GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel, or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And whereas on the thirtieth day of April last, We did, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare by proclamation, in pursuance of the said Act, that a state of emergency existed:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that no such proclamation shall be in force for more than one month, without prejudice to the issue of another proclamation at or before the end of that period:

And whereas the continued cessation of work in Coal Mines does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy

Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-ninth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the Seventeenth year of Our Reign.

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction hospital stoppages for non-commissioned officers and men, Royal Marines, at the rate applicable to naval ratings.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS His Majesty The King and His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland have concluded a Convention to provide for and facilitate the reciprocal enjoyment by their respective subjects and citizens of the benefits of the legislation in force in Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and in Denmark respectively, in regard to compensation for accidents arising out of their employment:

And whereas effect cannot be given to the said Convention unless and until certain arrangements have been made by His Majesty's Government and by the Danish Government, which arrangements involve certain modifications of the law at present in force in Great Britain and Northern Ireland in regard to Workmen's Compensation:

And whereas it is provided by Section 37 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, that for the purpose of giving effect to any Convention with a Foreign State providing for reciprocity in matters relating to compensation to workmen for injuries by accident, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make provision—

(a) for modifying that Act, and the enactments regulating the payment of compensation to workmen for injuries by accident for the time being in force in Northern Ireland, in their application to cases affected by the said Convention, so, however, as not to alter the amount of compensation in any case to which those Acts may apply;

(b) for determining, in cases where rights to compensation accrue both under the Acts referred to in paragraph (a) hereof and under the law of the State with which the Convention is made, under the law of which country the workman shall be entitled to recover compensation;

(c) for conferring on county courts powers for the admission of evidence taken abroad and the procuring and taking of evidence for use abroad, or otherwise for the purpose of facilitating proceedings for the recovery of compensation under the respective laws of the two countries.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above-mentioned provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, and of any other powers vested in Him in that behalf, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe as follows:—

(1) The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, and the enactments regulating the payment of compensation to workmen for injuries by accident at present in force in Northern Ireland, hereinafter referred to as the Acts, shall in the case of workmen who are Danish subjects apply subject to the following modifications:—

(i) In all cases any question as to liability to pay compensation under the Acts to a Danish subject or as to the amount or duration of such compensation, including any question as to the amount payable in respect of the redemption of weekly payments, and in cases of death the amount payable to each dependant, shall be settled by an award of the County Court and in no other manner.

(ii) No Court fee shall be payable by a workman who is a Danish subject or by the dependants of such workman in respect of any proceedings under the Acts in the County Court by way of arbitration or otherwise in connection with the settlement of any claim or other matter arising under the Acts.

(iii) The Registrar of every County Court shall, not later than the 31st January in each year, send to the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in a form prescribed by him, a record of all judicial decisions given in the course of the preceding year under the Acts in the case of Danish subjects and the said Secretary of State shall cause such record to be communicated to the Ministry of Social Affairs in Denmark.

(iv) The power of making Rules under the Acts shall include a power to make such Rules as may be necessary for the purpose of carrying the said Convention or this Order into effect. Such Rules may include provisions authorising a County Court (a) to order the transfer to the appropriate Danish Authority of any compensation due under the Acts for the benefit of any British or Danish workman or dependants of such workman resident in Denmark, and (b) to receive and administer any compensation awarded under the Danish Accident Insurance Law for the benefit of any British or Danish workman or dependants of such workman resident in Great Britain or Northern Ireland.

(2) For the purpose of proceedings under the Acts by or on behalf of dependants of Danish workmen, such dependants being resident in Denmark, County Courts shall, notwithstanding anything in Section 17 of the County Courts Act, 1919, have power to issue Letters of Request for the examination of witnesses resident in Denmark and the duly authenticated statements of such witnesses in answer to any such Letter of Request shall be admissible in evidence in lieu of oral testimony by such witnesses.

(3) For the purpose of claims to compensation by the dependants of workmen who are British subjects under the Danish Accident Insurance Law, County Courts shall have power to examine on oath witnesses within the jurisdiction of such Courts and to reduce to writing and duly authenticate for transmission to Denmark the statements of witnesses so examined.

(4) In the application of this Order to Scotland "County Court" shall mean "Sheriff Court," and "Registrar of the County Court" shall mean "Sheriff Clerk," and "Rules" shall mean "Act of Sederunt."

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Hook, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield :

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hook is vested in Thomas Edmund Sotheron Estcourt, of Estcourt, Tetbury, in the County of Gloucester, a Captain Retired in Your Majesty’s Army, as estate owner subject together with other hereditaments to certain family charges but otherwise free from incumbrances, and the said Thomas Edmund Sotheron Estcourt is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant :

“ And whereas the said Thomas Edmund Sotheron Estcourt is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hook should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Sheffield for the time being :

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, now Bishop of Sheffield, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned :

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Hook which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parochial Chapelry of Hook :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Thomas Edmund Sotheron Estcourt, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has signed

this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hook shall be transferred to the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

COAL (EMERGENCY) SUPPLEMENTARY DIRECTIONS, 1926, DATED MAY 26TH, 1926, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS, 1926.

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regulations, 1926, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:—

1. The supply and acquisition of coal for consumption or otherwise in any domestic

premises, that is to say, in any dwelling house or in any building adjacent to or connected with a dwelling house and occupied or used as part thereof, or in any premises used or occupied for residential purposes, shall be subject to the provisions contained in these directions.

2. Save as is hereinafter expressly provided, no coal shall be supplied or acquired for consumption or otherwise in any domestic premises unless a permit in writing shall first have been issued by the local authority or its duly authorised officer, prescribing the quantity of coal that may be supplied and acquired, and specifying the premises for which and the person by whom such quantity may be acquired, and stating the period in respect of which the permit is issued.

3. No coal in excess of a total of one hundredweight shall be supplied or acquired under the provisions of the last preceding article during any period of two consecutive weeks, unless the local authority or its duly authorised officer shall certify that the supply and acquisition of a certain specified greater quantity is justified by exceptional circumstances and the nature of such exceptional circumstances is stated in writing upon the permit authorising such supply and acquisition.

4.—(a) Coal to an amount not exceeding twenty-eight pounds' weight in any one week may be supplied and acquired without permit for consumption in the domestic premises of the person by whom or on whose behalf the coal is acquired, provided that the coal is purchased at and taken away by the purchaser from the shop or other premises of the vendor.

(b) The supply and acquisition of coal under this article shall be alternative and not supplementary to any supply or acquisition of coal under the preceding articles of these directions.

5. The operation of Articles 3, 4, and 5 of the Coal (Emergency) Directions, 1926 (hereinafter called "the Principal Directions"), is hereby suspended until further notice, and these directions shall be substituted therefor during such suspension and shall be read with the principal directions as though they formed part thereof.

6. These directions may be cited as the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary Directions, 1926, and shall come into force on the 28th day of May, 1926.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF WRITING ASSISTANT (FEMALE) IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age are 16 and 17. For an examination beginning in one of the first six months of the year, the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the first of March; for an examination beginning in one of the last six months of the year, the governing date is the first of September. A candidate who attained the age

of 16 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 17 on that date would not be admitted. Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the daughters of fathers also natural-born British subjects:

Provided that exception may be made to the nationality rule in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. Candidates must be unmarried and will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. The subjects of examination are as follows, viz.:—

1. English.
2. Handwriting.
3. Spelling.
4. Arithmetic.
5. Geography.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of the candidates will, where possible, be respected. Candidates will be assigned, save in exceptional circumstances, only to offices within daily travelling distance of their places of residence.

6. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of ten shillings will be required from every candidate attending an examination.
