ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. (DATED 16TH JUNE, 1926.)

IMPORTATION OF CARCASES (PRO-HIBITION) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1926 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Power of Minister to issue Licences.

1. The Minister may attach to any licence issued under the powers conferred by Article 35 of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912, authorising any matter or thing prohibited by the Importation of Carcases (Prohibition) Order of 1926 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), any conditions he may think fit for the purpose of preventing the introduction or spread of disease.

Restrictions on Disposal of Imported Pigs' Bristles and Cow Hair.

2.—(1) Pigs' Bristles or cow hair landed in Great Britain from any country in Europe (except Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man), before the date of this Order and pigs' bristles and cow hair so landed under a licence mentioned in Article 1 of this Order after the date of this Order shall not whilst in Great Britain be brought into contact with

cattle, sheep, goats, other ruminating animals or swine, and all sweepings, and residue arising from the storage or manufacture of such bristles or hair shall be burnt or otherwise effectively destroyed.

- (2) Every importer or dealer in pigs' bristles or cow hair to which the preceding paragraph of this Article applies shall keep a Register, open to inspection by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority showing:—
 - (a) the quantity of pigs' bristles and/or cow hair on his premises or under his control at the date of this Order;
 - (b) the quantity of pigs' bristles and/or cow hair brought on to his premises or coming under his control from time to time after the date of this Order, the date when it was so brought on to his premises or under his control, and the name of the vendor and the address of the premises from which it was obtained. If brought direct from abroad, the quantity imported, the date and port of landing, and the country of origin shall be a sufficient entry under this paragraph;
 - (c) the quantity of pigs' bristles and/or cow hair sold from time to time after the date of this Order to any other person, the date of sale and the name and address of the purchaser.

Offences.

- 3.—(1) If there is any breach of any condition attached to any licence mentioned in Article 1 of this Order by an owner of a part of a carcase, or by an importer thereof, or by any person handling the same, or if any person causes, directs or permits any such breach, the owner, importer and person shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (2) If any person does, or fails to do, any act in contravention of the provisions of Article 2 of this Order he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

4. The Importation of Carcases (Prohibition) (Amendment) Order of 1926 is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall take immediate effect.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Carcases (Prohibition) (Amendment) Order of 1926 (No. 2).
