**W**HEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Boston in the County of Lincoln did on the 13th day of March, 1925, agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for an alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 2nd day of May, 1925, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 25th day of June, 1925, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Boston should be henceforth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be three:

And whereas on the 21st day of July, 1925, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynton-Hicks, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, Barrister at Law, to be a Commissioner for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Boston:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 8th day of December, 1925:—

“ SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE BOROUGH OF BOSTON IN THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN AND APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONG THE SAID WARDS IN PURSUANCE OF THE ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 25TH JUNE, 1925.

“ I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

“ *Bargate Ward.*

“ A line commencing at a point in the centre of Vauxhall Bridge on the eastern boundary of the Borough thence running westward along the centre of the whole extent of Main Ridge thence following the north side of Pump Square and continuing along the centre of the whole extent of Dolphin Lane to the Market Place thence straight south westward to the centre of the Town Bridge and along the centre of the said Bridge as far as the centre of the River or Haven thence north west along the centre of the Haven and River Witham to the Borough boundary opposite Mile House thence following the Borough boundary eastward and northward and continuing along the said Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ *South Ward.*

“ A line commencing at a point in the centre of Vauxhall Bridge on the eastern boundary of the Borough thence running westward along the boundary of Bargate Ward as hereinbefore

defined to a point opposite the centre of Lincoln Lane, thence westward along the centre of Lincoln Lane to the intersection of Rosegarth Street thence southward along the centre of Rosegarth Street to the intersection of West Street thence westward along the centre of West Street to a point in the centre of the railway crossing of the London and North Eastern Railway Company thence southward along the centre of the said Railway line to a point opposite the centre of Broadfield Lane thence south westward, southward, westward and southward along the centre of Broadfield Lane to a point in the centre of the Forty Foot Drain thence westward along the centre of the Forty Foot Drain to the Borough boundary and thence southward along the Borough boundary and continuing along the said Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" West Ward.*

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of the River or Haven opposite Lincoln Lane and proceeding westward along the boundary of the South Ward as hereinbefore defined and continuing along the boundary of the said South Ward to a point in the centre of the Forty Foot Drain at the intersection of the boundary of the South Ward as hereinbefore defined thence proceeding westward along the Borough boundary and continuing along the said Borough boundary to the point of intersection with the Bargate Ward and thence south-eastward following the boundary of the Bargate Ward as hereinbefore defined along the centre of the River Witham to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" The boundaries of the Wards as above described are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto which forms part of the Scheme.

**W**HEREAS it is provided by the Merchant Shipping (Equivalent Provisions) Act, 1925 (15 & 16 Geo. 5, c. 37), that where His Majesty is satisfied that (a) ships of a foreign country are required by the law of that country to comply with any provisions which are substantially the same as or equally effective with any provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts which apply to foreign ships while they are within a port of the United Kingdom; and (b) that country has made or has undertaken to make provision for the exemption of British ships, while they are within a port of that country, from the corresponding requirements of the law of that country, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that any such provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts as aforesaid shall not apply to any ship of that country within a port of the United Kingdom if it is proved that the ship complies with the corresponding provision of the law of that country applicable to that ship:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that French ships are required by the law of that country to comply with provisions which are substantially the same as or equally effective with those of the Merchant Shipping Acts relating to wireless telegraphy which apply to foreign ships while they are within a port in the United Kingdom and that that country has made provision for the exemption of British ships while they are within a port of that country from the corresponding requirements of the law of that country:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts relating to wireless telegraphy as aforesaid shall not apply to any French ship within a port in the United Kingdom if it is proved that the ship complies with the corresponding provisions of the law of that country applicable to that ship.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) French Ships Order, 1926.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Southwark:

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Honourable Francis George, Earl of Northbrook:

“ And whereas the said Francis George, Earl of Northbrook, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Southwark for the time being:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, now Bishop of Southwark, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Francis George, Earl of Northbrook (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and

without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mildred, Burnt Ash Hill, Lee, now vested in him, the said Francis George, Earl of Northbrook, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 28th day of January, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the disunion of the United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville in the County of Leicester and Diocese of Peterborough and the constitution of separate Benefices of Hungarton and Twyford with Thorpe Satchville:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the disunion of the said United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein recommended, such disunion and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the disunion of the United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas the said United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville is at present vacant:

" And whereas the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville belongs solely to one Patron or body of Patrons:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the present union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Hungarton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Twyford with Thorpe Satchville in the said United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville shall be dissolved and the Vicarage of Hungarton and the Vicarage of Twyford with Thorpe Satchville shall each become and shall thenceforth be a separate Benefice with Cure of Souls.

