

Re WALTER WATSON COULSON, Deceased.

PURSUANT to an Order of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice, dated the 22nd day of February, 1926, and made in an action in the Matter of the estate of Walter Watson Coulson, deceased (late of Alderbury, in the county of Wilts, who died on the 24th day of October, 1924), *Lloyd v. Coulson*, 1926 C. 10, whereby the following enquiries were inter alia directed, namely:—

1. An enquiry who, upon the death of the intestate, Walter Watson Coulson, became beneficially entitled to any personal estate of his as to which he died intestate, or, if more than one, in what shares and proportions, and whether any such persons are since dead, and, if dead, when they died, and who are their respective legal personal representatives.
