1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

Should a vessel sink or become a wreck in any part of the Dockyard Port so that an obstruction in a navigable fairway is caused, which in the opinion of the King's Harbour Master it is necessary to mark, such wreck shall be indicated in accordance with the Uniform system of Wreck-Marking off the coasts of the British Isles, as follows:—

(1) Green shall be the colour for all purposes connected with Wreck-Marking,

namely, for lights, buoys, balls, shapes, wreck-marking vessels, etc.

(2) Vessels and buoys shall have the word "WRECK" painted in white letters on their sides.

(3) Throughout these regulations the term "Starboard Hand" shall denote that side which would be on the right hand of the mariner, either going with the main stream of the flood or approaching a harbour, river, or estuary from seaward; the term "Port Hand" shall denote the left hand of the mariner in the same circumstances.

(4) *Shapes and Characteristics of Wreck-Marking Buoys.*

When a wreck-marking buoy is used, it shall be of one of the following shapes, and (if a light is carried) it shall be lighted in one of the manners following to indicate to the mariner on which hand he should pass the buoy.

(a) To be passed on the mariner's Port Hand—

Shape—Can.

Light—If lighted, a Green Light giving two flashes.

(b) To be passed on the mariner's Starboard Hand—

Shape—Conical.

Light—If lighted, a Green Light giving three flashes.

(c) To be passed on either side—

Shape—Spherical.

Light—If lighted, a Green Light giving one flash.

(5) *Characteristics of Wreck-Marking Vessels.*

When a wreck-marking vessel is used, it shall carry the lights and shapes and give the sound signals following to indicate to the mariner on which hand he should pass the vessel:—

(i) Between sunset and sunrise to carry the following lights:—

(a) To be passed on the mariner's Port Hand—

Two green lights in a vertical line not less than 6 feet apart from the end of a cross-yard, the lower light to be of a height not less than 15 feet above the hull.

(b) To be passed on the mariner's Starboard Hand—

Three green lights in a vertical line not less than 6 feet apart from the end of a cross-yard, the lowest light to be of a height not less than 9 feet above the hull.

(c) To be passed on either side—

Four green lights, two in a vertical line one over the other, not less than 6 feet apart, on each end of a cross-yard with

a horizontal distance between the lights at either end of the cross-yard not less than 15 feet, and not exceeding 25 feet. The height of the two lower lights to be not less than 15 feet above the hull.

(ii) A wreck-marking vessel shall not carry the ordinary riding light for a vessel at anchor.

Between sunrise and sunset to carry green balls or shapes corresponding in number and arrangement to the green lights as detailed above.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Winnall both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist and Winnall duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist and Winnall are now full, the Reverend Philip Robert Wickham being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist and the Reverend Arthur Gerald Joyce being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Winnall:

“ And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist, and Winnall now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist, and the said Benefice of Winnall shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist with Winnall ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Winnall only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist and the then Incumbent of Winnall shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Winnall; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Winnall if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist shall have been instituted to Winchester, Saint John the Baptist subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Winchester, Saint John the Baptist before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall

take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist, following such avoidance of the Benefice of Winnall and the then Incumbent of Winnall shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint John the Baptist, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the times prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Winchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Chilcomb and Winchester, Saint Peter Chesil duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Chilcomb and Winchester, Saint Peter Chesil are now full, the Reverend Gerrard Thomas Andrewes being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Chilcomb and the Reverend Edward Selby Alger being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint Peter Chesil:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Chilcomb and the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint Peter Chesil, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Chilcomb with Saint Peter Chesil, Winchester' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect

forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That a Curate at a stipend of £250 per annum be appointed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice in performing the duties of the United Benefice this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop of Winchester shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Measure.

" 4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Winchester, Saint Peter Chesil, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 5. FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 55).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas.

1. The areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Substitution of Area to which the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Birmingham Pig Market) Order of 1926 applies.

2. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Birmingham Pig Market) Order of 1926 shall be read

and have effect as if for the Area described in the Second Schedule to that Order there were substituted the Area No. 3 described in the First Schedule to this Order.

Revocation of Certain Orders.

3. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 55).
