SUPREME COURT, ENGLAND.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that after the expiration of at least 40 days from the date hereof the Lord Chancellor, the Lord Chief Justice and the Senior Master of the Supreme Court (King's Bench Division) in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 220 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act, 1925, propose to make Rules providing for the facilitation of the production of documents filed in or in the custody of the Central Office.

Notice is further given that under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, the Lord Chancellor, the Lord Chief Justice and the Senior Master of the Supreme Court (King's Bench Division), have on account of urgency made the above Rules to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Rules.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 12th March, 1926, at 1 o'clock for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as their Lordships may determine.
