PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the eighth day of December, 1924, and known as the Zanzibar Order in Council, 1924 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order) provision was made for the exercise of the said jurisdiction:

And whereas by a Decree known as the Zanzibar Councils Decree, 1926, His Highness the Sultan has made provision (amongst other things) for the establishment of a Legislative Council in Zanzibar:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the Principal Order in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1926," and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order.

2. Every reference in the Principal Order to the Decrees of the Sultan of Zanzibar or

Decrees made or issued or published by the Sultan of Zanzibar shall be deemed to include a reference to Decrees enacted by His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

3. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification by the Secretary of State published in the London Gazette.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in

Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 28th day of January, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Bonby, in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bonby is now limited and settled to uses under which the Right Honourable Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough, is tenant for life thereof free from incumbrances, and the said Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough, is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

“ And whereas the said Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bonby should be transferred in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token of his willingness to accept jointly with the other persons hereinafter mentioned the transfer of the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage hereinafter recommended and proposed and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Bonby which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Bonby:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme), with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consents of the persons to whom together with the said Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough,

and the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, it is hereinafter recommended and proposed that the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage should be transferred, that is to say, with the consents of the Venerable Ernest Morell Blackie, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of Stow, of Frederick John Ellis Hare, Farmer, and of William Morley, Joiner, both of Bonby (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bonby shall be transferred to the said Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough; William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln; Ernest Morell Blackie; Frederick John Ellis Hare; and William Morley, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough; William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln; Ernest Morell Blackie; Frederick John Ellis Hare; and William Morley, their heirs and assigns for ever, as Trustees upon the trusts declared by a certain Indenture already prepared and intended to be executed by the said Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough; William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln; Ernest Morell Blackie; Frederick John Ellis Hare; and William Morley.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

2. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army, the Militia, and the Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

6. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

7. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

8. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all gentle-

men connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

9. Chairmen of County Councils, and all gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

10. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

11. All gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office or any other Government Department will adopt the same procedure, and will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

An Area comprising :—

*In the administrative county of Derby.*

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Totley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Totley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Totley and

Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

(11th January, 1926.)

*In the administrative county of Radnor.*

The parishes of Abbeycwmhir, Llanbadarn-Fynydd, Llanbister, Llananno, and Llandewi-Ystradenny, and such parts of the parishes of Beguildy, Heyop and Llangunllo which lie to the North of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway between the point where the railway crosses the road leading from Llangunllo to Llanbister, and the railway bridge at Knucklas.

*Inverness.*—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller island adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

**NOTE.**—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.
