## EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 7th May, 1926, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1869, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 10th May, 1926, to Saturday, the 15th May, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday, 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX minimum rates of wages for periods dependent upon the cost-of-living index figure for male and female workers and TO CANCEL minimum rates of wages for certain classes of indentured apprentices.

In accordance with regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act 1909 by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922 and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts 1909 and 1918 in Great Britain for the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade, as specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order 1926, hereby give notice:—

(1) That they propose to vary the minimum rates of wages for male and female workers set out in their Notice I (14) dated 22nd December 1922 for the cost-of-living periods specified therein by amending the definitions of certain of the classes of workers as specified in that notice.

(2) That they propose to cancel the minimum rates of wages for certain classes of indentured apprentices and other workers as specified in their Notice I (15) dated 22nd December, 1922, and

(3) That they propose to fix minimum rates of wages for male and female workers employed in those branches of trade included in the trade specified in the appendix to the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order 1926 and not included in the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order 1919.

Particulars of the minimum rates proposed to be varied, cancelled and fixed, are available for inspection at the address shown below or may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposal to vary, fix and cancel, which may be lodged with them within two months from 30th April, 1926. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922, and 1st April, 1926, the Trade Board established under that Act for the Laundry Trade in Great Britain HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that THEY PROPOSE TO VARY the Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed on time work, set out in Trade Board Notices W. ## PART V.

## DEFINITIONS AND APPLICABILITY OF RATES.

## SECTION I.

For the purpose of this Notice, the following expressions have the several meanings herein-after assigned to them, that is to say :—

(1) The expression "Trade Holidays" means for all classes of workers in the trade of whatever age and of both sexes :—

*either* (a) The days allowed as Holidays to women and young persons under Section 35 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901 ;

*or* (b) Such day, half day or half days as may be substituted as a holiday in lieu of any of the days specified in paragraph (a) above in the case of those workers who in fact work on one of the days specified in the said paragraph (a) and are granted another holiday or one or two half holidays in lieu thereof, whether the same be granted under and by virtue of the provisions of Section 35 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, or otherwise.

(2) The expression "the weekly short day" means :—

(a) In the case of workers to whom the Shop Acts apply, the day which under those Acts constitutes the weekly short day ;

(b) *Sunday*, in the case of those workers of the Jewish Religion who are usually employed on Sundays instead of Saturdays or such other day as may be substituted for Sunday whether under the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, or otherwise ;

(c) In all other cases *Saturday*, or such other day as may be substituted for Saturday, whether under the provisions of Section 43 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, or otherwise.

(3) The expression "the weekly day of rest" means "Saturdays" in the case of those workers of the Jewish Religion who are usually employed on Sundays instead of Saturdays whether under and by virtue of the provisions of Section 48 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, or otherwise. In all other cases the said expression means "Sundays."

(4) The expressions "Time-and-a-Quarter," "Time-and-a-Half" and "Double-Time" mean respectively, one-and-a-quarter times, one-and-a-half-times, and twice the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate otherwise applicable.

## SECTION II.

The Overtime Rates shall not apply to Piece-Workers.

## SECTION III.

The hours which Women, Young Persons, and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, of the Education Acts and of the Shop Acts.

## PART VI.

## APPLICATION OF PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

The above Proposed Overtime Rates of Wages shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Washhouse and General Inside Workers (not being workers wholly or mainly employed as Transport Workers, Enginemen or Stokers) and to all Female Workers who are employed on time-work in respect of all overtime (as defined above) during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919, as varied by certain other Orders as set out in the above-mentioned Notices W. (11), W. (13) and W. (15).

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 30th day of April, 1926. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Laundry Trade Board, (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 65).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Contraction of Certain Infected Area.*

1.—(1) The Foot - and - Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 62) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area (No. 6) described in the First Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the third day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

*Contraction of Certain Infected Area.*

2.—(1) The Foot - and - Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 63), as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 64), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area (No. 7) described in the Schedule to that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the fourth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

*Modification of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) (Temporary Modification of Restrictions) Order of 1926.*

3. The provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) (Temporary Modification of Restrictions) Order of 1926 and any Order amending the same which authorise movement direct to slaughterhouses in certain towns for the purpose of immediate slaughter, shall, on and after the fourth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, cease to

apply to the cities of Leeds, Sheffield and Wakefield, and the county boroughs of Huddersfield and Dewsbury, and shall apply only to the city of Kingston-upon-Hull and the county borough of Barnsley.
