PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** by Section one hundred and four of the Explosives Act, 1875, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, declare that any substance which appears to His Majesty to be specially dangerous to life and property shall be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act:

And whereas, by Section fifty of the said Act, it is enacted that His Majesty may exempt from any provision of the said Act any explosive prescribed by Order in Council:

And whereas the provisions of Section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and declare, and be it ordered and declared, as follows:—

1. Picric acid when in process of manufacture shall (for whatever purpose used or manufactured) be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act, subject to the following exception:—

When the picric acid is mixed with not less than half its own weight of moisture in every process of manufacture, it shall not be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act.

2. Picric acid when kept, conveyed, imported or sold, shall (for whatever purpose used or manufactured) be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act, subject to the following exceptions:—

(a) Picric acid mixed with not less than half its own weight of water shall not be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act.

(b) Picric acid when the quantity does not exceed 1 lb. shall not be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act: provided

(i) such picric acid is so kept and conveyed as not to be liable, whether under the action of fire or otherwise, to come in contact with any substance specified in the First Schedule hereto, or with any fire or light capable of igniting such picric acid;

(ii) such picric acid when dry is contained in a package from which the contents cannot escape; and in the construction of which no metal other than aluminium or an alloy containing not less than 90 per cent. of aluminium is used;

(iii) each package is legibly marked "Picric acid";

(iv) if the picric acid is contained in glass bottles the stoppers shall not be of glass.

Picric acid when not subject to the above exemptions must be packed and marked as required by the Order of Secretary of State relating to the packing of explosives.

3. The mixtures of picric acid with other substances specified in the Second Schedule to this Order, shall not be deemed to be explosives within the meaning of the said Act when being kept or conveyed, subject to conditions set forth in the said Second Schedule.

4. Picrates and mixtures of picric acid with any other substances (for whatever purpose used or manufactured), shall be deemed to be explosives within the meaning of the said Act, subject to the following exception:—

A picrate mixed with not less than half its own weight of water, shall not be deemed to be an explosive within the meaning of the said Act.

This Order shall be deemed to be in lieu of the Order in Council relating to Picric Acid, Picrates and Mixtures of Picric Acid with other substances, dated the 27th March, 1905, as amended by the Orders in Council, dated the 16th February, 1906, and the 28th June, 1917; and the said Orders dated the 27th March, 1905, the 16th February, 1906, and the 28th June, 1917, are hereby repealed.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

Any of the following metals or metallic oxides, namely, lead, oxide of lead, oxide of iron, potash, baryta, lime, soda, oxide of zinc, oxide of copper; and any compound of such metal or oxide (other than a metallic sulphate); or any chlorate, nitrate, or other oxidising agent; or any other substance declared by an Order of the Secretary of State to be capable of forming with picric acid a dangerous compound.

Provided that this Schedule shall not be deemed to include any metal, or oxide unavoidably formed on any metal, used in the construction of any ship, boat or carriage, or contained in any paint, where the packages containing picric acid are protected from direct contact with such metal or paint.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

1. Picric acid thoroughly mixed with not less than three times its own weight of anhydrous sulphate of soda.

2. Picric acid thoroughly mixed with not less than three times its own weight of crystallised sulphate of soda when packed in hermetically closed packages.

3. Picric acid thoroughly mixed with not less than three times its own weight of potash alum.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870, 33 & 34 Vict., c. 52 to 1906, 6 Edw. VII, c. 15, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any

foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Convention was concluded on the 18th day of November 1925, between His Majesty and the Estonian Republic for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Convention is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India and the Esthonian Republic; having determined, by common consent, to conclude a convention for the extradition of criminals, have accordingly named as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:—

The Right Honourable Joseph Austen Chamberlain, M.P., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and

The Esthonian Republic:—

Dr. Oskar Kallas, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the Esthonian Republic at London;

Who, after having exhibited to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following articles:—

#### ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present convention, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 2, committed within the jurisdiction of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

#### ARTICLE 2.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences, provided that they are punishable under the law of both States by imprisonment with or without hard labour or some greater punishment:—

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.

2. Manslaughter.

3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.

4. Rape.

5. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge, of a girl under 14 years of age.

6. Indecent assault.

7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.

