The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of February, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Frostenden and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of South Cove, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:—

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Frostenden and South Cove duly made their report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ips-

wich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Frostenden and South Cove are now full, the Reverend John Williams Fawcett being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Frostenden and the Reverend Frederick George Montgomery Norris being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Cove:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Frostenden and the said Benefice of South Cove shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Frostenden with South Cove ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of

the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Frostenden shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of South Cove and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately and the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices of Frostenden and South Cove an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the times prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and

within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 11th day of February, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church situate at Mungrisdale, within the Parish of Greystoke, in the County of Cumberland, and in the Diocese of Carlisle:

" Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Greystoke, the Parish of Caldbeck, and the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Matterdale, all in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parishes and New Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Greystoke, of the said Parish of Caldbeck, and of the said New Parish of Matterdale should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church situate at Mungrisdale as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See, of the Rectory of the said Parish of Caldbeck, with the consent of Mary Grace Senhouse-Ryder, of Bishopsbourne, Cannes, France, Married Woman, as the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Greystoke, and with the consent of the Reverend Richard Field Smyth, Rector or Incumbent of the said Rectory of Greystoke, and as such Rector or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Matterdale (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Greystoke, of the said Parish of Caldbeck and of the said New Parish of Matterdale, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church situate at Mungrisdale as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Mungrisdale.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Mungrisdale comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Greystoke, in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle, which comprises the Civil Parishes of Mungrisdale and Bowscale and portions of the Civil Parishes of Hutton Roof, Berrier and Murrah, and Hutton Soil, and which is bounded upon the south partly by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Matterdale, in the said County and Diocese, and partly by the Chapelry of Threlkeld, in the said Parish of Greystoke, upon the west by the Extra Parochial Place called Skiddaw Forest, upon the north west and upon part of the north by the Parish of Caldbeck, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Caldbeck from the said Parish of Greystoke at the centre of the ford in the River Calder of Caldew where the road leading

from Mosedale to Hutton Roof crosses such river, and extending thence first north eastward, then eastward and then again north eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Hutton Roof to Mungrisdale, and extending thence first south eastward and then southward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 1 mile or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Mungrisdale towards Castle Sowerby, and extending thence north eastward along the last mentioned road for a distance of 39 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the western boundary of Howgill Wood, and extending thence south eastward to and along such fence and along the fence forming the western boundary of the close lying between Howgill Wood and Cow Snout Wood and the fence forming the western boundary of Cow Snout Wood for a distance in all of 74 chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the last mentioned fence, and extending thence in a straight line due west for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road leading from Murrah to Berrier, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading across the northern end of Little Eycott Hill, and extending thence first south westward, then southward and then again south westward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the fence forming the western boundary of Little Eycott Hill, and extending thence southward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Berrier and Murrah from the Civil Parish of Mungrisdale, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of 1 mile and 7 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said Civil Parish of Berrier and Murrah from the Civil Parish of Hutton Soil, and extending thence first north eastward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 678 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the said Civil Parish of Hutton Soil published in the year 1899 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation, and extending thence south eastward along the last mentioned fence and along the fences forming the eastern boundaries of the closes numbered 677, 690, 689, 691, and 693 upon the same maps for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the eastern boundary of the said close numbered 693 meets the northern side of the road leading from Penrith to Keswick, and extending thence south eastward in a straight line across the last mentioned road for a distance of 17 yards or thereabouts to the northern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 707 upon the said maps, and

extending thence south eastward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the northern boundary of the Cockermouth, Keswick and Penrith line of railway, and extending thence south eastward in a straight line across the said line of railway for a distance of 13 yards or thereabouts to the northern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 708 upon the said maps, and extending thence first south eastward and then south westward along the last mentioned fence and along the fences forming the southern boundaries of the said close numbered 708 and the close numbered 709 upon the same maps for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the southern boundary of the said close numbered 709 meets the eastern side of the road leading from Troutbeck Station to Matterdale, and extending thence first westward to the middle of the last mentioned road and then first southward and then south westward along the middle of such road for a distance in all of 19 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Greystoke from the said New Parish of Matterdale.

"II. Also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Caldbeck which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the Civil Parish of Mosedale.