" 2. That the Benefice of Hungarton so constituted a separate Benefice as aforesaid shall be named or designated 'The Vicarage of Hungarton,' and the limits of the Parish to belong or be assigned to such separate Benefice shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the Parish of Hungarton.

" 3. That the Parish Church at Hungarton shall be the Parish Church of the said Benefice of Hungarton.

" 4. That the Parsonage House at Hungarton of the said United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville shall belong to the Benefice of Hungarton and shall be the Parsonage House of that Benefice.

" 5. That the Benefice of Twyford with Thorpe Satchville so constituted a separate Benefice as aforesaid shall be named or designated 'The Vicarage of Twyford with the Chapelry of Thorpe Satchville' and the limits of the Parish to belong or be assigned to such separate Benefice shall be coterminous with the boundaries of the Parish of Twyford with Thorpe Satchville.

" 6. That the Parish Church at Twyford shall be the Parish Church of the said Benefice of Twyford with Thorpe Satchville.

" 7. That the endowments and property of the said United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville shall be divided, appropriated and distributed as follows, that is to say, there shall be assigned and annexed to the said Benefice of Hungarton and vested in the Incumbent thereof and his Successors (a) all the Glebe land situate within the Civil Parish of Hungarton now belonging to the said United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville, and (b) all that Modus or composition in lieu of Tithes amounting to £8 per annum now payable to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Hungarton with

Twyford and Thorpe Satchville arising in respect of land now or formerly being or being part of the Ingarsby Estate, and there shall be assigned and annexed to the said Benefice of Twyford with Thorpe Satchville and vested in the Incumbent thereof and his Successors all the other or remaining endowments and property of the said United Benefice of Hungarton with Twyford and Thorpe Satchville.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Peterborough has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the United Benefice therein recommended to be disunited shall be disunited to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

pared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 28th day of January, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Edwardstone and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Groton both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Albert, late Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Edwardstone and Groton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union and also recommended an alteration of the boundaries of the said Benefices of Edwardstone and Groton and of the Benefice of Boxford situate in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Edwardstone and Groton are now full, the Reverend Thomas Robert Browne being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Edwardstone and the Reverend William Henry Bonsey being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Groton:

“ And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Boxford belongs to Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Boxford is now full, the Reverend William Shaw Andrew being the present Incumbent thereof:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Edwardstone and the said Benefice of Groton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Edwardstone with Groton ’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Sudbury but the parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices

shall take effect forthwith and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Edwardstone shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately and the first turn of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice to be made after the union shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

“ 5. That with the consent of George, Viscount Cave, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain (in testimony of which consent he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent also of the said William Shaw Andrew (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), upon the union taking effect (1) a portion of the said Benefice and Parish of Edwardstone containing about three acres and consisting wholly or principally of gardens and premises attached to houses situate on the south western side of Swan Street, all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan annexed hereto and thereon coloured pink, (2) an isolated portion of the said Benefice and Parish of Groton containing about an acre and a half and lying to the north east of Saint Mary's Church, Boxford, all which isolated portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured green and (3) a further portion of the said Benefice and Parish of Groton containing about fifteen acres and consisting principally of houses with their premises and gardens situate on the north eastern side of Swan Street all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured green, shall be severed from the Benefices and Parishes of Edwardstone and Groton respectively and shall thereupon and thereafter be annexed to and form part of the said Benefice

and Parish of Boxford for all Ecclesiastical purposes.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, and Measures, or of any other Act of Parliament, or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

Five pounds per centum per annum War Stock to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Devizes and a sum of £600 Five pounds per centum per annum War Stock to the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Parkstone. Provided always that the whole of the first Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

That the union shall take effect upon the first vacation of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, after the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and the said John James West if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Nicholas, Nottingham, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saint Nicholas, Nottingham, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"6. That upon the said union taking effect a portion only of the endowments of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, namely £100 per annum of the annual sum or stipend at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, shall be transferred and annexed to and become part of the endowments of the United Benefice.

