WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 7 of the Police, Factories, &c. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, of making orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories and workshops, he proposes to make an order to apply to all factories and workshops in Scotland, in which the gutting, salting and packing of herring are carried on.
