SUPREME COURT, ENGLAND.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that after the expiration of at least 40 days from the date hereof the Lord Chancellor, the Lord Chief Justice and the Senior Master of the Supreme Court (King's Bench Division) in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 220 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act, 1925, propose to make Rules providing for the facilitation of the production of documents filed in or in the custody of the Central Office.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as their Lordships may determine.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Nine Hackney Carriages at Walm Lane, and Station Parade, Willesden Green, in two portions, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the boundaries for the same, viz. :—

First portion.—One carriage on West side of Walm Lane, opposite No. 3, Willesden Green Station, keeping clear of North entrance to Station.

Front of vehicle toward the South.

Second portion.—Eight carriages on South side of Station Parade, commencing at a point in line with the party wall of Nos. 14/16, Station Parade, extending Westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for eight carriages, keeping clear of Entrance to No. 1, Chesham House and the Emergency Exit of the Station.

Front of vehicle toward the East.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Provided that no hackney carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 42).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Substitution of Infected Areas.

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 39) shall be read and have effect as if the Areas

described in the Schedule to this Order were respectively substituted for the Infected Areas Nos. 2 and 4 described in the First Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the eighth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Release of certain Area from Restrictions.

2.—(1) The Infected Area No. 3 described in the First Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 39) shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the tenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 42).
