A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And whereas on the twenty-ninth day of May last, We did, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare by proclamation, in pursuance of the said Act, that a state of emergency existed:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that no such proclamation shall be in force for more than one month, without prejudice to the issue of another proclamation at or before the end of that period:

And whereas the continued cessation of work in Coal Mines does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy

Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this twenty-eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventeenth year of Our Reign.

EMERGENCY POWERS ACT, 1920.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of the Criminal Justice Act, 1925, power is given to try or retry a person at the court of assize or quarter sessions for a place other than that at which but for that section that person would have been tried or retried:

And whereas by subsection (3) of the said section His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such provisions as to the matters specified in the said subsection (3) as seem necessary or expedient for the purposes of the foregoing provisions of that section:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. Where in pursuance of the said section fourteen any person is to be tried or retried at the court of assize or quarter sessions for a place other than that at which but for that section he would have been tried or retried—
 - (a) the court shall have jurisdiction for all purposes connected with the trial as though the offence had been committed in the place for which the court is held;
 - (b) where judgment of death has been passed at any such trial or retrial, the sheriff who would, if the power given by the said section fourteen had not been exercised, have been charged with the execution of the judgment shall be charged with the execution of the judgment and may carry the judgment into execution in any prison which is the common gaol of his county or in which the convict was confined for the purpose of safe custody before his removal to the place where the court was held and shall, for the purposes of the execution, have the same jurisdiction in the prison and over the officers of the prison and be subject to the same responsibility and duties as though he were the sheriff of the place for which the assize was held within the meaning of the Sheriffs Act, 1887:

Provided that nothing in this Order shall affect the provisions of subsection (5) of section two of the Central Criminal Court (Prisons) Act, 1881;

- (c) all recognizances, inquisitions, depositions (including exhibits thereto) and documents shall be transmitted to the proper officer of the court at which the person is to be tried or retried;
- (d) any commissions, writs, precepts, indictments, recognizances, proceedings and documents may be altered so far as may be necessary for the purpose of giving effect to the said section fourteen and to this Order.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Assizes and Quarter Sessions (Convenient Court) Order, 1926.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of Section eighteen of the Finance Act, 1923, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

- (a) that any profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to Income Tax payable under the law in force in any foreign State; and
- (b) that arrangements, as specified in the declaration, have been made with the Government of that foreign State with a view to the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the foreign State;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British Income Tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the Income Tax payable in the foreign State, have the effect of law in the foreign State:

And whereas the Agreement set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made between His Majesty's Government and the Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

- (a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to the Income Tax payable under the law in force in the Netherlands; and
- (b) that the arrangements contained in the said Agreement between His Majesty's Government and the Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of shipping are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the Netherlands.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Shipping Profits (Netherlands) Declaration, 1926."

SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT AND THE GOVERNMENT OF HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN OF THE NETHERLANDS.

His Britannic Majesty's Government and the Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands, being desirous of concluding an agreement for the reciprocal exemption from income tax in certain cases of profits accruing from the business of shipping, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.

His Britannic Majesty's Government agree to take the necessary steps under Section 18 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1923, for exempting from income tax (including supertax) chargeable in Great Britain and Northern Ireland for the year of assessment, 1923-24, commencing on the 6th day of April, 1923, and every subsequent year of assessment, any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in the Netherlands or by a company managing and controlling such business in the Netherlands

Article 2.

The Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands hereby declare that, under the laws of the Netherlands relating to income tax (Wet op de Inkomstenbelasting, 1914, Wet van 19 December, 1914, Staatsblad no. 563), tax is not chargeable on any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in Great Britain and Northern Ireland or by a company managing and controlling such business in Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Article 3.

The Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the Netherlands hereby declare that, under the laws of the Netherlands relating to Dividend and Tantième Tax (Dividend en Tantièmebelasting), tax is not chargeable on dividends or other sums on account of profits distributed by a company carrying on the business of shipping and managing and controlling such business in Great Britain or Northern Ireland.

Article 4.

The expression "the business of shipping" means the business carried on by an owner of ships, and for the purpose of this definition the expression "owner" includes any charterer.

Article 5.

