ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH APRIL, 1926.)

FOOT- AND - MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) (TEMPORARY MODIFICATION OF RESTRICTIONS) ORDER OF 1926.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Modification of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

1. Notwithstanding Article 2 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order" animals may be moved out of the Infected Area No. 1 for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 55), direct to a slaughterhouse situate in the county borough of Huddersfield, the city of Hull, the city of Leeds, or the city of Sheffield, if accompanied by a licence in the form prescribed in the schedule to the Principal Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination. Condition 2 of the form of licence issued in respect of animals so moved shall be amended accordingly.

Additional provisions as to movement.

2. In addition to the conditions of the form of licence, the movement shall be subject to and in accordance with the following conditions:—

(1) Animals may not be moved out of the Infected Area No. 1 referred to unless and until the licence required to be obtained from the Local Authority of the place of destination under this Order has been countersigned by an Inspector of the Ministry in the said Infected Area.

(2) The animals shall on arrival at the slaughterhouse specified in the licence be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals therein and shall be slaughtered within twenty-four hours after their arrival thereat.

Disinfection of Railway Trucks and Railway Loading Banks.

3.—(1) A railway truck or other railway vehicle used for the conveyance of any animals under this Order shall, immediately before any such animal is placed in it, and also immediately after the unloading of the animals therefrom at the place of destination, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant, under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) A railway loading bank or loading dock used for the loading or unloading of animals moved with a licence under this Order shall, when required by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant.

(3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this Article shall be:—

- (a) A five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid), or (b) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

Offences.

4. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, or in respect of Article 3 the railway company loading or unloading the animals or owning the loading banks, railway trucks or other railway vehicles in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done or omitted to be done, shall each according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) (TEMPORARY MODIFICATION OF RESTRICTIONS) ORDER OF 1926, and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

SHEEP DIPS (REGULATION) ORDER OF 1926.

Whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has ascertained that in common practice there is risk in the use of Arsenical Dips in cases where sheep are dipped twice within the period prescribed by Orders of the Minister relating to Sheep Scab and Sheep Dipping and by Regulations of Local Authorities made thereunder;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Regulation of Use of Arsenical Sheep Dips.

1. Where, by any Order of the Minister or by any regulation of a Local Authority made

thereunder, the dipping of sheep twice in an approved sheep dip is required, with an interval of not less than 7, and not more than 14, days between the two dippings, the use for the second dipping of any dip containing arsenic is hereby prohibited.

Labels to be Affixed to Approved Sheep Dips.

2.—(1) Every package or vessel containing an approved sheep dip shall, before being placed on sale or delivered to a purchaser, be clearly and distinctly labelled by the manufacturer or vendor thereof, in a form approved by the Minister.

(2) In the case of every approved sheep dip of which arsenic is an ingredient the label shall include an additional statement to the effect that the dip contains arsenic and that its use for a second dipping, in cases where sheep are required by any such Order or regulation to be dipped twice with an interval of not less than 7 and not more than 14 days between the two dippings is prohibited.

Offences.

3. If any sheep dip which has not been approved by the Minister is falsely marked with a statement or indication that it has been so approved, or if any sheep dip purporting to be an approved sheep dip is not marked with a label as required by this Order, the manufacturer and the retailer, or other person selling the dip, and the person who shall have so marked the dip or caused it to be so marked, knowing the same to have been falsely marked, or omitting so to mark the dip, as the case may be, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order,

“The Minister” means the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries;

“Approved Sheep Dip” means a Sheep Dip which has been approved for the time being by the Minister for use for the purposes of the Orders of the Minister relating to sheep scab and sheep dipping in Great Britain, or of any regulation made by a Local Authority thereunder, or purporting to be so approved;

“Sheep” includes lambs;

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP DIPS (REGULATION) ORDER OF 1926.