8. Child stealing, including abandoning, exposing or unlawfully detaining.

9. Abduction.

10. Procuration.

11. Bigamy.
12. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
13. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
14. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
15. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
16. Arson.
17. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny or embezzlement.
18. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company or fraudulent conversion.
19. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or feloniously obtained.
- 20.—(a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
- (b) Knowingly making without lawful authority any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm.
21. Forgery, or uttering what is forged.
22. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
23. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.
24. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.
25. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition crimes or offences.
26. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a crime or offence against the laws of both States.

The extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes or offences, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both High Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the law of both the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

#### ARTICLE 3.

Each Party reserves the right to refuse or grant the surrender of its own subjects or citizens to the other Party.

#### ARTICLE 4.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the State applied to, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination or under punishment in the State applied to for any other crime or offence, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

#### ARTICLE 5.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime or offence or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applying or applied to.

#### ARTICLE 6.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the crime or offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for a crime or offence of a political character.

#### ARTICLE 7.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in custody or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime or offence, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes or offences committed after the extradition.

#### ARTICLE 8.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime or offence had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

#### ARTICLE 9.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

#### ARTICLE 10.

A criminal fugitive may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any police magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority in either State, on such information or complaint and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime or offence had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two High Contracting Parties in which the magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority, exercises jurisdiction. He shall, in accordance with this article, be discharged if within the term of thirty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the diplomatic agent of the State claiming his extradition in accordance with the stipulations of this treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either State which may come into a port of the other.

## ARTICLE 11.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime or offence had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime or offence of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to; and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

## ARTICLE 12.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, or copies thereof, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant, or copy thereof, must purport to be signed by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State, or purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State to be a true copy thereof, as the case may require.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of, or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State.

In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated, either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other minister of the other State, or by any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the State to which the application for extradition is made.

## ARTICLE 13.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present convention should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed within their respective jurisdictions, his extradition shall be granted to the State whose claim is earliest in date, unless such claim is waived.

## ARTICLE 14.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

## ARTICLE 15.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, and any articles that may serve as a proof of the crime or offence shall be given up when the extradition takes place, in so far as this may be permitted by the law of the State granting the extradition.

## ARTICLE 16.

Each of the High Contracting Parties shall defray the expenses occasioned by the arrest within its territories, the detention, and the conveyance to its frontier, of the persons whom it may have consented to surrender in pursuance of the present convention.

## ARTICLE 17.

The stipulations of the present convention shall be applicable, so far as the laws permit, to all His Britannic Majesty's Dominions, except to the self-governing Dominions hereinafter named—that is to say, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State and Newfoundland—and India, provided always that the said stipulations shall be applicable to any of the above named Dominions or India in respect of which notice to that effect shall have been given on behalf of the Government of such Dominion or India by His Britannic Majesty's Representative at Tallin (Reval), and provided also that it shall be competent for either of the High Contracting Parties to terminate separately the application of this convention to any of the above named Dominions or India by a notice to that effect not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

## ARTICLE 18.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal, who has taken refuge in any of His Britannic Majesty's self-governing Dominions, Colonies, or Possessions to which this convention applies shall be made to the Governor-General, Governor, or chief authority, of such self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession by the appropriate consular officer of the Esthonian Republic.

Such requisition may be dealt with, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession will allow, to the provisions of this convention by the competent authorities of such self-governing Dominion, Colony or Possession, provided nevertheless that, if an order for the committal of the fugitive criminal to prison to await surrender shall be made, the said Governor-General, Governor, or Chief Authority, may, instead of issuing a warrant for the surrender of such fugitive criminal, refer the matter to His Britannic Majesty's Government.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed, as far as possible, by the rules laid down in the preceding articles of the present convention.



## ARTICLE 19.

It is understood that the stipulations of the two preceding articles apply in the same manner as if they were Possessions of His Britannic Majesty, to the following British Protectorates, that is to say, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Gambia Protectorate, Kenya Protectorate, Nigeria Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, Nyasaland, Sierra Leone Protectorate, Solomon Islands Protectorate, Somaliland Protectorate, Swaziland, Uganda Protectorate and Zanzibar.

