SHORES OR BANKS OF FISHGUARD BAY AT GOODWICK.

The Board of Trade hereby revoke the Order made by them on the 5th day of April, 1911, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of April, 1911, prohibiting the removal of shingle and ballast from the shores or banks of Fishguard Bay between a point 85 yards south of Goodwick Bridge and the southern embankment of Fishguard Harbour situate about 350 yards north of Goodwick Bridge at Goodwick.

SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT GOODWICK AND FISHGUARD. REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Cardigan to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of Fishguard Bay at Goodwick and Fishguard on the southern side of the East Breakwater in the Parishes of Llanwnda and Fishguard North in the County of Pembroke bounded on the Northern side by the straight line A.A. running in an easterly direction along the southern side of the East Breakwater and on the South-eastern side by the line B.B. running through Ogof Martha in a direction N.22° 30'E. True, but excluding therefrom the area within the lines drawn between the points C.D.E. and F. (all of which limits and reference letters are shown by red lines and letters on Ordnance Survey maps of the District as surveyed in 1906 (1907 Edition) which are deposited at the Board of Trade and at the Offices of the Fishguard Urban District Council and the Goodwick Urban District Council) these shores and banks being within the said Port.

Now the Board of Trade do hereby by this Order prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea within the limits above-mentioned.

IMPORTATION OF CARCASSES (PROHIBITION) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1926.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Power of Minister to issue Licences.

1. The Minister may attach to any licence issued under the powers conferred by Article 35 of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912, authorising any matter or thing prohibited by the Importation of Carcasses (Prohibition) Order of 1926 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), any conditions he may think fit for the purpose of preventing the introduction or spread of disease.

Restriction on Disposal of Imported Pigs' Bristles and Hair of Animals.

2. No pigs' bristles or hair of animals imported into Great Britain from the Continent of Europe, other than Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, before the date of operation of the Principal Order, shall be brought into contact with cattle, sheep, goats or other ruminating animals or swine in Great Britain, and all waste and residue thereof shall be burnt or otherwise effectively destroyed.

Offences.

3.—(1) If there is any breach of any condition attached to any licence mentioned in Article 1 of this Order by an owner of a part of a carcass or by an importer thereof, or by any person handling the same, or if any person causes, directs or permits any such breach, the owner, importer and person, shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts, or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any person does or fails to do any act in contravention of the provisions of Article 2 of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall take immediate effect.

5. This Order may be cited as the IMPORTATION OF CARCASSES (PROHIBITION) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1926.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

Inverness.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Topley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Topley and Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary. (Now in Force.)

NOTE.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.
