PROVISIONAL ORDER.

The Notice in this matter in the issue of the 26th ultimo, is hereby cancelled, and the following Notice is substituted for it.

HYPHE.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Hythe (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Hythe Corporation Act, 1905, so as:—

(1) To provide for the audit of all the accounts of the Corporation and their officers by the District Auditor appointed by

the Minister of Health in the like manner as the accounts of an Urban Authority and their officers are audited under Sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875, in lieu of the audit provided by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882;

(2) To empower the Corporation to incur reasonable expenses for or in connection with certain purposes to be specified in the Order, including in particular the following, viz.:—

Subscriptions to the funds of associations of local authorities and their officers; the attendance of members and officers of the Corporation at conferences and meetings of such associations and the purchase of reports of the proceedings; the presentation of the freedom of the borough; occasions of public ceremony or festival and the reception or entertainment of distinguished persons; and the installation of the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports and the other ceremonies and proceedings to which the Corporation contribute as one of the Cinque Ports;

(3) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Notice is hereby given that E. C. H. Salmon, Esq., M.C., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health, will attend at the Town Hall, Hythe, on Friday, the twenty-sixth day of March, 1926, at half past ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

And notice is hereby further given that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.
