WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and of the Act of the 35th and 36th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 14, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of February, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and of the Act of the 35th and 36th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 14, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, partly out of the Parish of Bexley, partly out of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of the Holy Trinity,

Lamorbey, all in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester and partly out of the Parish of East Wickham, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, the said Parish of Bexley, the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, and the said Parish of East Wickham are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, the said Parish of Bexley, the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, and the said Parish of East Wickham which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

" And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

" And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church for the said proposed separate District:

" And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is herein-after set forth:

" And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Rochester as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Reginald now Bishop of Rochester, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, now Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme and sealed the same with their respective Episcopal Seals), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, of the said Parish of Bexley, of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, and of the said Parish of East Wickham which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John, Welling,' and that such District shall be included in and shall form part of the Rural Deanery of Dartford, of the Archdeaconry of Rochester, and of the said Diocese of Rochester.

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication

of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said John Reginald, Bishop of the said Diocese of Rochester, and his successors for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Saint John, Welling, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, of the Parish of Bexley, of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, all in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, and of the Parish of East Wickham, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, which, taken together, are bounded upon the west partly by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, and partly by the District Chapelry of Saint Luke, Well Hall, Eltham, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Southwark, upon a small part of the north by the New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Southwark, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north, upon the east, and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Dover Road opposite to the milestone indicating 9 miles from London Bridge where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, the said Parish of East Wickham, and the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, all meet, and extending thence south eastward along the boundary which divides the said Parish of East Wickham from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath (thereby following the middle of Dover Road) for a distance of 53 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Bexley Heath line of the Southern Railway across Dover Road, and extending thence first north eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of East Wickham from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath) for a distance of 1 mile and 28 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Brampton Road across such line of railway, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Brampton Road for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Crook Log, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dallin Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Dallin Road for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to its present southern end, and continuing thence southward in precisely the same direction as the latter part

of Dallin Road and in a straight line for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Bean Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, from the said Parish of Bexley, and extending thence first westward, then southward, and then south westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Bean Road and in part the middle of Danson Road) for a distance of $51\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bexley from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, and extending thence first south westward and then westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Danson Road and in part the middle of Blendon Road) for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Blendon Road with Penhill Road and Blackfen Road, and extending thence first westward, then north westward, then again westward, and then south westward along the middle of Blackfen Road for a distance of 1 mile and 35 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned either signified their assent or offered no objection to such Scheme:

And whereas the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Bexley has offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Dioceses of Rochester and Southwark.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of All Souls, Witton, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of the Holy Trinity, Birchfield, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Birmingham:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Birchfield, and of the Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham, in the County of Warwick and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parish and Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Birchfield, and of the said Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of All Souls, Witton, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Birchfield, and with the consents of John Francis William Deacon, of Mabledon, Tonbridge, in the County of Kent, Esquire, of the Reverend Ernest Newton Sharpe, of The Vicarage, Paddington, in the County of Middlesex, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, of George Thomas Bethune-Baker, of Number 20, Newbold Terrace, Leamington, in the said County of Warwick, Esquire, of the Venerable John Harold Richards, of Coleshill Vicarage, Birmingham, in the said County of Warwick, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of Aston, and of the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, of Halfacre, Heathside Park Road, Woking, in the County of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Birmingham, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Birchfield, and of the said Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham, which are described in the Schedule hereunder

written, all of which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of All Souls, Witton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Souls, Witton.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Souls, Witton, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of the Holy Trinity, Birchfield, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Birmingham, and of the Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham, in the County of Warwick and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint James, Aston juxta Birmingham, in the said County of Warwick and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, from the said Parish of Aston juxta Birmingham, at the junction of Trinity Road with Witton Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Witton Road for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Aston Lane, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Aston Lane (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint John, Perry Barr, in the said County of Stafford and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Birchfield) for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stoneleigh Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Stoneleigh Road for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Normandy Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Normandy Road for a distance of 6 yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 138, Normandy Road, and extending thence southward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Normandy Road, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 12½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the King Edward Grammar School Cricket and Football Ground, and extending thence southward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the walls or fences forming the northern and western boundaries of the house and premises known as Number 77, Trinity Road, and extending thence southward along the wall or fence forming the western boundary

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Jesmond, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint George, Newcastle upon Tyne, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population afore-

said) of the said New Parish of Jesmond and of the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle upon Tyne, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Jesmond, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Louis, Bishop of Newcastle, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle upon Tyne, and with the consents of Thomas William Sharp, of Blythwood South, Jesmond, Newcastle upon Tyne, Esquire, Frederick Carrick, of The Elms, Elmfield Road, Gosforth, in the said County of Northumberland, Esquire, Robert Stanley Dalglish, of South End, Jesmond, Newcastle upon Tyne, Esquire, William John Sanderson, of Warkworth, in the said County of Northumberland, Esquire, and Ridley Warham, of Milburn House, Newcastle upon Tyne, Esquire, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Jesmond (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Jesmond and of the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle upon Tyne, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Jesmond, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Jesmond.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Jesmond, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Jesmond, in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle, which is bounded upon the west and upon the north west by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint George, Newcastle upon Tyne, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle upon Tyne, upon part of the south by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Newcastle upon Tyne, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south and upon the south west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Newcastle upon Tyne, from the said New Parish of Jesmond at the Junction of Sandyford Road with Jesmond Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Jesmond Road for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway

leading past the western side of All Saints' Cemetery into Clayton Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clayton Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Jesmond from the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle upon Tyne.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle upon Tyne, which is bounded upon the south and upon the south east by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Jesmond, upon the north east by the said New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle upon Tyne, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle upon Tyne, from the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle upon Tyne, at the centre of the footbridge which carries the footpath leading from Reed Walk into Jesmond Dene Road across the stream called Ouse Burn, and extending thence first south westward and then southward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Jesmond Dene Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Jesmond Dene Road for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to the backs of the houses and premises known as Fenwick Terrace, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the wall or fence at its southern end, and extending thence eastward along such wall or fence for a distance of 4 yards or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as Number 5, Fenwick Terrace, from the house and premises known as Wellburn, and extending thence south westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the northern side of the road called Buston Terrace, and extending thence first southward to and then westward along the middle of Buston Terrace for a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains to its junction with the roadway leading past the eastern side of the house and premises known as Number 58, Buston Terrace, and along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Buston Terrace and extending thence first northward, then north westward and then westward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the eastern side of Manor House Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Buston Terrace, and extending thence westward along the middle of Buston Terrace for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Manor House Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Manor House Road for a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Osborne Avenue, and extending thence westward along the middle of

Osborne Avenue for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading past the western side of the Northumberland County Cricket Ground and of All Saints Cemetery into Clayton Road and extending thence southward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall forming the northern boundary of the said cemetery upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle upon Tyne, from the said New Parish of Jesmond."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, of the Parish of King's Norton, of the Parish of Northfield, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Agnes, Cotteridge, all in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes and Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, of the said Parish of King's Norton, of the said Parish of Northfield, and of the said New Parish of Saint Agnes, Cotteridge, should be formed into a consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Francis, Bournville, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, as such Bishop and also as one of the Patrons, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, with the consents of Henry Thomas Ledsam, of Number 302, Hagley Road, Edgbaston, in the County of Warwick, Esquire, of Joseph James, of Barnt Green, in the said County of Worcester, Esquire, and of Stephen Price, of Lloyd's Bank, in the City of Birmingham, Esquire, as the remaining Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, with the consent of the Reverend Thomas Shelton Dunn, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of King's Norton, and, as such Vicar or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Agnes, Cotteridge (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Worcester, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of King's Norton (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Representation), and with the consent of the Warden, Council, and Scholars of Keble College, in the University of Oxford, as the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Northfield (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, of the said Parish of King's Norton, of the said Parish of Northfield, and of the said New Parish of Saint Agnes, Cotteridge, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Francis, Bournville, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Francis, Bournville.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Francis, Bournville, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, of the Parish of King's

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to James Kipling, James Johnston, and Nani Khan, employed by the Mohpani Colliery of the Great Indian Peninsular Railway, in the following circumstances:—

On January 7th, 1925, in the course of operations at the Mohpani Colliery of the Great Indian Peninsular Railway a very heavy fall of roof took place killing one miner instantaneously and completely burying another named Nanoo Maora. On a report of the accident reaching Mr. Kipling, the Under-Manager of the mine, he immediately proceeded to the scene accompanied by Mr. Johnston, the senior European Overseer, and Nani Khan, a native timber drawer. They crawled through the fall of stone and earth and eventually after fifteen minutes' work succeeded in extricating the entombed man.

The rescue party ran a very grave risk as falls of stone were continually taking place. Indeed, within ten minutes of their extricating Nanoo twenty tons of rock fell on the very spot where he had been lying. Mr. Kipling took the leading part in the work of rescue but he could not have accomplished it alone and there is no doubt that it is to his efforts combined with those of Mr. Johnston and Nani Khan that Nanoo owes his life

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Hertford have in pursuance of the above Act, duly cancelled the minimum and overtime rates of wages fixed by them for the employment of male workers in glasshouses situated in market gardens or nursery grounds and made effective by an Order of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 23rd September, 1925, and have duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for a male worker employed wholly or mainly in glasshouses situated in market gardens or nursery grounds or on work incidental to his employment therein (hereinafter called "a male worker") for time work in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee hereby cancel the said Order dated 23rd September, 1925, as from 25th March, 1926, and hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 26th day of March, 1926.

1. The wages payable to a male worker shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

Provided that in the case of a male worker of 21 years of age and over who is engaged in cucumber growing in glasshouses or on work incidental to his employment therein, the minimum rates shall when so employed be ½d. per hour in excess of the rates specified above.

2. Where a whole time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period, and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 51 in summer or 48 in winter, as the case may be, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 51 in summer or 48 in winter, as the case may be, provided that the worker presents himself at the place of employment at the proper time and ready to work.

3. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has

prevented from working a male worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

4. A male worker who is required to present himself for work and who does so present himself at the commencement of the day on the following public holidays, viz., Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday and August Bank Holiday, shall be entitled to receive payment for a day's work at not less than the above rates provided that such worker shall, if so required by his employer, work until 12 noon on such day and that shall be the day's work.

5. For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be all employment during the period commencing on the first day of March and terminating on the last day of October following and employment in winter shall be deemed to be all employment during the period commencing on the first day of November and terminating on the last day of February following.

6. The differential rates of wages for overtime in the case of employment of a male worker shall be:—

(a) In respect of overtime employment on the following public holidays, viz., Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday and August Bank Holiday not less than wages at one-and-a-half times the general minimum time rates otherwise applicable.

(b) In respect of all other overtime employment, not less than wages at one-and-a-quarter times the general minimum time rates otherwise applicable.

7. For the purpose of the application of the above differential overtime rates the Hertfordshire Agricultural Wages Committee have by order dated 15th March, 1926, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

1. All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being a Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and a male worker.

2. All employment on a Sunday.

3. All employment after 12 noon on the following public holidays, viz., Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday and August Bank Holiday.

4. All employment in excess of 51 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in summer.

5. All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment in winter).