It is also understood that if, after the signature of the present convention, it is considered advisable to extend its provisions to any British protectorates other than those mentioned above, or to any British-protected State, or to any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty, including the territories in respect of which mandates are being exercised on behalf of His Britannic Majesty by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand and the Government of the Union of South Africa, the stipulations of the two preceding articles shall be deemed to apply to such protectorates or States or mandated territories from the date prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

It is further understood that the provisions of the present convention which apply to British subjects shall be deemed also to apply to natives of any British protectorate or protected State or mandated territory to which the stipulations of the two preceding articles apply or shall hereafter apply.

## ARTICLE 20.

The present convention shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London, as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective plenipotentiaries have signed the convention and have affixed thereto their respective seals.

Done at London, the 18th day of November, in the year 1925.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged at London on the 11th day of May, 1926:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 12th day of July, 1926, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the Estonian Republic under and in accordance with the said Convention of the 18th November, 1925.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I of chapter 155 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

Provided further that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the self-governing Dominions hereinafter named, that is to say, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State and Newfoundland, and India, until notification shall have been made in the London Gazette that the Convention has been made applicable thereto, and that on such notification being made in respect of any such Dominion or India the said Acts shall apply in such Dominion or India in the case of the Estonian Republic under and in accordance with the said convention as from the date of the said notification.

This Order may be cited as the "Estonia (Extradition) Order in Council, 1926."

WHEREAS by the 88th Section of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted as follows:—

"Where in accordance with the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, Her Majesty exercises jurisdiction within any port, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to declare that port a Port of Registry and by the same or any subsequent Order in Council to declare the description of persons who are to be Registrars of British ships at that Port of Registry and to make regulations with respect to the Registry of British ships thereat":

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in and over the Protectorate of Kenya, and within all the ports thereof in accordance with the said Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that it is expedient to declare the port of Mombasa in the said Protectorate a Port of Registry, and to declare the description of persons who shall be Registrars of British ships thereat, and to make regulations with respect to the registry of British ships thereat:

And whereas the provisions of Section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him in this behalf by the hereinbefore recited Acts or some or one of them and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare and order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Kenya Protectorate Maritime Order in Council, 1926."

2. The Port of Mombasa in the Protectorate of Kenya shall be a Port of Registry for British ships.

3. The Registrar of British ships at the said port shall be such officer in the public service of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya as the Governor may from time to time appoint by writing signed by him and in default of such appointment shall be the Port Captain at the said port.

4. The Governor of Kenya may from time to time in case of the absence or intended absence from Mombasa or in case of the illness of the Registrar appoint by writing under his hand a fit person to be the deputy of the Registrar for the time therein mentioned and every such appointment shall be revocable at pleasure by the Governor by writing under his hand.

The person so appointed shall during the continuance of his appointment have all the power and authority of the Registrar.

5. The Registrar shall have and use a seal bearing such style and device as the Governor shall from time to time direct.

6. Every signature or seal affixed to any instrument purporting to be the signature or seal as the case may be of the Registrar shall for all purposes under this Order without any proof thereof be presumed to be genuine and shall be taken as genuine until the contrary is proved.

7. The Registrar of British ships at Mombasa shall have the same powers as any Registrar of British ships appointed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of the said Act and of this Order the said Registrar shall have the same powers as by the said Act are conferred for the purposes of registration and measurement on any officer of Customs or any officer of the Board of Trade.

8. The Governor shall with regard to the performance of any act or thing relating to the registry of a ship registered at Mombasa, or of any interest therein, be considered as in all respects occupying the place of the Commissioners of Customs.

9. In cases where it appears to the Commissioners of Customs or to the Governor or other person administering the Government of any British possession, that, by reason of special circumstances, it would be desirable that permission should be granted to any British ship to pass without being previously registered from any port or place in His Majesty's dominions to the port of Mombasa in the Protectorate of Kenya, it shall be lawful for such Commissioners or Governor or other person to grant a pass accordingly, and such pass shall for the time and within the limits therein mentioned have the same effect as a certificate of registry.

10. Where it appears to the Governor that by reason of special circumstances it would be desirable that permission should be granted to any British ship, to pass without being previously registered from the port of Mombasa to any port within His Majesty's dominions

the Governor may grant a pass accordingly and such pass shall for the time and within the limits therein mentioned have the same effect as a Certificate of Registry.