This agreement shall cease to have effect if and so soon as the relief to be granted under Article 1 hereof in respect of income tax in Great Britain and Northern Ireland ceases to have legal operation or the laws of the Netherlands cease to give the relief indicated in the declarations in the Articles 2 and 3.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 11th day of June, 1926 (N. 299/26), in the words following, viz.:—

- "Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been a Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:
- "And whereas we consider it desirable that a special rate of pay should be laid down for Pensioned Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers of Your Majesty's Navy who are, or may be, employed as Instructors to Your Majesty's Naval Volunteer Reserve:
- "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to direct, by Your Order in Council, that Pensioned Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers of Your Majesty's Navy employed as Instructors to Your Majesty's Naval Volunteer Reserve may receive pay at the inclusive rate of 11s. 6d. per diem in addition to their pensions, either (1) as from the date of appointment as such, if appointed on or after the 27th day of February, 1926; or (2) as from the 1st day of April, 1926, or as from the date of completing time for pension, whichever is the later, if appointed as such prior to the 27th day of February, 1926:
- "We beg leave further to recommend that where quarters are provided for such Instructors at the charge of Naval Funds, or where such Instructors are accommodated in any of Your Majesty's Ships or Naval Establishments, the above rate of pay may be subject to a reduction of 1s. 6d. per diem, and that where Instructors are victualled in any of Your Majesty's Naval Hospitals, the rate of pay may be subject to a deduction of the same amount as that laid down for Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Marine Police in Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of March, 1924:
- "We beg leave further to recommend that marriage allowance may be payable in respect of the wives and families of such Instructors at the rates, and under the conditions, applicable to other men of Your Majesty's Navy, but that no other pay, grant or allowance in the nature thereof may be payable to such Instructors.
- "The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the foregoing proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas it was further provided by proviso (b) to the said Article 2 that it should not be necessary for any person who at the date on which the said Order came into operation held a certificate of qualification from the Commissioners to obtain a new certificate cf qualification on being appointed either by transfer or promotion to a situation which, in the opinion of the Commissioners, was similar to the situation in respect of which he already held a certificate or might properly be filled in customary course of promotion from the class or grade of situation in respect of which the existing certificate was issued:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order by substituting a new proviso for the said proviso (b) to Article 2, and to provide that the said amendment shall operate as from the commencement of the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

The said Order shall have effect, and be deemed always to have had effect, as if the following proviso were therein substituted for proviso (b) to Article 2 thereof:

> "(b) It shall not be necessary for any person to whom at any time a certificate of qualification has been issued and who holds any situation, being either a situation in respect of which a certificate was issued or any other situation to which he was duly transferred or promoted from that situation without a certificate of qualification, to obtain a new certificate on being appointed either by transfer or promotion to a situation which, in the opinion of the Commissioners, is similar to or is such as is normally filled by appointment from the class or grade of the situation which he then holds."

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in His Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an

officer, seaman or marine shall be paid in such mamner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, as amended by Section 1 of the War Pensions. Act, 1920, it is enacted that there shall be transferred to the Minister of Pensions (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") certain powers and duties of the Admiralty with respect to pensions and grants to persons who have served as officers or men:

And whereas by Regulations annexed to an Order in Council of the 11th June, 1920, for the pensions of seamen and marines disabled, etc., in the Great War (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations of 1920") provision was made for the pensions of seamen and marines disabled in the Great War:

And whereas by Regulations annexed to an Order in Council of the 27th May, 1921 (hereinafter referred to as "the Former War Regulations") provision was made for the increase of pensions granted to seamen and marines in consequence of former wars:

And whereas by Regulations annexed to an Order in Council of the 12th October, 1925, provision was made for the re-assessment of the pensions of seamen and marines who, having been granted pre-war pensions, rejoined or re-enlisted during the Great War and suffered disability therein:

And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty by the Minister that it is desirable to make further provision with respect to the permanent pensions of certain classes of seamen and marines disabled in consequence of former wars, who served in the Great War:

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said proposals into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof and to sanction the provisions set forth in the Regulations hereto annexed.

REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO THE RE-ASSESS-MENT OF FORMER-WAR DISABILITY PENSIONS OF CERTAIN BRITISH SEAMEN AND MARINES WHO SERVED IN THE GREAT WAR.