"III. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Matterdale which is bounded upon the north and upon the north west by the above described portion of the said Parish of Greystoke, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Greystoke from the said New Parish of Matterdale at the junction of the stream known as Trout Beck and the stream known as Redsike Gill, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of the last mentioned stream for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries the road leading from Wallthwaite to Troutbeck Station across such stream, and extending thence first eastward and then north eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 1 mile and 50 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the ford in the said stream known as Trout Beck, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Matterdale from the said Parish of Greystoke."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Thursday, the 1st April, 1926, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £40,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as their Lordships may determine.

#### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from



Tuesday, the 6th April, 1926, to Saturday, the 10th April, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 2nd October, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from the Paraguayan Chargé d'Affaires in London a communication dated February 26th, 1926, giving notice of the denunciation by the Paraguayan Government of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Navigation between

Great Britain and Paraguay, signed at Asuncion on October 16th, 1884, article 16 of which provides for the termination of the Treaty on the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the Contracting Parties shall have given such notice.

The Treaty will accordingly terminate on February 26th, 1927.

The Home Secretary gives notice, that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in cake making at the works of Messrs. Outram's Southport Cakes Limited, Victoria Street, Burscough Bridge, Lancashire, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation, washing facilities and facilities for sitting shall be provided; that arrangements shall be made for the effective and regular supervision, by a responsible woman, of the women and young persons employed; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

#### PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE RATES OF WAGES IN THE HAND-HAMMERED CHAIN TRADE FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918 and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts 1909 and 1918 in Great Britain for the trade of Hand-Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain Making HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they propose to Vary for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Index Figure the General Minimum Piece Rates for Hand-Hammered Chain Making from iron up to and including  $\frac{1}{2}$ " as set out in the Notices C. (17) and C. (21), issued by the Trade Board and dated 30th October, 1923 and 21st February, 1925 respectively and to Fix for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Index Figure General Minimum Piece Rates for the making of certain classes of Chain from iron of sizes Nos. 11 and 12 I.S.W.G. and for the joining on in certain cases of large links tackle or fittings.

for inspection at the address shown below, or may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

In pursuance of Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act 1918 the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 26th March, 1926. It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible, with reasons what is objected to.

(GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX AND VARY GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF DOLLIED OR TOMMIED CHAIN AND OF HAND-HAMMERED CHAIN FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT ON THE "COST OF LIVING" INDEX FIGURE.

THE PROPOSAL relates to:—

- (I) The making of Dollied or Tommied Chain with Links Longer than Short Link;
- (II) The making of certain classes of Dollied or Tommied or Hand-Hammered Chain to be used as:—

- (a) Meat Chains or
- (b) The End Portions of Back Bands,

AND TAKES THE PLACE OF THE TRADE BOARD'S PREVIOUS NOTICE OF PROPOSAL C. (22), DATED 30TH JANUARY, 1926, WHICH IS WITHDRAWN.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, respectively, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the Trade of Hand-Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain Making HEREBY GIVE NOTICE:—

(1) That they PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Piece Rates for the making of Dollied or Tommied Chain (other than Chain of the classes specified in (2) below) with links longer than those constituting "Short Link" as defined in Section II of Part III of Schedule II to the Trade Board's Notice C. (19), dated the 26th January, 1924, by providing that the General Minimum Piece Rates applicable, for the "Cost of Living" periods specified in that Notice, to the making from the sizes of iron specified therein of Dollied or Tommied Short Link Chain shall, except as respects the classes of Chain specified in (2) below, apply also for the same periods to the making from the

same sizes of iron of Dollied or Tommied Chain with links longer than those constituting "Short Link" as defined.

(2) That they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Piece Rates for making Hand-Hammered Chain set out in the above-mentioned Notice C. (19), in their application to the following classes of Chain, and TO FIX General Minimum Piece Rates for making the following classes of Chain which are Dollied or Tommied, by providing the General Minimum Piece Rates set out below, that is to say:—

(i) For the making from iron of  $\frac{3}{8}$ " and  $\frac{13}{32}$ " in diameter of chain for the end portions of back bands with 6 or less links per foot:—