11. Fees not exceeding the amounts named in the Schedule to this Order shall be taken in respect of the matters mentioned in the said Schedule, but the Governor-in-Council shall have power to prescribe for lower fees being taken.

12. All fees authorised to be taken under this Order shall be applied to general revenue.

**WHEREAS** by the 88th Section of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted as follows:—"Where in accordance with the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, Her

Majesty exercises jurisdiction within any port, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to declare that port a Port of Registry and by the same or any subsequent Order in Council, to declare the description of persons who are to be Registrars of British ships at that Port of Registry and to make regulations with respect to the registry of British ships thereat":

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in and over the Protectorate of Zanzibar, and within all the ports thereof in accordance with the said Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that it is expedient to declare the port of Zanzibar in the said Protectorate a Port of Registry, and to declare the description of persons who shall be Registrars of British ships thereat, and to make regulations with respect to the registry of British ships thereat:

And whereas the provisions of Section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him in this behalf by the hereinbefore recited Acts or some or one of them and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare and order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Zanzibar Maritime Order in Council, 1926."

2. The Port of Zanzibar in the Protectorate of Zanzibar shall be a Port of Registry for British Ships.

3. The Registrar of British Ships at the said port shall be such officer in the Public Service of the Protectorate as the British Resident may from time to time appoint by writing signed by him and in default of such appointment shall be the Port Officer at the said Port.

4. The British Resident at Zanzibar may from time to time in case of the absence or intended absence from Zanzibar or in case of illness of the Registrar appoint by writing under his hand a fit person to be the deputy of the Registrar for the time therein mentioned and every such appointment shall be revocable at pleasure by the British Resident by writing under his hand.

The person so appointed shall during the continuance of his appointment have all the power and authority of the Registrar.

5. The Registrar shall have and use a seal bearing such style and device as the British Resident shall from time to time direct.

6. Every signature or seal affixed to any instrument purporting to be the signature or seal as the case may be of the Registrar shall for all purposes under this Order without any proof thereof be presumed to be genuine and shall be taken as genuine until the contrary is proved.

7. The Registrar of Shipping at Zanzibar shall have the same powers as any Registrar of Shipping appointed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of the said Act and of this Order the said Registrar shall have the same powers as by the same Act are conferred for the purposes of registration and measurement on any officer of Customs or any officer of the Board of Trade.

8. The British Resident shall with regard to the performance of any act or thing relating to the registry of a ship registered at Zanzibar, or of any interest therein, be considered as in all respects occupying the place of the Commissioners of Customs.

9. In cases where it appears to the Commissioners of Customs or to the Governor or other person administering the Government of any British possession, that, by reason of special circumstances, it would be desirable that permission should be granted to any British ship to pass without being previously registered, from any port or place in His Majesty's dominions to the port of Zanzibar, in the Protectorate of Zanzibar, it should be lawful for such Commissioners or Governor or other person to grant a pass accordingly, and such pass shall for the time and within the limits therein mentioned have the same effect as a certificate of registry.

10. Where it appears to the British Resident that by reason of special circumstances it would be desirable that permission should be granted to any British ship to pass without being previously registered from the port of Zanzibar to any port within His Majesty's dominions the British Resident may grant a pass accordingly and such pass shall for the time and within the limits therein mentioned have the same effect as a Certificate of Registry.

11. Fees not exceeding the amounts named in the Schedule to this Order shall be taken in respect of the matters mentioned in the said Schedule but the British Resident shall have power to prescribe for lower fees being taken.

12. All fees authorised to be taken under this Order shall be applied to general revenue.

“ And whereas the said perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £150 has been so appointed, granted and confirmed as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a yearly sum of £150 to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

*Authorisation of Landing of Pedigree Swine from Canada*

1. The landing of the swine described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

*Definition of Quarantine Station.*

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the swine under this Order.