- 1. A seaman or marine who was granted a pension before the 1st October, 1921, for a former-war disability which has not been reassessed under the Former War Regulations, may be granted, in lieu of the pension for his former-war disability, a pension assessed on his remaining degree of disablement at the rate shown in the First Schedule to the Regulations of 1920 with the additions set forth in Article 6 hereof.
- 2. A seaman or marine who was invalided before 4th August, 1914, in consequence of a former-war disability, and who had, prior to such invaliding,
 - (a) if a continuous service man of the Royal Navy, completed a total service of not less than 10 years on the continuous and general service system, and was in the opinion of the Minister prevented by such invaliding from completing time for long-service pension; or
 - (b) if a non-continuous service man of the Royal Navy, or if a marine, completed a total service of not less than 14 years, and was in the opinion of the Minister prevented by such invaliding from completing time for long-service pension;

may be granted, in lieu of any other pension in respect of his former-war disability, a pension at the rates shown in the First Schedule to the Regulations of 1920, and assessed on his remaining degree of disablement, and be granted in addition an allowance in respect of his service, calculated at the following rates:—

- 3. A seaman or marine, who was, prior to 4th August, 1914, certified to be suffering from a former-war disability and whose pension in respect thereof has been re-assessed under the provisions of the Order in Council of 7th February, 1921, revising rates of long-service pension, may be granted, in addition to such reassessed pension, a pension at the rate shown in the Schedule to the Regulations annexed to the Order in Council of the 14th January, 1919, for the pensions of seamen and marines disabled in the Great War (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations of 1919"), with the addition of 20 per cent. thereof, and assessed on his remaining degree of disablement.
- 4. A seaman or marine who fulfils the conditions of Article 2 of these Regulations as to service prior to invaliding and who, having sustained a former-war disability, continued to serve during the Great War, and was invalided before 1st October, 1921, whilst still suffering from his former-war disability, may receive, in lieu of any pension therefor or any allowance for service under any other Order in Council, a pension and allowance in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of these Regulations (as modified by Article 9 hereof): provided that, if he is eligible for a service pension under the said Order in Council of 7th February, 1921. he may receive, in lieu of any pension for his former-war disability, a pension at the rate shown in the Schedule to the Regulations of 1919 with the addition of 20 per cent. thereof, and assessed on his remaining degree of disablement.
- 5. No award shall be made or continued under the preceding Articles where the assessment on the remaining degree of disablement is less than 20 per cent. of total disablement, but, if the seaman or marine fulfils the conditions of Article 2 of these Regulations, he may be granted an allowance in respect of service calculated at the following rates:—

6. There may be added to the service allowance specified in the foregoing Articles additions for good conduct badges and medals at the rates and under the conditions set forth in the Order in Council of 7th February, 1921. Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers and Leading Rates of the Royal Navy and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines may receive the additions in respect of petty time at the rates and under the conditions set forth in the said Order in Council of 7th February, 1921.

7.—(1) A seaman or marine who, being in receipt of any service allowance under these Regulations, rejoins or re-enlists shall cease to draw such allowance.

(2) These Regulations shall apply only to seamen or marines who have rendered satisfactory service during the Great War, and who are not in receipt of a disablement pension under Article 1 of the Regulations of 1920.

(3) No seaman or marine shall be entitled to the benefit of these Regulations while in receipt of a pension by virtue of the Order in

Council of the 8th May, 1919.

8. Unless the context otherwise requires:-

(1) "Service" means service which is allowed to reckon for long-service pension under Clause (3) of the Schedule to the said Order in Council of 7th February, 1921.

(2) "Former-war disability" means a disability due directly and wholly to service in a war which occurred prior to the 4th August,

1914.

- (3) "Remaining degree of disablement" means the degree of disablement due to a former-war disability at the date of any assessment for the purposes of these Regulations.
- 9. The provisions of these Regulations shall take effect as from 1st April, 1919: provided that, in respect of the period 1st April, 1919, to 2nd September, 1919, inclusive, references to the First Schedule to the Regulations of 1920 shall mean the Schedule to the Regulations of 1919, with the addition of 20 per cent. thereof, and provided that no grant to a seaman or marine shall be re-assessed to his disadvantage.

10. The Minister shall be the sole interpreter of these Regulations and may issue such detailed instructions in reference thereto as he may from time to time deem necessary.

REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO THE RE-ASSESS-MENT OF CERTAIN INJURY PENSIONS OF BRITISH SEAMEN AND MARINES DISABLED IN CONSE-QUENCE OF FORMER WARS.

