions, in accordance with the provisions of any law in force in Kenya or Uganda and of any Ordinance which may hereafter be passed by the Legislature of Kenya or Uganda.

4. The Services shall be known as the Kenya and Uganda Railway.

5.—(1) The High Commissioner may appoint a General Manager who shall have such of the authority and powers of the High Commissioner as may be delegated to him by the High Commissioner or may be conferred upon him by any Ordinance of Kenya or Uganda.

In any act done by the General Manager in pursuance of his duties it shall be presumed that he was duly authorised thereto.

(2) The High Commissioner may appoint in addition to the General Manager such servants as may be necessary for the efficient working of the Services.

(3) Persons so appointed or deemed to be appointed as hereinafter provided shall be servants of the High Commissioner, but shall be and remain in the service of the Crown and

shall be deemed to be in the public service of Kenya and Uganda.

6. All persons who at the date of this Order in Council are employed in the Services shall as from the date hereof be deemed to be appointed servants of the High Commissioner upon the terms and conditions of their existing employment so far as is consistent with the provisions of this Order, and without prejudice to the continuity of their existing rights and obligations.

7. The High Commissioner may make, and when made may vary or revoke regulations with regard to all or any of the following matters:—

(a) The appointment, discharge, and discipline of servants, the minimum and maximum rates of pay, incremental scales, grading and classification of emoluments, leave of absence, and all other conditions of service in any department, office or branch of the Services.

(b) The security to be given by servants and the amount thereof.

(c) The grant of pensions or gratuities to servants holding pensionable posts in the Services, the establishment of sick funds, pensions and superannuation funds, provident funds, the scale of contributions and benefits, and the methods of administering such funds.

(d) The circumstances in which and the persons to whom appeals by servants in relation to their employment shall lie and the manner in which such appeals shall be made.

8.—(1) There shall be constituted a Kenya and Uganda Railway Advisory Council (hereinafter referred to as the Council) which shall consist of:—

(a) Not more than two official members representing the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

(b) Not more than two official members representing the Protectorate of Uganda.

(c) Not more than two unofficial members representing the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

(d) Not more than two unofficial members representing the Protectorate of Uganda.

The official members representing the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya shall be appointed by the Governor of Kenya, and the official members representing the Protectorate of Uganda shall be appointed by the Governor of Uganda. The unofficial members shall be appointed by the Governor in Council of Kenya or Uganda as the case may be.

(2) The General Manager may be present at all meetings of the Council and take part in the discussion, but shall not be entitled to vote.

9. The names of all members appointed to the Council shall be forthwith notified in the Official Gazettes of Kenya and Uganda, and any number of a Gazette containing a notice of any such appointment shall be deemed sufficient evidence thereof for all purposes.

10. Each official member shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor by whom he is appointed, and each unofficial member shall hold office for a period of two years from appointment subject to such conditions as may be laid down by the Governor in Council by whom he is appointed.

11. The senior official member representing the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya shall be the chairman of the Council, provided that when meetings are held in Uganda the senior official member present representing the Protectorate of Uganda shall preside.

12. If any member of the Council shall be prevented by absence, or other cause, from acting, the Governor by whom he is appointed may appoint some other person to act and vote in his place until he shall return, or be able to resume his functions.

13. The High Commissioner may make, and when made may vary or revoke regulations prescribing:—

(a) The fees and expenses which may be paid or allowed to members of the Council.

(b) The quorum necessary to constitute a meeting.

(c) The intervals at which meetings shall be held, the manner in which the business of the Council shall be conducted, the method of voting, and the form in which the minutes shall be kept.

14.—(1) The High Commissioner may consult the Council upon any matter concerning the administration and working of the Services, and shall consult the Council upon the following matters:—

(a) Any substantial alteration in the tariff of rates, fares and charges of the Services.

(b) All estimates of revenue and expenditure, including Loan Services.

(c) All Government Bills relating to the Services prior to submission to the Legislative Council of Kenya or Uganda, as the case may be.

(d) The expenditure of any sum exceeding £2,500 in respect of any one railway or harbour work or service other than a work or service covered by sanctioned working estimates or carried out under an authorised construction, betterment or renewals programme.

(e) Alterations in the scales of salaries, wages or hours of employment, or other important conditions of employment.

(f) Substantial reduction of staff.

(g) The abolition of any office in the Services carrying a salary of £1,000 per annum or over.

(h) Substantial changes in the organisation of the Services.

(i) All questions of general policy in connection with the administration, control, working or management of the Services.

15.—(1) All Government Bills relating to the Services shall, prior to submission to the Legislative Council of Kenya or Uganda, as the case may be, be submitted to the High Commissioner by the Government introducing the Bill.

(2) The Railway Council shall be entitled to submit to the High Commissioner within a reasonable time of receiving a copy of the proposed Bill a minute containing the Council's comments on the proposed Bill, and it shall be the duty of the High Commissioner to forward such memorandum to the Government concerned.

16. The minutes of the Council shall be submitted to the High Commissioner through the General Manager. The High Commissioner shall, as soon as may be after the receipt of

any minute, and after considering any matter in connection therewith which may be represented to him by the General Manager, either act upon the minute or refer it back to the Council for further consideration or reserve the matter for submission to the Secretary of State.