*Regulations Applicable to Animals before and on Landing.*

3.—(1) The swine shall not be landed in Great Britain unless and until there are delivered to a proper officer of Customs and Excise the certificates and declarations prescribed by this Article, namely:—

(a) a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Dominion of Canada to the effect that at the time of the shipment of the animals the swine showed no

evidence of foot-and-mouth disease and swine-fever, and that the whole of the Dominion was free from foot-and-mouth disease and cattle-plague;

(b) a certificate signed by the Secretary of the Canadian Swine Breeders' Association, or by some person authorised to act on his behalf, to the effect that the said swine were at the time of shipment from the Dominion duly registered as pedigree stock in the Canadian Swine Breeders' Record;

(c) a statutory declaration from the shipper that the fodder and litter accompanying the swine are products of the Dominion of Canada;

(d) a statutory declaration from the Master of the Vessel in which the swine are carried to Great Britain that during the whole of the voyage from Canada no cattle, sheep, goats, other ruminating animals or swine have been carried on the vessel from any port except cattle loaded at a port in Canada for shipment to Great Britain; that the swine have been kept separate from all other animals during the voyage; that no other fodder or litter for the use of any animal on the vessel has been shipped during the voyage to Great Britain at any port or place outside the Dominion of Canada, and that whilst the said swine were on board, the vessel did not enter a port in a prohibited country for the purposes of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910 or any Order amending it.

(2) The swine, before being landed, shall be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and if found by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease, shall forthwith be landed and moved under the super-

vision of the Inspector from the place of landing to the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station described in the Second Schedule hereto.

(3) The animals shall be detained in the said Quarantine Station until the expiration of a period of twenty days after their arrival therein.

(4) Whilst detained in the said Quarantine Station the animals shall be under the control of a Veterinary Inspector appointed by the Ministry.

(5) During such period of detention no other animals shall be moved into the said Quarantine Station, and the animals landed under this Order shall be kept separate from all other animals.

(6) During such period of detention the animals and the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station hereby defined shall be subject to such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease.

(7) In the event of foot-and-mouth disease, swine fever or cattle plague being found to exist during the prescribed period of detention in any animal referred to in this Order, the Ministry shall cause to be slaughtered all the animals in the consignment, and in the event of any such disease being suspected to exist in any such animal, the Ministry may cause the slaughter of such of the animals as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of diagnosis. No compensation shall be payable by the Ministry in respect of any animal slaughtered under this Order.

*Disinfection of Vessel, etc.*

4. The vessel from which the animals are landed and the fittings, dung, fodder, litter and other things used for or about the animals, shall be disinfected or disposed of in accordance with such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry.

#### SUTTON COLDFIELD ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).

(The Supply of electricity by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Sutton Coldfield within part of the parish of Great Barr in the rural district of Walsall and part of the parish of Shenstone in the rural district of Lichfield both in the County of Stafford.)

3. To exclude from incorporation some or all of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, or to incorporate the same with such modifications and exceptions as may be indicated in the Order.

4. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, and enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

5. To prescribe the maximum price that may be demanded and taken by the Corporation in respect of the supply of electricity within the parts of the parishes to be added by the Order to the area of supply of the Undertakers under the Order of 1899.

6. The streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time are:—

Parish of Great Barr in the rural district of Walsall—Featherstone Road, Foley Road, from All Saints Church to the Shenstone parish boundary, Hardwick Road from Featherstone Road to the Shenstone parish boundary, Manor Road from Middleton Road to the Shenstone parish boundary, Middleton Road.

Parish of Shenstone in the rural district of Lichfield—Burnett Road, Foley Road, from Thornhill Road to the Great Barr parish boundary, Hardwick Road from Streetly Lane to the Great Barr parish boundary, Highbury Road, Leslie Road, Roman Road, from Streetly Lane to Park Road, Park Road, Rosemary Hill Road, from Streetly Lane to Walsall Road, Thornhill Road, from Manor Road to Streetly Lane.

7. To authorise the Corporation to open and break up the following streets and parts of

streets in the said extended area of supply which are not repairable by the local authority viz.:—

Parish of Great Barr in the rural district of Walsall:—

Main roads:—

Old Chester Road, Queslett Road, Thornhill Road.

Other Road:—

Featherstone Road.

Parish of Shenstone in the rural district of Lichfield:—

Main Roads:—

Blake Street, Lichfield Road, Rosemary Hill Road, Thornhill Road, Walsall Road.

