

such number of omnibuses, in addition to those now used in the maintenance by him of any service or services on any approved route, as may be necessary for him to maintain an increased service as shown in Column 2 of the said Schedule opposite to each of such approved routes 180 and 406 respectively; provided that

nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.  
(DATED 19TH APRIL, 1926.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION  
OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF  
1926 (No. 62).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Declaration of further Foot-and-Mouth Disease  
Infected Area.*

1. The Area described in the First Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 55), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule hereto were included as Area No. 6 in the First Schedule to that Order.

*Extension of Foot-and-Mouth Disease  
Infected Area.*

2. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 55) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Orders of 1926 (Nos. 56 and 61), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were included in and

formed part of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area (No. 1) described in the First Schedule to that Order.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 62), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Articles 1 and 2.
