The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army, the Militia, and the Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers of the Royal Air Force, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels.

6. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

7. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

8. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

9. Chairmen of County Councils, and all gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

10. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

11. All gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office or any other Government Department will adopt the same procedure, and will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

12. The names both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than ten days prior to the date of the Levée.

THE MILK DISTRIBUTION EMERGENCY (No. 3) ORDER, 1926. MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATION 3 OF THE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS, 1926.

The Board of Trade in exercise of the powers conferred upon them under Regulation 3 of the Emergency Regulations, 1926, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:—

1. No person who did not prior to the 3rd day of May, 1926, habitually send milk for sale wholesale to any place within the Metropolitan Police Area of London shall after the date of this Order send any milk for sale wholesale to any place within such Area.

2. This Order may be cited as The Milk Distribution Emergency (No. 3) Order, 1926.

## ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH MAY, 1926.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Authorisation of Landing of Pedigree Cattle from South Africa.*

1. The landing of the cattle described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby allowed, sub-

ject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

*Definition of Quarantine Station.*

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the cattle under this Order.

*Place of Landing.*

3. The cattle shall be landed at the Quay facing the River Itchen, situate at the south end of Southampton Docks, in the county borough of Southampton.

*Regulations Applicable to Animals before and on Landing.*

4.—(1) The cattle shall not be landed in Great Britain unless and until there are delivered to a proper officer of Customs and Excise the certificates and declarations prescribed by this Article, namely:—

(a) a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Union of South Africa to the effect that at the time of the shipment of the animals both the cattle and also the whole of the Union were free from foot-and-mouth disease, contagious pleuropneumonia and cattle-plague;

(b) a certificate signed by a duly qualified veterinary officer of the Union of South Africa to the effect that each of the animals was, within one month prior to the date of shipment, tested with tuberculin, and did not react. This certificate shall be accompanied by the temperature chart in respect of each animal.

(c) a certificate signed by the Secretary of the Friesland Herd Book of South Africa, or by some person authorised to act on his behalf, to the effect that the said cattle were at the time of shipment from the Union duly registered as pedigree stock in the Friesland Herd Book of South Africa;

(d) a statutory declaration from the shipper that the fodder and litter accompanying the cattle are products of the Union of South Africa;

(e) a statutory declaration from the Master of the Vessel in which the cattle are carried to Great Britain that during the whole of the voyage from South Africa no other cattle, sheep, goats, other ruminating animals or swine have been carried on the vessel; that no other fodder or litter for the use of any animal on the vessel has been shipped during the voyage to Great Britain at any port or place outside the Union of South Africa, and that whilst the said cattle were on board, the vessel did not enter a port in a prohibited country for the purposes of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

(2) The animals, before being landed, shall be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and if found by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease, shall forthwith be landed and moved by railway under the supervision of the Inspector from the place of landing to the Foreign Animals

Quarantine Station described in the Second Schedule hereto.

(3) The animals shall be detained in the said Quarantine Station until the expiration of a period of at least four calendar months from the date of shipment from the Union of South Africa: Provided that the period of detention of the cattle at the said Quarantine Station shall be not less than three calendar months from the date of their arrival therein.

(4) Whilst detained in the said Quarantine Station the animals shall be under the control of a Veterinary Inspector appointed by the Ministry.

(5) During such period of detention no other animals shall be moved into the said Quarantine Station, and the Animals landed under this Order shall be kept separate from all other animals.

(6) During such period of detention the animals and the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station hereby defined shall be subject to such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease.

(7) In the event of contagious pleuropneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, or cattle plague being found to exist during the prescribed period of detention in any animal referred to in this Order, the Ministry shall cause to be slaughtered all the animals in the consignment, and in the event of any such disease being suspected to exist in any such animal, the Ministry may cause the slaughter of such of the animals as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of diagnosis. No compensation shall be payable by the Ministry in respect of any animal slaughtered under this Order.

(8) The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries may, if he thinks fit, cause the tuberculin or any other test to be applied to the animals landed under this Order whilst they are detained in the said Quarantine Station.

