**WHEREAS** by Section 2 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, it is enacted that the several Articles named or described in the Schedule (A) to that Act shall be deemed Poisons within the meaning of that Act, and that the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain may, from time to time, by Resolution, declare that any Article in such Resolution named ought to be deemed a Poison within the meaning of that Act, and that thereupon the said Society shall submit the same for the approval of the Privy Council; and that if such approval shall be given, then such Resolution and approval shall be advertised in the *London Gazette*; and, on the expiration of one month from such advertisement, the Article named in such Resolution shall be deemed to be a Poison within the meaning of that Act:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, it is enacted that Schedule (A) to the Pharmacy Act, 1868, be repealed, and the Schedule to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, substituted therefor, and that the said last-named Schedule may be

amended by adding thereto or removing therefrom any Article in the manner provided by Section 2 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868:

And whereas the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain did on the 5th day of May, 1926, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them by the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, resolve and declare as follows:—

“That by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, the said Council doth hereby resolve and declare that the Schedule to the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, ought to be amended in manner following, that is to say:—

“In the entry in Part I. relating to Arsenic after the word ‘preparations’ add ‘except preparations for use exclusively in agriculture or horticulture for the destruction of insects, fungi or bacteria or as a sheep wash or sheep dip if the preparations are:—

(1) contained in a closed package or vessel distinctly labelled with a notice of the special purpose for which the preparation is intended; and

(2) sold upon an order in writing given by or on behalf of a person, firm or body corporate known to the vendor; and

(3) purchased for the purpose of the trade or profession of such person, firm or body corporate.’

"Delete from Part I. the following words, 'Tobacco: any preparations or admixtures of (other than Tobacco prepared for smoking and snuff) containing the poisonous alkaloids of Tobacco,' and insert:— 'Tobacco: any preparations or admixtures containing the poisonous alkaloids of Tobacco other than

'(a) Tobacco prepared for smoking and snuff; and

'(b) Preparations or admixtures of Tobacco for use exclusively in agriculture or horticulture for the destruction of insects, fungi and bacteria if the preparations are:—

'(1) contained in a closed package or vessel distinctly labelled with a notice of the special purpose for which the preparation is intended; and

'(2) sold upon an order in writing given by or on behalf of a person, firm or body corporate known to the vendor; and

'(3) purchased for the purpose of the trade or profession of such person, firm or body corporate.' "

And whereas the said Society have submitted their Resolution for the approval of the Privy Council, and the Lords of the Privy Council are of opinion that the said Resolution should be approved:

Now, therefore, Their Lordships are hereby pleased to signify their approval of the said Resolution.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF GEOLOGISTS IN THE GEOLOGICAL SURVEY OF GREAT BRITAIN AND THE MUSEUM OF PRACTICAL GEOLOGY.

(Under the Committee of the Privy Council for Scientific and Industrial Research.)

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held from time to time when occasion arises.

I. Candidates must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 30 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served for two full consecutive years in the Royal Irish Constabulary may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

(c) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. No person will be eligible for appointment who is not a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between the 4th August 1914 and the 11th November 1918.

3. Until further order preference will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces in the Great War.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. The Committee of the Privy Council will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the Survey and

Museum who, after examining the candidates' credentials and a personal interview or such other means as the Director considers suitable, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for any of the existing or prospective vacancies to the Lord President of the Council for nomination. Candidates thus nominated shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in their opinion fits them for the post. Candidates thus recommended and approved may at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners be submitted to a qualifying examination in English, Arithmetic and General Knowledge.

8. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

Until further order, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates whose choice of occupation is limited by a physical impairment due to the War but not of such a nature as to interfere with the discharge of any of the duties of the post.

9. Candidates who have been approved by the Civil Service Commissioners and who, if required to take the qualifying examination, have passed that examination, will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department, who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment.

The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidates' work whether at school, at the University, in the Forces or otherwise.

11. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate admitted thereto will be required to pay a fee of £3. A Selected Candidate will be required to pay a fee of £8, towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

##### *Restriction of Movement from Royal Agricultural Society's Show at Reading.*

1. No animal shall be moved out of the Show Ground of the Royal Agricultural Society situate partly in the county borough of Reading and partly in the county of Oxford, except with a licence granted by an Inspector or other officer of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, and then only to some suitable premises approved by the Inspector of the Ministry and subject to such conditions as the Minister considers necessary or expedient for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease, and are inserted in the licence.

2. No licence shall be required under the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 in respect of any animal being moved from the Show with a licence under this Order.

3. The term "animal" in this Order means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

4. If an animal is moved or otherwise dealt with in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of a licence granted thereunder, the

owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925.

**THE IMPORTATION OF CARCASES (PROHIBITION) ORDER, 1926.**

**B**Y virtue of the power and authority in me in that behalf vested by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, do hereby order as follows:—

(1) On and after the date hereof, it shall be unlawful to land in the Isle of Man a carcase brought from any country on the Continent of Europe other than Great Britain or Ireland, except in pursuance of a licence issued by the Government Secretary or the Chief Clerk, Government Office, authorising such landing.

(2) This Order shall not apply to:—

(a) Fully cured bacon and ham, lard or rendered fat, cooked or preserved meats or meat essences;

(b) Hides and skins which have been dried, dry-salted or wet-salted; but hides or skins which have been wet-salted shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Government of the country in which the port of shipment is situated to the effect that he is satisfied that the hides or skins have been wet-salted for a period of fourteen days. Such certificate shall be delivered by the master of the vessel or his representative to the Police Officer in charge of the Police Station at the port of landing.

(3) In this Order "carcase" means the carcase of any cattle, sheep, pigs or goats, and includes part of a carcase, and the meat, hides,

skins, hair, bones, bone meal, hoofs, hoof meal, horns, horn meal, offal, blood, dried blood or blood meal, or any other part of a carcase separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof.

(4) If any carcase or part of a carcase is landed in this Island in contravention of this Order the owner thereof and the importer and the occupier of the place of landing and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed shall each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults be deemed guilty of an offence against the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts.

(5) This Order may be cited as "The Importation of Carcases (Prohibition) Order, 1926."