17. There shall be formed a Railway and Harbour Fund, into which shall be paid all revenues derived from the administration of the Services, and from which all disbursements shall be made.

Estimates of receipts and of expenditure on revenue and net revenue accounts and from betterment and renewal funds or other funds established by contributions from revenue, shall be prepared by the General Manager before the commencement of the financial year in which the expenditure is to be incurred, and supplementary and additional estimates may be prepared from time to time as may be necessary. Such estimates shall be submitted to the Council for consideration, and shall thereafter be transmitted with the recommendations of the Council to the High Commissioner for approval and transmission to the Secretary of State for his sanction.

As soon as may be after approval by the High Commissioner and before sanction by the Secretary of State, such estimates shall be submitted to the Legislative Councils of Kenya and Uganda, which may by resolution approve or disapprove of the estimates or propose modifications. The resolutions of the Legislative Councils shall be submitted for the consideration of the Secretary of State. Sanction of the estimates by the Secretary of State shall be sufficient authority for the expenditure specified therein.

18. No money shall be withdrawn from the Railway and Harbour Fund except to satisfy a judgment of a Court of Law or except as approved on estimates sanctioned by the Secretary of State pursuant to Article 17, but the High Commissioner may authorise the withdrawal of such moneys as may be necessary for the Services pending such sanction. Subject to such regulations as may be prescribed by the High Commissioner, the General Manager may authorise expenditure in excess of the provision under the individual heads of the estimates, provided that such excess expenditure is covered by savings under other heads.

19. The Railway and Harbour Fund shall be liable for all loans including all charges connected therewith advanced by His Majesty's Government and raised or borrowed or to be raised or borrowed by the Government of Kenya or the Government of Uganda or by both Governments jointly for the purposes of the Services and expended for those Services. The High Commissioner shall pay out to the Treasurer of Kenya or Uganda, as the case may be, such interest and sinking fund contributions as may be required to meet the obligations of the Fund to His Majesty's Government or of Kenya or Uganda under the Ordinance raising the loan.

20. The High Commissioner shall not be required either by the Government of Kenya or the Government of Uganda to provide transport facilities either gratuitously or at a rate of charge which is insufficient to meet the costs involved in the provision of such transport facilities unless the Government concerned

undertakes to pay the amount of loss incurred by reason of the provision of such transport facilities.

21. No loan shall be raised for the construction of new railways or for additions to the capital assets of the Services except by the Government of Kenya or the Government of Uganda, or by both Governments jointly, in such proportions as the Secretary of State may determine; and any loan so raised shall be authorised and appropriated by Ordinance.

22. If any railway is constructed by either the Government of Kenya or the Government of Uganda or both against the advice of the High Commissioner, the High Commissioner may, with the approval of the Secretary of State, by Order declare that such railway shall be included in the Services and in such case the loss, if any, upon the working of such railway, shall be made good to the Railway and Harbour Fund by the Government or Governments concerned.

23. Accounts relating to the Services shall be kept as directed by the High Commissioner. Such accounts shall be subject to audit under the direction of the Director of Colonial Audit, and shall be published annually.

24. The High Commissioner shall forward to the Secretary of State all regulations made by him under this Order, and any such regulation may be disallowed by the Secretary of State, in which case such regulation shall cease to have effect from such date as the Secretary of State shall determine.

25. Nothing in this Order shall limit the rights of the legislatures of Kenya and Uganda to pass laws, not being inconsistent with the provisions of this Order, relating to the Services.

26. All contracts entered into by or with the authority of the Government of Kenya or the Government of Uganda on behalf of the Uganda Railway prior to the date of this Order shall be deemed to be contracts entered into by or on behalf of the High Commissioner.

27. The Governors of Kenya and Uganda may, by Joint Proclamations in the Gazettes of Kenya and Uganda at any time within two years from the date of this Order, and provided that the approval of the Secretary of State has been previously obtained, vary, annul, or add to the provisions of this Order in order to carry out the purposes of the same.

28. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors in Council may from time to time revoke, alter, add to or amend this Order, and nothing in this Order shall limit the right of the Legislative Council of Kenya or Uganda to petition His Majesty through the Secretary of State for the termination of this Order or any provisions of this Order.

29. This Order may be cited as the Kenya and Uganda (Transport) Order in Council, 1925, and shall come into force on such date as may be fixed by Proclamation, made jointly by the Governors of Kenya and Uganda and notified in the Official Gazettes of Kenya and Uganda.

MERCHANT SHIPPING.

EMIGRANT SHIPS: FOOD SCALE.

The Emigrant Ships (Food Scale) Regulations, 1926, dated 28th January, 1926, made by the Board of Trade under Section 17 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, (6 Edw. 7, c. 48).

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 17 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906 (6 Edw. 7, c. 48), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe as follows:—

1. The following Regulation is hereby substituted for No. 8 of the Regulations relating to Provisions and Water contained in the Scale and Regulations dated 2nd January, 1908 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1908, No. 19):—

"Of the total quantity of bread or biscuit required by the Food Scale, biscuits shall be provided at the rate of 2 lbs. for each steerage passenger and member of the crew. The total quantity of biscuit provided need not in any case exceed 800 lbs. This Regulation shall not apply to ships in the North Atlantic Trade."

2. This Order may be cited as the Emigrant Ships (Food Scale) Regulations, 1926.