*Disinfection of Vessel, etc.*

5. The vessel from which the animals are landed and the fittings, dung, fodder, litter and other things used for or about the animals, shall be disinfected or disposed of in accordance with such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows :—

*Amendment of Article 3 of the Markets, Sales and Lairs Order of 1925.*

1. Article 3 of the Markets, Sales and Lairs Order of 1925 is hereby revoked, and the following Article is substituted therefor :—

*"Cleansing and Disinfection of Markets, Saleyards and Lairs.*

3.—(1) Any market-place, fairground, highway, saleyard, or other premises in or upon which markets, fairs or sales of animals are habitually held and any lair adjoining such premises which is used for the reception or temporary detention of animals before or after their exposure for sale, shall, as soon as practicable after being used for any such purpose on any day and before being again so used, be cleansed and disinfected as follows :—



(i) The premises or lair or the parts thereof used for the purposes of the market, fair or sale shall be thoroughly scraped as far as practicable, and swept, then effectually cleansed by washing; and after such cleansing the said premises or lair or parts thereof shall be thoroughly washed with an approved disinfectant:—Provided that in the case of any such premises or lair which are incapable of being cleansed and disinfected in the aforesaid manner, such cleansing and disinfection shall be carried out as far as may be practicable.

(ii) All pens, hurdles, and other fittings used in or in connection with the market, fair, sale, or lair, shall as soon as practicable after being used for such purpose, and before being again so used, be thoroughly cleansed by scraping and washing. After such cleansing the pens, hurdles and other fittings so used shall be thoroughly washed with an approved disinfectant.

(iii) The scrapings and sweepings of the premises, lair, pens, hurdles and other fittings, and all dung, saw-dust, litter and other matter removed therefrom, shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with animals, or be effectually destroyed by fire.

(2) The cleansing and disinfection required by this Article shall, in the case of a market-place, fairground, saleyard or other premises

or lair in the occupation of any person, and any pens, hurdles and other fittings used in or in connection with such premises or lair, be carried out by and at the expense of that person, and in any other case be carried out by the Local Authority of the District.”

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

*Revocation.*

3. The Markets, Sales and Lairs Temporary Order of 1926 is hereby revoked.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as the MARKETS, SALES AND LAIRS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1926, and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS  
(DISINFECTATION) ORDER OF 1926.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Interpretation.*

1. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894;

“The Minister” and “the Ministry” mean the Minister and the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries respectively;

“Person” includes a body corporate;

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

*Use of a Prescribed Disinfectant.*

2.—(1) The provisions referred to in the Schedule hereto which relate to the use for disinfection of limewash or of a particular disinfectant, or of one of several disinfectants shall, after the commencement of this Order have effect as if, for the requirement of the use of limewash or disinfectant or disinfectants specified or described in such provisions, there were substituted a requirement of the use of one of the following disinfectants, hereinafter referred to as “an approved disinfectant” namely:—

(a) a five per cent. solution of standard phenol; or

(b) a disinfectant approved by the Minister for the purposes of this Order, if

used at the dilution at which such disinfectant is approved.

(2) Where under any Order mentioned in the Schedule hereto the disinfection is carried out by the use of an approved disinfectant, it shall not be necessary, notwithstanding any provision in the Order, to apply limewash to the place or thing disinfected.

*Labels to be affixed to approved disinfectant.*

3.—(1) Every receptacle containing an approved disinfectant shall before being placed on sale or delivered to a purchaser be clearly and distinctly labelled by the manufacturer or vendor thereof in a form approved by the Minister stating the dilution at which the disinfectant is approved by the Minister, and certifying either that the disinfectant consists of standard phenol or that the contents of the receptacle are of the same quality and composition as the sample submitted to the Government Chemist for examination and upon which the Minister's approval is based.

(2) A disinfectant contained in a receptacle marked with a label in the form required by this Article shall be deemed to be an approved disinfectant.

*Provision for Sampling of Disinfectants.*

4. Where under any Order of the Minister the use of an approved disinfectant is required, the person using the disinfectant shall, if so required by an Inspector of the Ministry or of a Local Authority furnish him with a sample of the disinfectant used, or permit him to take such sample, and shall furnish the Inspector with all such particulars as may be reasonably required as to the name or the composition of the disinfectant used.

*Offences.*

5. If any disinfectant which is not approved by the Minister is falsely marked with a statement or indication that it has been so approved, or if any disinfectant purporting to

be an approved disinfectant is not marked with a label as required by this Order, the manufacturer and the retailer or other person selling the disinfectant, and the person who shall have so marked the disinfectant or caused the same to be so marked, or who shall use the disinfectant knowing the same to have been falsely marked, or omitting so to mark the disinfectant, as the case may be, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Commencement.*

6. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

*Revocation.*

7. The Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Orders of 1906 and 1925, are hereby revoked.

*Short Title.*

8. This Order may be cited as the DISEASES OF ANIMALS (DISINFECTION) ORDER OF 1926.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.