During the said period the animal shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(Power to supply gas in the parish of Penrhyn and part of the parish of Llangwstenin in the County of Carnarvon and in the parish of Llansantffraid Glan Conway in the County of Denbigh; Additional lands for the manufacture and storage of gas; Further provisions as to supply of gas; Borrowing of money; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts and other matters.)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Colwyn Bay Urban District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") whose address is the Council Offices, Colwyn Bay, intend to apply forthwith to the Board of Trade under and in pursuance of the Gas Regulation Act 1920, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the limits within which the Council are authorised to supply gas by the addition thereto of the following parishes and part of a parish:—

In the County of Carnarvon:—

The parish of Penrhyn and the following part of the parish of Llangwstenin, namely:—

The portion of the parish lying on the easterly and northerly side of an imaginary line drawn from the point where the boundary of the borough of Conway meets the fence of Tynyfelin farm opposite the quarry situate to the north of Marl Bach thence in a north-easterly direction along the said fence on to the Pydew Mountain thence in a south-easterly direction along the easterly fence of Esgyryn farm thence in a south-westerly direction to the footpath leading from Esgyryn Farm along such footpath to the north fence of the field immediately at the rear of Pensarn Schools thence along the easterly boundary of such field to the County boundary on the northerly side of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and thence along the County boundary in an easterly direction to the point where the County boundary intersects the boundary lines of the parishes of Llangwstenin Llandrilloyn-Rhos and Llansantffraid Glan Conway.

In the County of Denbigh:—

The parish of Llansantffraid Glan Conway.

and to authorise the Council within the said parishes and part of a parish to exercise all or any of the powers rights privileges and authorities with reference to supply and distribution of gas, and the opening and breaking up of streets, roads and ways which are exercisable by them within their existing limits of supply.

2. To provide that the price to be charged by the Council for gas supplied by them within the said parishes and part of a parish to persons who shall burn gas by meter may exceed the price charged to persons in the Colwyn Bay Urban District by ten pence per one thousand cubic feet.

3. To authorise the Council upon the land in the parish of Llansantffraid Glan Conway in the Rural District of Conway in the County of Denbigh hereinafter described, or some part or parts thereof, to erect and maintain, alter, extend, renew, improve or discontinue works for the manufacture, storage, conversion, utilisation and distribution of gas and residual products arising from such manufacture, and to make and store gas, and to make, store, purchase, utilise and distribute all such residual products and materials as aforesaid, and upon such land to construct and maintain houses, buildings, and other works connected with their gas undertaking. The land hereinbefore referred to is included within the following limits:—

(a) The easterly boundary of the foot of the embankment of the London Midland and Scottish Railway from a point 84 yards south-south-west of the southerly corner of the road leading to Llansantffraid Glan Conway Rectory from the road between Conway and Llansantffraid Glan Conway to a point 90 yards south of the first mentioned point;

(b) An imaginary straight line drawn from the point first described in a due easterly direction to the south-westerly side of the said road between Conway and Llansantffraid Glan Conway;

(c) An imaginary straight line drawn due east from the point secondly described to the south-westerly side of the said last-mentioned road; and (d) The south-westerly side of the said last-mentioned road between the points where the said imaginary lines meet it.

4. To make further provision with regard to the purchase and utilisation of residual products on the existing gas lands of the Council; the purchase of additional lands; the laying of pipes for ancillary purposes; the construction and placing of pipes etc., to be laid on consumers' premises; the cutting off and re-connecting supplies and expenses thereof; the supply of gas where the consumer has a separate supply; the register of a prepayment meter being prima facie evidence; the charges for special readings of meters; the removal of fittings where gas supply is discontinued; the provision of anti-fluctuators in connection with gas engines; the provision of a valve where high pressure air is used; bulk supplies to and from local authorities, companies or persons beyond the limits of supply; the relief from

obligation to supply in certain cases the purchasing or taking on lease dwelling-houses for employees, offices, showrooms, etc., and the inclusion of several sums due from a person in one summons or warrant.

5. To authorise the Council to borrow money for the purposes of the Order and the Gas Undertaking of the Council, and to charge the money so borrowed on the said Gas Undertaking and upon the District fund and General District Rate of the Urban District of Colwyn Bay and the undertakings, estates, rates, rents, revenues and other property of the Council or any of such securities and to execute and grant and issue mortgages and other securities, to re-borrow, to make provision for the formation maintenance and application of sinking funds, to provide for the sale of surplus lands and the application of money arising therefrom; to provide that money borrowed under the powers of the Order shall not be reckoned within the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act, 1875, and to make other financial provision with regard to the Order and the Gas Undertaking of the Council.

6. To vary or extinguish all rights or privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

7. To incorporate with the Order so far as applicable and except so far as varied thereby, and to amend, alter or repeal all or some of the provisions of the Colwyn Bay and Colwyn Urban District Council Gas Act 1901 and any other Act or Order relating to the Council or their Gas Undertaking.

8. To incorporate with the Order with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Act 1847, and the Gasworks Clauses Act 1871, and the Acts amending those Acts respectively.