"7. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Saint Nicholas, Nottingham.

" *As to the union of the Benefice of Saint Thomas, Nottingham (after the severance of the portion before described in this Scheme), with the Benefice of Saint Matthew, Nottingham, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose :*

That upon the said union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, left standing within the limits of the United Benefice shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the said Church of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saint Matthew, Nottingham, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and that so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds from such sale shall be held by us for and towards the cost of the provision of a Parsonage House for the Benefice of Saint Stephen, Nottingham, in the said Diocese of Southwell.

" 6. That upon the said union taking effect a portion, namely £65 per annum of the annual sum or stipend at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, shall be transferred and

annexed to and become part of the endowments of the United Benefice, and the remaining endowments of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, other than the sum of £100 per annum assigned to the United Benefice of Saint Nicholas, Nottingham, by Part I of this Scheme shall be transferred and annexed to and become part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Saint Stephen, Nottingham.

" 7. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Saint Matthew, Nottingham.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas an appeal was made to His Majesty in Council by the Vicar, Churchwardens and certain parishioners of the Parish of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order of His Majesty in Council of the 17th day of March, 1925 :

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council as their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme affirmed :

that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 39).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas.*

1. The areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order."

*Modification of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.*

2. Notwithstanding Article 2 of the "Principal Order," animals may be moved out of any of the Infected Areas Nos. 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 described in the First Schedule to this Order direct to a slaughterhouse situated in another of those Infected Areas, provided that the slaughterhouse is not situated within two miles of any Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place and that during the movement the animals are accompanied by a licence in the form prescribed in the Schedule to the Principal Order. Condition 2 of the form of licence issued in respect of animals so moved shall be amended accordingly.

*Substitution of Area to which the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Birmingham Pig Market) Order of 1926 applies.*

3. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Birmingham Pig Market) Order of 1926 shall be read and have effect as if for the Area described in the Second Schedule to that Order there were substituted the Area No. 8 described in the First Schedule to this Order.

*Revocation of Certain Orders.*

4. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

5. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

#### Substitution of Infected Areas.

8. For the purpose of the application of the above differential overtime rates the Kent Agricultural Wages Committee have by an Order dated 18th February, 1926, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

(a) In the case of male workers of 21 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as Horsemen, Cowmen or Shepherds:—

(i) When employed on customary duties:—

All employment in excess of 60 hours in any week (including Sunday).

(ii) When employed on other than customary duties:—

(a) All employment on a Sunday.

(b) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and worker.

(c) All employment in excess of 52 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

(b) In the case of workers other than those specified in (a) above:—

(i) All employment on a Sunday.

(ii) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and worker.

(iii) All employment in excess of 52 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in Summer.

(iv) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in Winter.

(c) In the case of female workers:—

(i) All employment on a Sunday.

(ii) All employment in excess of 8 hours on any one day (excluding Sunday).

(ii) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and worker.

(iii) All employment in excess of 52 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

2. In the case of all other male workers:—

(a) All employment on a Sunday.

(b) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and worker.

(c) All employment in excess of 52 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in Summer.

(d) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in Winter.

3. In the case of female workers:—

(i) All employment on a Sunday.

(ii) All employment in excess of 8 hours on any one day (excluding Sunday).

4. For the purpose of this Order, employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first day of March and terminating on the last day of October, and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the remainder of the year.

This Order shall come into operation on 2nd March, 1926.

Where a whole time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 50 in Summer or 48 in Winter, as the case may be, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been pay-

able if the agreed hours had been 50 in Summer or 48 in Winter, as the case may be.

3. For the purpose of the above rates, employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the second Monday in February and ending on the second Sunday in November, and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

4. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a whole time worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

5. The differential rates for overtime in the case of employment of male workers in agriculture shall be not less than the following minimum rates:—
