STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL WARES TRADE BOARD  
(GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY THE GENERAL MINIMUM TIME RATES, PIECE-WORK BASIS  
TIME RATE AND OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED  
AS DIPPERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, respectively, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, in Great Britain for the Stamped or PRESSED Metal Wares Trade as specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Stamped or PRESSED Metal Wares) Order, 1924, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for female workers set out in their Notice Q. (30) dated 16th May, 1925, in their application to female workers employed as Dippers, the Minimum Rates proposed for female workers employed as Dippers being as set out in the Schedule below.

## PART II.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED AS DIPPERS.

As respects female workers employed as Dippers for whom Variations of the General Minimum Time Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time Rate are proposed in Part I above, Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Notice Q. (30), issued by the Trade Board and dated 16th May, 1925, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable as set out in Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above-mentioned Notice Q. (30) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

## PART III.

APPLICATION OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all female workers who are employed as Dippers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Stamped or PRESSED Metal Wares) Order, 1924, as set out in Part III of the above-mentioned Notice Q. (30).

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 9th day of March, 1926. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

##### *Authorisation of Landing of Pedigree Sheep from New Zealand.*

1. The landing of the sheep described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

##### *Definition of Quarantine Station.*

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the sheep under this Order.

##### *Regulations Applicable to Animals before and on Landing.*

3.—(1) The sheep shall not be landed in Great Britain unless and until there are delivered to a proper officer of Customs the certificates and declarations prescribed by this Article, namely:—

(a) a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Dominion of New Zealand to the effect that at the time of the shipment of the animals both the sheep and also the whole of the Dominion were free from foot-and-mouth disease, sheep pox and cattle-plague;

(b) a certificate signed by the Secretary of the Corriedale Flock Book, or by some person authorised to act on his behalf, to the effect that the said sheep were at the time of shipment from the Dominion duly registered as pedigree stock in the Corriedale Flock Book;

(c) a statutory declaration from the shipper that the fodder and litter accompanying the sheep are products of the Dominion of New Zealand;

(d) a statutory declaration from the Master of the Vessel in which the sheep are carried to Great Britain that during the whole of the voyage from New Zealand no cattle, sheep, goats, other ruminating animals or swine have been carried on the vessel from any port except sheep shipped at a port in New Zealand; that the sheep have been kept separate from all other animals during the voyage; that no other fodder or litter for the use of any animal on the vessel has been shipped during the voyage to Great Britain at any port or place outside the Dominion of New Zealand, and that whilst the said sheep were on board, the vessel did not enter a port in a prohibited country for the purposes of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

(2) The sheep, before being landed, shall be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and if found by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease, shall forth-



with be landed and moved under the supervision of the Inspector from the place of landing to the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station described in the Second Schedule hereto.

(3) The animals shall be detained in the said Quarantine Station until the expiration of a period of twenty-eight days after their arrival therein.

(4) Whilst detained in the said Quarantine Station the animals shall be under the control of a Veterinary Inspector appointed by the Ministry.

(5) During such period of detention no other animals shall be moved into the said Quarantine Station, and the animals landed under this Order shall be kept separate from all other animals.

(6) During such period of detention the animals and the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station hereby defined shall be subject to such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease.

(7) In the event of foot-and-mouth disease, sheep pox or cattle plague being found to exist during the prescribed period of detention in any animal referred to in this Order, the Ministry shall cause to be slaughtered all the animals in the consignment, and in the event of any such disease being suspected to exist in any such animal, the Ministry may cause the slaughter of such of the animals as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of diagnosis. No compensation shall be payable by the Ministry in respect of any animal slaughtered under this Order.

#### *Disinfection of Vessel, etc.*

4. The vessel from which the animals are landed and the fittings, dung, fodder, litter and other things used for or about the animals, shall be disinfected or disposed of in accordance with such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry.

*In the administrative county of Derby.*

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Topley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Topley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Topley and

Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely :—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

(11th January, 1926.)

*In the administrative county of Radnor.*

The parishes of Abbeycwmhir, Llanbadarn-Fynydd, Llanbister, Llananno, and Llandewi-Ystradenny, and such parts of the parishes of Beguildy, Heyop and Llangunllo which lie to the North of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway between the point where the railway crosses the road leading from Llangunllo to Llanbister, and the railway bridge at Knucklas.

*Inverness.*—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller island adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.