Other Roads:—

Burnett Road, Highbury Road, Keepers Road, Leslie Road, Park Road, Roman Road, the bridge carrying Thornhill Road and Hardwick Road over the Sutton Coldfield and Walsall branch of the London Midland and Scottish Railway.

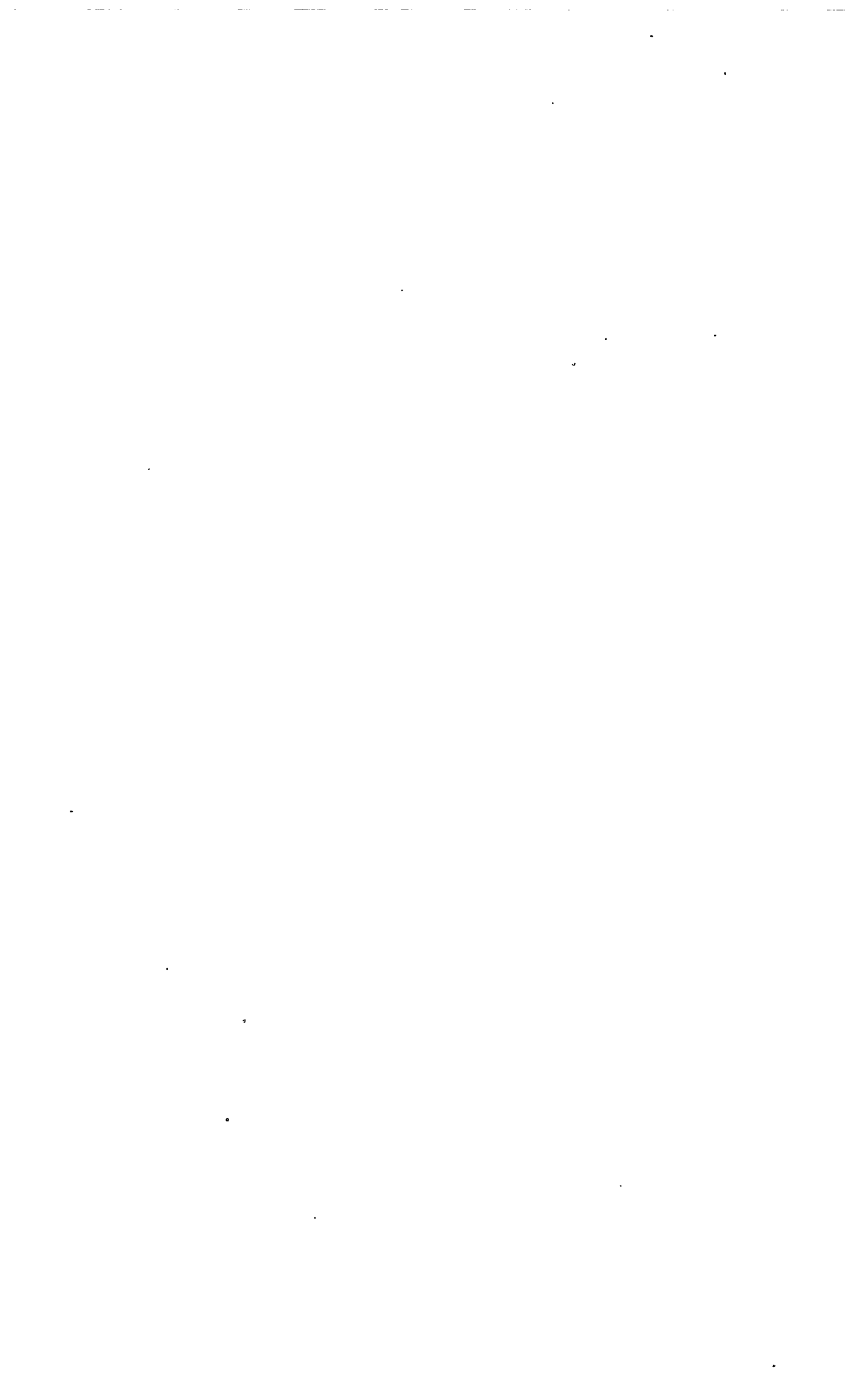
