WHEREAS by the Colonial Boundaries Act, 1895, it is provided that where the Boundaries of a Colony have, either before or after the passing of that Act, been altered by Order in Council or by Letters Patent, the Boundaries as so altered shall be, and be deemed to have been, from the date of the alteration, the Boundaries of the Colony:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the 29th day of February, 1916, certain Islands in the Pacific Ocean therein and hereinafter referred to as the Union Islands were, together with all small Islands, Islets, Rocks and Reefs depending on them, annexed to His Majesty's Dominions and the Boundaries of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Colony were extended so as to include the said Union Islands and their Dependencies:

And whereas it is expedient that the Boundaries of the said Colony should be further altered so as to exclude the said Islands and their Dependencies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Colonial Boundaries Act, 1895, or otherwise in His Majesty vested is pleased, by and with the

advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. From and after the Proclamation of this Order in the Western Pacific High Commission Gazette the Boundaries of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Colony shall be altered so as to exclude the said Union Islands and their Dependencies.

II. This Order may be cited as "The Union Islands (No. I) Order in Council, 1925."

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing even date herewith and known as "The Union Islands (No. 1) Order in Council, 1925," provision has been made for altering the Boundaries of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Colony so as to exclude certain Islands in the Pacific Ocean therein and hereinafter referred to as the Union Islands and their Dependencies:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made for the peace order and good government of the said Islands, which are specified in the Schedule to this Order, in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. From and after the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette of the Dominion of New Zealand the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Dominion of New Zealand for the time being (hereinafter called the Governor-General) shall be the Governor of the Union Islands, and in the event of the death or incapacity of the said Governor-General, or in the event of his absence from the said Dominion, the officer for the time being administering the government of the Dominion shall be Governor for the time being of the Union Islands.

II. The Governor-General in Council is hereby authorised and empowered to make all such Laws Rules and Regulations as may lawfully be made by His Majesty's authority for the peace order and good government of the said Islands, and it shall be lawful for the Governor-General in Council to delegate the said authority and power to the Administrator of the Territory of Western Samoa or some other fit officer, as the Governor-General in Council may determine.

III. The said Administrator or other officer shall exercise the authority and power delegated to him as aforesaid subject to any instructions which he may from time to time receive from the Governor-General in Council, and any Laws Rules or Regulations made by him in pursuance of such delegated authority and power shall be subject to disallowance by the Governor-General in Council.

IV. All laws in force in the Union Islands at the time when this Order shall take effect shall continue in operation until repealed or altered by Laws Rules or Regulations made as herein provided, and all powers and authorities which by such laws as aforesaid are vested in the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific and officers appointed by him shall be vested in and exercisable by the Governor-General and the officers appointed by him.

V. This Order may be cited as "The Union Islands (No. 2) Order in Council, 1925."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th February, 1926, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) 4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd February, 1926, to Saturday, the 27th February, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 2nd October, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd February, 1926, to Saturday, the 27th February, 1926, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1926, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not

later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF PROFESSIONAL LEGAL CLERKS IN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The authorities of a Department having vacancies to fill will take such steps as they think most appropriate by public advertisement in the Press or otherwise to make known the existence of the vacancies, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity. The advertisement will fix the last day on which applications can be received, and the date by which the age-limits will be reckoned. The authorities of the Department having the vacancies will send a notice of them to the authorities of other Departments having professional legal staff.

2. Application will be addressed to the Department in question on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached the authorities of the Department will scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them best qualified for the duties. They will at the same time forward to the Civil Service Commissioners the application forms of the candidates recommended, together with the application forms of any candidates not recommended who are employed in a Government Department; and the list of candidates to be interviewed by the Selection Board will then be settled by agreement between the Department and the Civil Service Commissioners who may, if dissatisfied with the candidates recommended, take such steps in consultation with the Department as they may think fit to obtain other candidates.

3. Candidates recommended by the Department and accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will select for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the qualifications most suited to the posts to be filled. In assigning candidates to fill vacancies the Selection Board will have regard to the requirements of the Department having the vacancy. The Selection Board will usually comprise representatives of the Civil Service Commission, the Department and the Lord Chancellor.

Until further notice, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from more active employment by a physical impairment due to the War and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post. Other things being equal and subject to this preference, preference will also be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, and among these preference

will be given to such as have served or are serving in a Government Department over candidates without such service.

4. Candidates must be under the age of 35 years on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. Such age limit may, however, be extended in favour of a candidate who has served in His Majesty's Forces between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, and is or has been employed in a Government Department.

5. Candidates must be barristers or admitted solicitors, and a Department may invite applications from either or both of these classes. Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to vacate their appointments on marriage.

6. No person will be eligible for appointment who is not a natural-born British subject, and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

7. No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

8. The appointment of a selected candidate will be subject to his satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of his eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until he has passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Department.

The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work.

Power to make Regulations.

1. (1) The Local Authorities of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep) for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the Districts, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2. (1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

The Kesteven and Lindsey Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, hereby cancel as from 15th February, 1926, their Order of the 24th February, 1925, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of the Parts of Kesteven and Lindsey Divisions of Lincolnshire which for the purposes of the said Act shall be deemed to include the city and county borough of Lincoln, and the county borough of Grimsby, and hereby order that such employment shall be as follows:—

1. In the case of male workers other than those specified in clause 2 below:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on Saturday, or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(d) All employment in excess of 52 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment) in any week in Summer.

(e) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment) in any week in Winter.

2. In the case of male workers employed wholly or mainly as:—

(a) *Waggoners.*

(1) All employment in any week in excess of 61 hours during the period commencing on the 15th October and ending on the 13th May.

(2) All employment in any week in excess of 58 hours during the remainder of the year.

(b) *Shepherds of 21 years of age and over.*

(1) All employment in any week in excess of 55 hours in summer.

(2) All employment in any week in excess of 56 hours in winter,

but so that no employment on customary duties in connection with the care of sheep during the lambing season on the premises on which the worker is employed shall rank as overtime employment.

(c) *Stockmen of 21 years of age and over.*

(1) All employment in any week in excess of 56 hours in summer.

(2) All employment in any week in excess of 58 hours in winter,

provided that in the case of all workers specified in Clause 2 (a), (b) and (c) above, all employment other than employment on customary duties in connection with the care of horses, sheep and stock respectively in excess of 52 hours per week in Summer and 48 hours per week in Winter, shall be deemed to be overtime employment.

3. For the purpose of this Order employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the day before the first Monday in November, and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

4. This Order shall come into operation on 16th February, 1926.
