

ance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Bristol as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, now Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Westbury on Trym, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'the District of Saint Peter, Henleaze.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said George, Bishop of the said Diocese of Bristol, and his successors, forever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Peter, Henleaze, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Westbury or Trym, in the County of Gloucester and in

the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon the east partly by the Parish of Horfield and partly by the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bishopston, upon the south by the Particular District of Saint Alban, Westbury on Trym, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the north west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Particular District of Saint Alban, Westbury on Trym, from the said Parish of Westbury on Trym at the point in the middle of Westbury Road due west of the junction of the road called North View and Etloe Road where such boundary diverges southward along the middle of Westbury Road, and extending thence first northward, then north eastward, and then again northward along the middle of Westbury Road for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brecon Road, and extending thence first eastward and then north eastward along the middle of Brecon Road for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Waterford Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Waterford Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its present northern end, and extending thence first westward in a straight line to a point in the middle of the southern end of the footpath leading from Waterford Road to Eastfield Road and then north westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance in all of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road which leads past the houses in Eastfield Terrace, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of such road for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Henleaze Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Henleaze Road for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Southmead Road, and extending thence first north eastward, then eastward and then again north eastward along the middle of Southmead Road for a distance of 11½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Wellington Hill, and extending thence first south eastward, then eastward and then again south eastward along the middle of Wellington Hill for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Westbury on Trym from the said Parish of Horfield."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Westbury on Trym out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken:

And whereas such Patrons and Incumbent have offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately
