WHEREAS by a Protocol signed, on July 14th, 1925, on behalf of His Majesty and His Majesty the King of Siam provision was made for the cessation and determination of the system of jurisdiction heretofore established in Siam for British subjects and the privileges, exemptions and immunities now enjoyed by British subjects in Siam:

And whereas it was further provided by the said Protocol that for the period therein prescribed the jurisdiction of His Majesty's diplomatic and consular officials in Siam should continue for the purpose of trying cases evoked from the Siamese Courts in accordance with the said Protocol, and of executing any judgments which may be rendered therein:

And whereas accordingly by Treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of the King of Siam:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913 (53 & 54 Vict. c. 37 and 3 & 4 Geo. 5 c. 16), or

otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Siam Order in Council, 1926," and shall be read as one with the "Siam Order in Council, 1914" (S.R. & O. 1914, No. 1474), in this Order referred to as "the Principal Order."

2. Articles 4, 5, 9, 11 and 32 (i) of the Principal Order are hereby repealed, and the following provisions are respectively substituted therefor:—

"Article 4.—The provisions of this Order shall not operate except with respect to:—

"(i) Cases which have been transferred by an exercise of the right of evocation in accordance with the Protocol printed in the schedule hereto from any Siamese Court to the Court established under this Order; and

"(ii) Non-contentious business in relation to the probate of wills and the administration of the estates of deceased British subjects who were registered in Siam as British subjects on or before the 10th day of March, 1909; but subject thereto shall extend to the persons and matters following, in so far as by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means, His Majesty has jurisdiction in Siam in relation to such matters and things, that is to say:—

"(1) British subjects, as herein defined, within the limits of this Order.

"(2) The property and all personal or proprietary rights and liabilities in Siam of British subjects, whether such subjects are within the said limits or not.

"(3) Siamese subjects and foreigners in the cases and according to the conditions specified in this Order, and not otherwise.

"(4) Foreigners, with respect to whom any State, King, Chief or Government, whose subjects or under whose protection they are, has by any Treaty as herein defined or otherwise agreed with His Majesty for, or consents to, the exercise of power or authority by His Majesty.

"(5) British ships with their boats, and the persons and property on board thereof, or belonging thereto, being within the Siamese dominions."

"Article 5.—All His Majesty's jurisdiction exercisable in Siam for the hearing and determination of civil matters or civil or criminal cases, or for the maintenance of order, or for the control or administration of persons or property or in relation thereto, shall be exercised under and according to the provisions of this Order and not otherwise."

"Article 9.—Subject to the provisions of this Order, criminal and civil cases may be tried by the Court itself, or by the Court with a jury or with assessors."

"Article 11.—Where a case is transferred to the Court from a Siamese Court, the Court shall give such directions as seem proper for its determination, having regard to the proceedings (if any) in the Siamese Court. In determining such case, the Court shall apply English law and practice for the time being, except that, as to all matters coming within the scope of codes or laws of the Kingdom of Siam regularly promulgated and in force, the texts of which have been communicated to His Majesty's Legation, such Siamese codes or laws shall be applied."

"Article 32.—(i) Where any case in which a Siamese or foreigner is plaintiff or complainant is transferred to the Court from any Siamese Court, the Court shall hear and determine the case in all respects according to the ordinary course of the Court."

3. Every male resident British subject of the age of 21 years or upwards, having a competent knowledge of the English language, and having or earning a gross income of such amount as may be determined by Rules of Court, and not having been attainted of treason or felony, or convicted of any crime that is infamous (unless he has obtained a free pardon), or being under outlawry, shall be qualified to serve on a jury.

4. The Schedule hereto is hereby substituted for the Schedule to the Principal Order.

5. Where a British subject is accused of the commission of an offence the cognizance whereof appertains to the Court, and it is expedient that the offence be inquired of, tried, determined, and punished in a British possession, the accused may (under the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, Section 6) be sent for trial to the Straits Settlements.

The Court may, where it appears so expedient, by warrant under the seal of the Court, cause the accused to be sent for trial to the Straits Settlements accordingly.

The warrant shall be sufficient authority to any person to whom it is directed to receive and detain the person therein named, and to carry him to and deliver him up to the Straits Settlements.

Where any person is to be so sent to the Straits Settlements, the Court before which he is charged shall take the preliminary examination, and shall bind over such of the proper witnesses as are British subjects in their own recognizances to appear and give evidence on the trial.

6.—(1) Where an offender is sentenced to imprisonment, and the Court thinks it expedient that the sentence be carried into effect within His Majesty's dominions, and the offender is accordingly under Section 7 of the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, sent for imprisonment to a place in His Majesty's dominions, the place shall be either Singapore, Rangoon or Calcutta, or a place in some other part of His Majesty's dominions out of the United Kingdom, the Government whereof consents that offenders may be sent thither under this Article.

(2) The Court may, by warrant under the seal of the Court, cause the offender to be sent to Singapore, Rangoon or Calcutta, or such other place as aforesaid, in order that the sentence may be there carried into effect accordingly.

(3) The warrant shall be sufficient authority to any person to whom it is directed to receive and detain the person therein named and to carry him to and deliver him up at the place named, according to the warrant.

7. Where any person is sentenced by the Court to suffer the punishment of death, the Court shall forthwith send a report of the sentence, with a copy of the Minutes of Proceedings and notes of evidence in the case, and with any observations it thinks fit, to the Minister.

The sentence shall not be carried into execution without the direction of the Minister in writing under his hand.

If the Minister does not direct that the sentence of death be carried into execution, he shall direct what punishment in lieu of the punishment of death is to be inflicted on the person convicted, and the person convicted shall be liable to be so punished accordingly.

8.—(1) The Court may report to the Secretary of State or to the Minister, as the case may be, recommending a mitigation or remission of any punishment awarded by the Court, and thereupon the punishment may be mitigated or remitted by the Secretary of State or Minister.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall affect His Majesty's prerogative of pardon.

9. Nothing in this Order shall deprive the Court of the power of hearing and determining any matter which may be pending before it at the date of this Order.

10. Where any civil matter or case is, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, pending before the Court and it is expedient that such civil matter or case be inquired of, tried and determined in a British possession, the Court may (under the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, Section 9) direct that such civil matter or case be inquired of, tried and determined in the Straits Settlements.

Any judgment, decree or order made by the Courts of the Straits Settlements shall be en-

forced and executed as if such judgment, decree or order had been made by the Court for Siam.

SCHEDULE.

PROTOCOL CONCERNING JURISDICTION APPLICABLE IN THE KINGDOM OF SIAM TO BRITISH SUBJECTS AND OTHERS ENTITLED TO BRITISH PROTECTION.

At the moment of proceeding this day to the signature of the General Treaty between His Britannic Majesty and His Majesty the King of Siam, the plenipotentiaries of the two high contracting parties have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.

The system of jurisdiction heretofore established in Siam for British subjects and the privileges, exemptions and immunities now enjoyed by British subjects in Siam as a part or, or appurtenant to the said system, shall absolutely cease and determine on the date of the exchange of ratifications of the above-mentioned treaty, and thereafter all British subjects, corporations, companies and associations, and all British-protected persons in Siam shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the Siamese courts.

Article 2.

Until the promulgation and putting into force of all the Siamese codes, namely, the Penal Code, the Civil and Commercial Code, the Codes of Procedure and the Law for Organisation of Courts, and for a period of five years thereafter, but no longer, His Britannic Majesty, through His diplomatic and consular officials in Siam, whenever in His discretion He deems it proper so to do in the interest of justice, may, by means of a written requisition addressed to the judge or judges of the court in which such case is pending, evoke any case pending in any Siamese court, except the Supreme or Dika Court, in which a British subject, corporation, company or association, or a British-protected person is defendant or accused.

Such case shall then be transferred to the said diplomatic or consular official for adjudication, and the jurisdiction of the Siamese courts over such case shall thereupon cease. Any case so evoked shall be disposed of by the said diplomatic or consular official in accordance with English law, except that as to all matters coming within the scope of codes or laws of the Kingdom of Siam regularly promulgated and in force, the texts of which have been communicated to the British Legation in Bangkok, the rights and liabilities of the parties shall be determined by Siamese law.

For the purpose of trying such cases and of executing any judgments which may be rendered therein, the jurisdiction of the said diplomatic and consular officials in Siam is continued.

Should His Britannic Majesty perceive, within a reasonable time after the promulgation thereof, any objection to the said codes, namely, the Penal Code, the Civil and Commercial Code, the Codes of Procedure and the Law for Organisation of Courts, the Siamese Government will endeavour to take such objections into account.

Article 3.

Appeals from judgments of Courts of First Instance in cases to which British subjects, corporations, companies or associations, or British-protected persons may be parties shall be adjudged by the Court of Appeal at Bangkok.

An appeal on a question of law shall lie from the Court of Appeal at Bangkok to the Supreme or Dika Court.

A British subject, corporation, company or association, or British-protected person, who is defendant or accused in any case arising in the provinces, may apply for a change of venue, and should the court consider such change desirable the trial shall take place either at Bangkok or before the judge in whose court the case would be tried at Bangkok.

The provisions of this article shall remain in force so long as the right of evocation continues to exist in accordance with article 2.

Article 4.

In order to prevent difficulties which may arise from the transfer of jurisdiction contemplated by the present protocol, it is agreed as follows:—

(a) All cases instituted subsequently to the date of the exchange of ratifications of the above-mentioned treaty shall be entered and decided in the Siamese courts, whether the cause of action arose before or after the date of said exchange of ratifications.

(b) All cases pending before the diplomatic and consular officials of His Britannic Majesty in Siam on the said date shall take their usual course before such officials until such cases have been finally disposed of, and the jurisdiction of the said diplomatic and consular officials shall remain in full force for this purpose.

In connection with any case coming before the said diplomatic or consular officials under clause (b) of this article, or which may be evoked by the said officials under article 2, the Siamese authorities shall upon request by such diplomatic or consular officials lend their assistance in all matters pertaining to the case.

In witness whereof the undersigned plenipotentiaries have signed the present protocol and affixed thereto their seals.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Leyton, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that borough either with or without any adjoining or other place and also of any officer of that authority;

And whereas sections 214 and 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, section 1 of the School Boards Act, 1885, and section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882;

And whereas section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an urban district council is constituted or included in a borough all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by attaching to or vested in that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of that Act or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the council of such borough;

And whereas the Urban District of Leyton, in the administrative county of Essex, comprises the Parishes of Cann Hall and Leyton, and is an urban district for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council of Leyton are the local authority;

And whereas it is proposed by a charter of incorporation to create the Urban District of Leyton a municipal borough to incorporate its inhabitants and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts;

And whereas by virtue of an Order in Council, dated the 3rd day of May, 1888, the Urban District Council of Leyton are the Burial Board for their district;

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Urban District of Leyton was constituted a parliamentary borough and returns two members to serve in Parliament;

And whereas in pursuance of the Education Act, 1921, the Urban District Council are a

local education authority for elementary education, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was approved by the Board of Education on the 11th day of September, 1903, and an amending Scheme was approved by the Board of Education on the 9th day of April, 1920;

And whereas the Urban District Council on the 29th day of July, 1924, under Part IV of the Education Act, 1921, made Byelaws with respect to School Attendance which were allowed by the Board of Education on the 17th day of October, 1924, and such Byelaws now apply to the Urban District;

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf;

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the School Boards Act, 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1. (1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Leyton Scheme, 1926.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

"The appointed day" means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Leyton;

"The Borough" means the Municipal Borough of Leyton;

"The Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

"The District" means the existing Urban District of Leyton;

"The District Council" means the existing Urban District Council of Leyton;

"The Municipal Corporations Acts" means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

"Duties" includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty or for punishing the breach of any duty;

"Liabilities" includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would but for this Scheme be liable whether accruing before, on or after the appointed day;

"Local Authority" means a local authority as defined in section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

"Powers" includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;

"Property" includes all property, real and personal and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in to and out of property real and personal, including things in action and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS, ETC. OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3. (1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this Article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the council of a borough containing according to the census of 1881 or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the council of a borough in relation to the appointment of a watch committee, a police force or special constables, or the levy of a watch rate under Part IX of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC. OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4. (1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties including those under any local Act, provisional order or order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council for the benefit of the District shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme—

(1) All property or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities incurred in the execution of an Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the Council of a borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of the Borough.

6. On the appointed day the district fund of the District shall be closed, and any balance which is then standing to the credit or to the debit of that fund shall be transferred to the credit or to the debit of the district fund of the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed;

(c) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as a burial board as immediately before the appointed day are owing shall by virtue of this Scheme be charged upon the borough fund and borough rate of the Borough.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this article or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

8. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the unrepealed provisions of—

(a) The local Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme and the Confirmation Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Scheme so far as the last-mentioned Acts respectively relate to the Provisional Orders specified in that Schedule; and

(b) Any other local Act or Provisional Order duly confirmed and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present session of Parliament);

as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(2) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Provisional Order—

(a) to the Leyton Local Board or the Leyton Urban District Council shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) to the Local Government District of Leyton or the Urban District of Leyton shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

9. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the district enure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS.

10. (1) The provisions of—

(a) the Baths and Wash-houses Acts, 1846 to 1925;

(b) the Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890;

(c) the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890;

(d) the Private Street Works Act, 1892;

(e) the Public Libraries Acts, 1892 to 1919;

(f) the Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts, 1899 to 1923; and

(g) the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, Part II—Sections 21, 22, 23 and 38. Part III—Sections 34, 35, 36, 49, 50, 51. Part IV—Sections 56, 59 and 62. Part V. Part VII—Sections 85 and 86. Part VIII and Part X—Section 93

shall be in force within and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1925, as shall have been adopted by the District Council and shall be in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall be in force within and apply to the Borough.

BURIAL ACTS 1852 TO 1906.

11. (1) The Order in Council dated the 3rd day of May, 1888, providing that the Leyton Local Board shall be a burial board for their district in accordance with section 3 of the Burial Act, 1857, shall have effect—

(a) as if the Corporation were substituted therein for the Leyton Local Board and the Borough for the district of the Leyton Local Board; and

(b) as if that Order in Council had been made under section 1 of the Burial Act, 1854, and had invested the Corporation with powers of providing requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of the parishes within the Borough and the Corporation had become a burial board for that purpose.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, as apply to a town council acting as a burial board shall extend to the Corporation acting as a burial board and the expenses of the Corporation in the execution of those Acts shall accordingly be chargeable upon and paid out of the borough fund and borough rate of the Borough.

BYELAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

12. (1) All byelaws which are in force in the Urban District, and which were confirmed by the Local Government Board before the First day of January, 1900, shall cease to be in force within any part of the Borough.

(2) Any reference to the Leyton Local Board or the Leyton Urban District Council in—

(a) any byelaw, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments or scale of charges; or

(b) any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority

which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (1) of this article applies to the Local Government District of Leyton or the Urban District of Leyton shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

13. Any byelaws made by the County Council of Essex under section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, or section 6 of the Locomotives Act, 1898, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District shall until the 1st day of January, 1929, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those byelaws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the byelaws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by byelaws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

14. (1) The Schemes relating to the constitution of an education committee of the District Council which were respectively approved by the Board of Education on the 11th day of September, 1903, and the 9th day of April, 1920, shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect as if—

(a) references to the Corporation and the Borough were substituted for references to the Leyton Urban District Council and the Urban District of Leyton; and

(b) a reference to the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November were substituted for the reference to the annual meeting of the District Council.

(2) The members of the education committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the appointed day shall be deemed to have been appointed under the said Schemes by the Council of the Borough.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

15. (1) In case any officer who was employed by the District Council immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than one year shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority or Education Authority (as the case may be) for

the Borough and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and sub-sections (1) to (7) inclusive of that section shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council," "this Scheme" for "this Act", and "Minister of Health" for "the Treasury", and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable thereto.

(2) The expression in sub-section (1) of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, "the Acts and Rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service" shall mean the Acts and Rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service which were in operation at the date of the passing of the Local Government Act, 1888.

(3) Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years after the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the Corporation.

(4) Provided also that the term "officer" in this Article shall include only persons employed by the District Council as aforesaid whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons.

(5) Provided also that no officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(6) In computing the time of service in any capacity of any officer for the purpose of determining the compensation to which he is entitled under this Article the Corporation shall take into account all the service of any such officer (after the attainment of the age of 17 years) in any capacity under any Local Authority whether such officer has been appointed annually or otherwise.

(7) The Corporation may, in their discretion and in consideration of the fact that any officer was appointed to his office as a specially qualified person, or of the fact that he had prior to his appointment served as a deputy, assistant, or clerk to any officer not holding a temporary appointment, add to the number of years which such officer would otherwise be entitled to reckon for the purpose of computing the compensation to which he would be entitled under the Acts and Rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service, as applied by this Scheme,—

(a) if the officer's age on the date of the confirmation of this Scheme is fifty-five years or more, any number of years not exceeding the number by which his age at that date falls short of sixty-five;

(b) if the officer's age at that date is less than fifty-five years, any number of years not exceeding ten.

(8) The foregoing provisions of this Article shall apply to a teacher employed in a Public Elementary School, maintained by the Local

Education Authority at the commencement of this Scheme, as if he were an officer employed by the Authority, provided that in the case of a teacher employed in a Public Elementary School maintained but not provided by the Authority the said provisions shall only apply if such teacher be discharged by the Authority or by the direction or with the consent of the Authority (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme, provided also that in the application of Sub-Section (7) of Section 120 of the Local Government Act 1888, in the case of a teacher to whom a compensation allowance has been granted in pursuance of this Sub-Section, service in a Public Elementary School maintained but not provided by a Local Authority shall be deemed to be service in an office under that Authority.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

16. (1) The accounts of the District Council and of their committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be audited by the district auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the district auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

17. (1) The District Council shall by the levy of a rate liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day and all other sums then due to the District Council may be recovered by the Corporation.

18. (1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate or shall prejudicially affect or prevent the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council or any contract, deed, bond, agreement or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council or their predecessors:

Provided that—

(a) Any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if instead of that Council (or their predecessors) the Corporation had been a party thereto.

(2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

19. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary or affect any right, interest or jurisdiction in or over any charitable endowment.

20. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

21. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all Assessments, Orders, Apportionments, Notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done

before the appointed day by, or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, done, entered into, or done by, or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council and may be proceeded on, or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Ilford, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that Borough either with or without any adjoining or other place and also of any officer of that authority;

And whereas sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, section 1 of the School Boards Act, 1885, and section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882;

And whereas section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an Urban District Council is constituted or included in a Borough all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by attaching to or vested in that Council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of that Act or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the Council of such Borough;

And whereas the Urban District of Ilford in the administrative County of Essex comprises the Parish of Ilford and is an urban district for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council of Ilford are the local authority;

And whereas it is proposed by a Charter of Incorporation to create the Urban District of Ilford a municipal borough to incorporate its inhabitants, and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts;

And whereas by virtue of a resolution passed at a meeting of the Ilford Urban District Council held on the 22nd January, 1895, the Urban District Council of Ilford became the Burial Board for their district as from the 25th March, 1895;

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Urban District of Ilford was constituted a Parliamentary Borough and returns one member to serve in Parliament;

And whereas in pursuance of the Education Act, 1921, the Urban District Council are a local education authority for elementary education; and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was approved by the Board of Education on the 17th day of April, 1905;

And whereas the Urban District Council on the 28th day of July, 1925, under Part IV of the Education Act, 1921, made Byelaws with respect to School Attendance which were allowed by the Board of Education on the 24th day of November, 1925, and such Byelaws now apply to the Urban District;

And whereas this scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf;

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the School Boards Act, 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1. (1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Ilford Scheme, 1926.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

“The appointed day” means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Ilford;

“The Borough” means the Municipal Borough of Ilford;

“The Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

“The District” means the existing Urban District of Ilford;

“The District Council” mean the existing Urban District Council of Ilford;

“The Municipal Corporations Acts” means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

“Duties” includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty or for punishing the breach of any duty;

“Liabilities” includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would but for this Scheme be liable whether accruing before, on or after the appointed day;

“Local Authority” means a local authority as defined in section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

“Powers” includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;

“Property” includes all property, real and personal and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in to and out of property real and personal, including things in action and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS, ETC. OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3. (1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the Local Authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the Council of a Borough containing according to the census of 1881 or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the Council of a Borough in relation to the appointment of a watch committee, a police force or special constables, or the levy of a watch rate under Part IX of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC. OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4. (1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist, and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties, including those under any local Act, Provisional Order, or Order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council for the benefit of the district shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council shall, on the appointed day by virtue of this Scheme, be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities incurred in the execution of an

Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the Council of a Borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the district shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the district shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of the Borough.

6. On the appointed day the district fund of the district shall be closed, and any balance which is then standing to the credit or to the debit of that fund shall be transferred to the credit or to the debit of the district fund of the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a Borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed;

(c) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as a burial board as immediately before the appointed day are owing shall by virtue of this Scheme be charged upon the borough fund and borough rate of the Borough.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this article or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme, the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

8. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the unrepealed provisions of—

(a) The Local Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme and the Confirmation Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule

to this Scheme so far as the last mentioned Acts respectively relate to the Provisional Orders specified in that Schedule; and

(b) Any other local Act or Provisional Order duly confirmed and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present Session of Parliament);

as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(2) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Provisional Order—

(a) to the Ilford Local Board or the Ilford Urban District Council shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) to the Local Government District of Ilford or the Urban District of Ilford shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

9. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the district enure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS.

10. (1) The provisions of—

(a) the Baths and Wash-houses Acts, 1846 to 1925;

(b) the Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890;

(c) the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890 (Parts II and III);

(d) the Private Street Works Act, 1892;

(e) the Public Libraries Acts, 1892 to 1919;

(f) the Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts, 1899 to 1923;

(g) the Notification of Births Act, 1907; and

(h) the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, Sections 17, 21, 23, 28, 33, 45, 49, 51, 62, 63, 85, 86, 90, 92, 93, 94 and 95; shall be in force within and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

BURIAL ACTS, 1852 TO 1906.

11. (1) All the powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council under or by virtue of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, as apply to a Town Council acting as a Burial Board, shall extend to the Corporation acting as a Burial Board, and the expenses of the Corporation in the execution of those Acts shall accordingly be chargeable upon and paid out of the borough fund and borough rate of the Borough.

(b) any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority; which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(2) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (1) of this article applies to the Local Government District of Ilford or the Urban District of Ilford shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

13. Any byelaws made by the County Council of Essex under section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, or section 6 of the Locomotives Act, 1898, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the district shall, until the 1st day of January, 1929, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those byelaws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the byelaws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by byelaws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

14. (1) The hereinbefore recited Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee of the District Council shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect as if—

(a) references to the Corporation and the Borough were substituted for references to the Ilford Urban District Council and the Urban District of Ilford; and

(b) a reference to the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the Ninth day of November were substituted for the reference to the annual meeting of the District Council.

(2) The members of the Education Committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the appointed day shall be deemed to have been appointed under the said Scheme by the Council of the Borough.

15. The said recited School Attendance Byelaws made under the Education Act in force in the Urban District at the commencement of this Scheme shall apply to the Borough until revoked or altered by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

16. (1) In case any officer of the District Council who shall have been employed by such Council immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than one year shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of, or under the control of, the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority or Education Authority (as the case may be) for the Borough, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and sub-sections (1) to

(7) inclusive of that section shall apply as if they formed part of this scheme, with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council," "this scheme" for "this Act," and "Minister of Health" for "the Treasury," and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable thereto.

(2) The expression in sub-section (1) of section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, "the Acts and Rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service" shall mean the Acts and Rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service which were in operation at the date of the passing of the Local Government Act, 1888.

(3) Provided nevertheless that if any such officer (after the attainment of the age of 17 years) be so employed by the Corporation, he shall, if his services are dispensed with or if his salary is reduced by the Corporation within four years after the commencement of this Scheme, because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(4) Provided also that the term "officer" in this Article shall include only persons employed by the District Council as aforesaid whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons.

(5) The Corporation may, in their discretion and in consideration of the fact that any officer was appointed to his office as a specially qualified person, or of the fact that he had prior to his appointment served as a deputy, assistant, or clerk to any officer not holding a temporary appointment, add to the number of years which such officer would otherwise be entitled to reckon for the purpose of computing the compensation to which he would be entitled under the Acts and Rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service, as applied by this Scheme—

(a) if the officer's age on the date of the confirmation of this Scheme is fifty-five years or more, any number of years not exceeding the number by which his age at that date falls short of sixty-five;

(b) if the officer's age at that date is less than fifty-five years, any number of years not exceeding ten.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Twickenham, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that borough, either with or without any adjoining or other place and also of any officer of that authority:

And whereas sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, section 1 of the School Boards Act, 1885, and section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to Schemes made under section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an urban district council is constituted or included in a borough, all the powers, rights, duties capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by attaching to or vested in that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of that Act or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the council of such borough:

And whereas the Urban District of Twickenham in the administrative county of Middlesex, comprises the parish of Twickenham, and is an urban district for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council of Twickenham are the local authority:

And whereas it is proposed by a charter of incorporation to create the Urban District of Twickenham a municipal borough to incorporate its inhabitants and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers for that purpose contained in section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Urban District Council of Twickenham are the Burial Board for their district:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Urban Districts of Twickenham and Heston and Isleworth were constituted a parliamentary division and return one member to serve in Parliament:

And whereas in pursuance of the Education Act, 1921, the Urban District Council are a local education authority for elementary

education, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was approved by the Board of Education on the 27th day of May, 1903:

And whereas the District Council on the 25th day of April, 1912, under Section 74 of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, as amended by the Education Acts, 1876 to 1907, made Byelaws with respect to school attendance which were allowed by the Board of Education on the 1st day of October, 1912, and such Byelaws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the School Boards Act, 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1. (1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Twickenham Scheme, 1926.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

"The appointed day" means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Twickenham;

"The Borough" means the Municipal Borough of Twickenham;

"The Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

"The District" means the existing Urban District of Twickenham;

"The District Council" means the existing Urban District Council of Twickenham;

"The Municipal Corporations Acts" means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

"Duties" includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty or for punishing the breach of any duty;

"Liabilities" includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would but for this Scheme be liable whether accruing before, on, or after the appointed day;

"Local Authority" means a local authority as defined in section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

"Powers" includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;

"Property" includes all property, real and personal and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in to and out of property real and personal, including things in action and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS, ETC. OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3. (1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the council of a borough containing according to the census of 1881 or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the council of a borough in relation to the appointment of a watch committee, a police force or special constables, or the levy of a watch rate under Part IX. of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities in relation to (a) the appointment of Analysts under the Acts relating to the Sale of Food and Drugs or (b) the execution of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, or (c) Gas Meters or (d) Weights and Measures, but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and be attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of Middlesex and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the matters mentioned above form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a Borough.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS ETC. OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4. (1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties including those under any local Act, provisional order or order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attached to the District Council for the benefit of the District shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme—

(1) All property or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council shall on the appointed day by virtue of this

Scheme be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities incurred in the execution of an Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the council of a borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of the Borough.

6. On the appointed day the district fund of the District shall be closed, and any balance which is then standing to the credit or to the debit of that fund shall be transferred to the credit or to the debit of the district fund of the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed;

(c) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as a burial board as immediately before the appointed day are owing shall by virtue of this Scheme be charged upon the borough fund and borough rate of the Borough.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this article or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

8. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the unrepealed provisions of—

(a) The local Act mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme and the Confirmation Act mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Scheme so far as the last-mentioned Act relates to the Provisional Order specified in that Schedule, and

(b) Any other local Act or Provisional Order duly confirmed and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present session of Parliament);

as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(2) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Provisional Order—

(a) to the Twickenham Local Board or the Twickenham Urban District Council shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) to the Local Government District of Twickenham or the Urban District of Twickenham shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

9. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the district enure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS.

10. (1) The provisions of—

(a) the Baths and Wash-houses Acts, 1846 to 1925;

(b) the Museums and Gymnasiums Act, 1891;

(c) the Private Street Works Act, 1892;

(d) the Public Libraries Acts, 1892 to 1919;

(e) the Notification of Births Act, 1907;

(f) the Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts, 1899 to 1923; and

(g) the Local Government and Other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

shall be in force within and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough, subject, however, as regards the Act last mentioned to the modifications made by the Middlesex Local Authorities' Joint Superannuation Scheme, 1924.

(2) Such of the provisions of—

(a) the Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890;

(b) the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890; and

(c) the Public Health Act, 1925;

as shall have been adopted by the District Council and shall be in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall be in force within and apply to the Borough.

BURIAL ACTS, 1852 TO 1906.

11. (1) All the powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are

exercisable by or attach to the District Council under or by virtue of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, as apply to a town council acting as a burial board shall extend to the Corporation acting as a burial board and the expenses of the Corporation in the execution of those Acts shall accordingly be chargeable upon and paid out of the borough fund and borough rate of the Borough.

BYE-LAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

12. (1) All bye-laws which are in force in the Urban District, and which were confirmed by the Local Government Board before the 1st day of January, 1900, shall cease to be in force in any part of the Borough;

(2) Any reference to the Twickenham Local Board or the Twickenham Urban District Council in—

(a) any bye-law, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments or scale of charges, or

(b) any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (1) of this article applies to the Local Government District of Twickenham or the Urban District of Twickenham shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

13. Any bye-laws made by the County Council of Middlesex under section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, or section 6 of the Locomotives Act, 1898, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District shall until the 1st day of January, 1929, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those bye-laws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the bye-laws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by bye-laws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

14. (1) The hereinbefore recited Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee of the District Council shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect as if references to the Corporation and the Borough were substituted for references to the Twickenham Urban District Council and the Urban District of Twickenham.

(2) The members of the Education Committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Borough Council under the said Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee and shall hold office until the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November, 1926.

15. The said recited School Attendance bye-laws made under the Education Acts in force in the Urban District at the commencement of this Scheme shall apply to the Borough until revoked or altered by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

16. (1) In case any officer of the District Council who was employed by such Council immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than five years shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority or Education Authority (as the case may be) for the Borough and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 120 of the Local Government Act 1888 and the following sub-sections of that section shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme:—

Sub-sections (1) to (6) inclusive with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council," "this Scheme" for "this Act" and "Minister of Health" for "the Treasury," and with such other modifications as be necessary to make them applicable hereto: Provided that the expression in sub-section (1) of that section "the Acts and Rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service" shall mean the Acts and Rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service which were in operation at the date of the passing of the Local Government Act 1888.

Sub-section (7) with the substitution of the words "under the Borough Council or any other Borough Council or under any County Council, District Council or other Local Authority" for the words "under the same or any other County Council," and "this Scheme" for "this Act" and with such other modifications as are necessary to make the Sub-section applicable hereto.

(2) Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the Corporation, he shall, if his services are dispensed with or if his salary is reduced by the Corporation within four years after the commencement of this Scheme, because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(3) The compensation payable under this Scheme to an officer who immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme held two or more offices under any Local Authority or Authorities and who devoted the whole of his time to the duties of such offices shall not be reduced by reason of the fact that he has devoted only part of his time to each of such offices.

(4) In computing the time of service in any capacity of any officer for the purpose of determining the compensation to which he is entitled under this Section the Corporation shall take into account all the service of any such officer (after the attainment of the age of 17 years), in any capacity under any Local Authority as defined as aforesaid whether such officer has been appointed annually or otherwise.

(5) If any officer was temporarily absent from his employment during the war whilst serving in His Majesty's Forces or the Forces of the Allied or Associated Powers either compulsorily or with the sanction or permission of the Local Authority such period of temporary absence shall be reckoned as service under the Local Authority in whose employment he was immediately before and after such temporary absence, provided that in the case of an officer who after the Armistice voluntarily extended his term of service in the Forces, no period of absence during such extension shall be so reckoned.

(6) No officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(7) The Corporation may in their discretion and in consideration of the fact that any officer was appointed to his office as a specially qualified person or of the fact that he had prior to his appointment served as a deputy assistant or clerk to any officer not holding a temporary appointment add to the number of years which such officer would otherwise be entitled to reckon for the purpose of computing the compensation to which he would be entitled under the Acts and Rules relating to Her Majesty's Civil Service as applied by this Scheme:—

(a) if the officer's age on the date of the confirmation of this scheme is fifty-five years or more, any number of years not exceeding the number by which his age at that date falls short of sixty-five;

(b) if the officer's age at that date is less than fifty-five years, any number of years not exceeding ten.

(8) Provided also that the term "officer" shall include only persons employed by the District Council as aforesaid whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month or whose employment is determinable on not less than one month's notice and no other persons.

(9) Provided also that in the application of Sub-section (7) of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, in the case of a teacher to whom a compensation allowance has been granted in pursuance of this Sub-section, service in a public elementary school maintained but not provided by a Local Authority shall be deemed to be service in an office under that Authority.

(10) The foregoing provisions of this clause shall apply to a teacher employed in any public elementary school at the commencement of this Scheme within the aforesaid district as if he were an officer employed by the District Council provided that in the case of a teacher employed in a non-provided school the said provisions shall only apply if such teacher be discharged by the Corporation or by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

17. (1) The accounts of the District Council and of their committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be

audited by the district auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the district auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

18. (1) The District Council shall by the levy of a rate liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day and all other sums then due to the District Council may be recovered by the Corporation.

19. (1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate or shall prejudicially affect or prevent the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council or any contract, deed, bond, agreement or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council or their predecessors:

Provided that—

(a) Any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if instead of that Council (or their predecessors) the Corporation had been a party thereto.

(2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

20. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary or affect any right, interest or jurisdiction in or over any charitable endowment.

21. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

22. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all Assessments, Orders, Apportionments, Notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the appointed day by, or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, done, entered into, or done by, or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council and may be proceeded on, or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.