- 1. A seaman or marine who was invalided before 4th August, 1914, in consequence of wounds or injuries due directly and wholly to service in a former war and who had, prior to such invaliding—
 - (1) if a continuous service man of the Royal Navy, completed a total service of not less than 10 years on the continuous and general service system, and was in the opinion of the Minister prevented by such invaliding from completing time for long-service pension; or

(2) if a non-continuous service man of the Royal Navy, or if a marine, completed a total service of not less than 14 years, and was in the opinion of the Minister prevented by such invaliding from completing time for long-service pension;

and who is or may become qualified for an increase of pension under the Regulations attached to the Order in Council of 25th February, 1926 (hereinafter referred to as "the Pensions (Increase) Order in Council") may, if more beneficial to him, receive in lieu of the former pension so increased:—

(a) if the remaining degree of disablement is assessed at 20 per cent. or over—a pension assessed at the rate for the time being in force under Article 1 (1) of the Regulations annexed to the Order in Council of 11th June, 1920, for the pensions of seamen and marines disabled, etc., in the Great War, together with an allowance in respect of his service, calculated at the following rates:—

- 2. There may be added to the service allowance specified in the foregoing Article additions for good conduct badges and medals at the rates and under the conditions set forth in the Order in Council of 7th February, 1921, revising rates of long-service pension. Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers and Leading Rates of the Royal Navy and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines may receive the additions in respect of petty time at the rates and under the conditions set forth in the Order in Council of 7th February, 1921.
- 3. A seaman or marine to whom an award was made on the occasion of invaliding before 4th August, 1914, in respect of wounds or injuries due directly and wholly to service in a former war, who is or may become qualified for an increase of pension under the Pensions (Increase) Order in Council, and who had rendered sufficient service to qualify for a longservice pension may, if more beneficial to him, receive, in lieu of the pension so increased, a pension for service assessed under the said Order in Council of 7th February, 1921, and in addition, if the remaining degree of his disablement is assessed at 20 per cent. or over, a disablement pension under Article 1 (1) of the Regulations annexed to the Order in Council of 14th January, 1919, plus 20 per cent. of such rate.
- 4. Should an award under any of the preceding Articles of these Regulations on revision, either on account of a variation in the degree of disablement or of a fall in the cost of living, become less favourable than an award under the Pensions (Increase) Order in Council, it shall not be reduced below the rate applicable under the latter Order in Council.
- 5. No pension shall be increased by reassessment under these Regulations, by an amount greater than is sufficient to bring the total means of the pensioner up to £150 a year if unmarried, or £200 a year if married.
 - Unless the context otherwise requires:-
 - (1) "Service" means service which is allowed to reckon for long-service pension under Clause (3) of the Schedule to the said Order in Council of 7th February, 1921.
 - (2) "Remaining degree of disablement" means the degree of disablement (at the date of any assessment for the purpose of these Regulations), consequent upon a disability due directly and wholly to service in a war which occurred prior to 4th August, 1914.
- 7. The Minister shall be the sole interpreter of these Regulations, and may issue such detailed instructions in reference thereto as he may from time to time deem necessary.

1. This Order may be cited as the Portuguese

Tonnage Order, 1926.

2. Portuguese ships, the certificates of registry or other national papers of which are dated on or after the 5th July, 1924, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal in Silver to George Coleman, and the Edward Medal to John George Cordey and Samuel Graham, employed by the Newport Abercarn Black Vein Steam Coal Company Limited, in the following circumstances:-

On March 8th, 1926, in the course of operations at the North Celynen Colliery in Monmouthshire a fall of roof to the extent of twenty tons occurred almost completely burying two colliers who were at work. **Efforts** were made to erect timber supports over the buried men but great care and skill were necessary in order to avoid further falls. A second fall of five tons did, indeed, take place while Coleman, the District Ambulance man, was in the act of fixing a timber. He realised that this was essential to the protection of the buried men but remained to complete his task and was himself pinned down by the fall. was released after being buried for ten minutes and a further fall of ten tons occurred. Coleman with the help of Graham, Cordey and

three other men continued the work of rescue until Coleman was pinned down by a heap of earth, being so badly bruised that he could continue his task no longer. Both the buried men were eventually extricated alive but one of them unfortunately succumbed to his

Coleman was undoubtedly the outstanding figure in the rescue work. His persistent courage certainly saved the life of one of the entombed men and contributed largely to the rescue of the other. His risked his own life for over six hours in the work of rescue and displayed exceptional skill and bravery in all he did. Graham and Cordey both exhibited courage of a very high order. Their lives were in constant danger from the continuous falls and in addition to their bravery they gave a remarkable exhibition of coolness and determination.

No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulations Applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. The animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

Declaration of Further Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary. namely:-

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city to boundary. (Now in Force.)
