#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the eighth day of December, 1924, and known as the Zanzibar Order in Council, 1924 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order) provision was made for the exercise of the said jurisdiction:

And whereas by a Decree known as the Zanzibar Councils Decree, 1926, His Highness the Sultan has made provision (amongst other things) for the cstablishment of a Legislative Council in Zanzibar:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the Principal Order in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1926," and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order.

2. Every reference in the Principal Order to the Decrees of the Sultan of Zanzibar or

Decrees made or issued or published by the Sultan of Zanzibar shall be deemed to include a reference to Decrees enacted by His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

3. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification by the Secretary of State published in the London Gazette.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.
