TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th March, 1926, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd March, 1926, to Saturday, the 27th March, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 2nd October, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the

23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd March, 1926, to Saturday, the 27th March, 1926, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1926, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TRANSFER OF PARISH.

EASTBOURNE AND NEWHAVEN UNIONS.

SEAFORD PARISH.

The Minister of Health, in pursuance of section 32 of the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1834, and section 66 of the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1844, and of all other powers

enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT.

1. This Order may be cited as the Seaford Order, 1926, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1926:

Provided that for the purpose of the preparation of any precept or contribution order to be made on or after the 1st day of April, 1926, this order shall operate from such earlier day as may be necessary.

INTERPRETATION.

2. In this order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“The appointed day” means the 1st day of April, 1926;

“The transferred Parish” means the Parish of Seaford in the Eastbourne Union;

“The Eastbourne Guardians” and “the Newhaven Guardians” mean respectively, the Board of Guardians of the Eastbourne Union and the Board of Guardians of the Newhaven Union.

TRANSFER OF PARISH.

3. On the appointed day the Parish of Seaford shall be separated from the Eastbourne Union and shall be added to and form part of the Newhaven Union.

GUARDIANS OF THE POOR.

4.—(1) The total number of elected Guardians of the Eastbourne Union shall be reduced by two and the total number of elected Guardians of the Newhaven Union shall be increased by that number.

(2) The transferred Parish shall continue to be represented by two Guardians.

(3) Any person who immediately before the appointed day is in office as Guardian for the transferred Parish shall represent that Parish on the Newhaven Guardians until the 15th day of April, 1928, and shall then retire from office.

5. For the purposes of the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1894, relating to the qualification of Guardians, the transferred Parish shall be deemed to have formed part of the Newhaven Union since the 1st day of March, 1925.

IRREMOVABILITY.

6. Every person who immediately before the appointed day has acquired, or is in the course of acquiring, a status of irremovability from the Eastbourne Union, by reason of residence in the transferred Parish, or any part thereof, shall be deemed to have acquired, or to be in the course of acquiring, a status of irremovability from the Newhaven Union.

INSTITUTIONAL RELIEF.

7. The cost accruing on and after the appointed day of the maintenance in any institution for lunatics or other institution of any person who may be chargeable immediately before the appointed day to the Eastbourne Guardians, and—

(a) who has acquired a settlement in the transferred Parish; or

(b) who resided in the transferred Parish immediately before he last became chargeable to the Eastbourne Guardians;

shall be defrayed by the Newhaven Guardians.

PROPERTY, DEBTS AND LIABILITIES.

8.—(1) As soon as practicable after the appointed day, the Eastbourne Guardians, as regards any cash balance in their hands on that day, shall estimate the proportion thereof derived from contributions paid by the transferred Parish, and subject to a deduction in respect of undischarged liabilities accruing up to the appointed day, shall transfer the amount of the balance to the Newhaven Guardians.

(2) The provisions of this article represent an agreement between the Eastbourne Guardians and the Newhaven Guardians for the purpose of obviating any adjustment under the Poor Law (Dissolution of School Districts and Adjustments) Act, 1903, or the Local Government (Adjustments) Act, 1913, in consequence of the transfer of the Parish of Seaford to the Newhaven Union and shall operate in satisfaction of any claim by the Eastbourne Guardians or by the Newhaven Guardians to an adjustment under either of those Acts.

TRANSFER OF COLLECTOR OF POOR RATES.

9.—(1) Any person who, immediately before the appointed day, holds the office of collector of poor rates for the transferred Parish, shall in respect of that office be transferred to and become an officer of the Newhaven Guardians, but shall continue in his existing office upon the same terms and subject to the same conditions and regulations as now apply to that officer in respect of his office.

(2) The annual contributions under the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, made by an officer, who is transferred by this Article to the Newhaven Guardians shall, in so far as such contributions have been received by the Eastbourne Guardians, be transferred by those Guardians to the Newhaven Guardians.

COMPENSATION TO OFFICERS, ETC.

10.—(1) If any officer or servant, in office immediately before the appointed day, shall be deprived of any office or employment or shall suffer any direct pecuniary loss by reason of this order, or by anything done in pursuance or in consequence of this order, the Minister of Health may, if he sees fit, award such compensation as may, in his opinion, be equitable.

(2) Any compensation awarded under this article shall be paid by such persons, out of such fund, and in such manner, as the Minister of Health may direct.

PAROCHIAL DOCUMENTS.

11. Any books or documents immediately before the appointed day in the possession of the Eastbourne Guardians or of the Assessment Committee of the Eastbourne Union, and relating exclusively to the transferred Parish, shall be transferred to the possession of the Guardians of the Newhaven Union or of the Assessment Committee of that Union, as the case may require.

ORDERS.

12. All orders issued by the Minister of Health, or his predecessors, which immediately before the appointed day are in force in the Newhaven Union, and apply to the

several parishes in that Union, shall extend and apply to the transferred Parish.

EXISTING CONTRACTS AND INSTRUMENTS.

13. All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments entered into or made by the Guardians of the Eastbourne Union in relation exclusively to the transferred Parish, shall be of as full force and effect against or in favour of the Guardians of the Newhaven Union, and may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if, instead of the Eastbourne Guardians, the Newhaven Guardians had been a party thereto.

PENDING ACTIONS.

14. If immediately before the appointed day any action or proceeding, or any cause of action or proceeding, is pending or existing by or against the Eastbourne Guardians, in relation exclusively to the transferred Parish, or any part thereof, the same shall not be in anywise prejudicially affected by reason of the making of this order, but may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Newhaven Guardians.

SAVINGS.

15. All precepts or contribution orders issued or made before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this order had not been made.

16. All rates made by the overseers of the transferred Parish, which are not collected at the appointed day, may be collected and recovered as if this order had not been made.

17. Nothing in this order shall affect the power of a board of guardians to obtain an order for the removal, or an adjudication of the chargeability, in accordance with the statutory provisions in that behalf, of any person who is in receipt of poor relief.

18. Nothing in this order shall be construed as restricting the powers of the Secretary of State or of the Minister of Health or of the council of any county or county borough under the Local Government Act, 1888, or the Local Government Act, 1894.

DETERMINATION OF QUESTIONS, ETC.

19. If any question, difference or difficulty arises in relation to any matter dealt with in this order, the Minister of Health may provide for the determination of the question or difference, or the removal of the difficulty.
