WHEREAS by Section 9 of the Weights and Measures Act, 1904 (4 Edw. VII Ch. 28), it is provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to specify new fees to be paid in respect of the Verification and Stamping of Weights, Measures and Weighing and Measuring instruments in substitution for the fees specified in the First Schedule of the Weights and Measures Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict., Ch. 21), and that any Order in Council so made may be varied or reveked by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas it is provided by subsection 2 of Section 3 of the Weights and Measures (Amendment) Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, Ch. 8), that the aforesaid power of His Majesty shall include and be deemed always to have included the power of specifying fees to be paid whether or not the weighing or measuring apparatus is found correct or is stamped :

And whereas His Majesty, by Order in Council dated 26th day of April, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920, No. 685), directed that the fees specified in the Schedule to that Order should be taken in substitution for the fees specified in the Schedules to Orders in Council dated the 19th day of July, 1918, and the 11th day of July, 1919: And whereas the Board of Trade have represented to His Majesty that it would be expedient to specify new fees to be paid upon the Verification and Stamping of Weights, Measures and Weighing and Measuring, Instruments:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, tc order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Verification and Stamping Fees) Order, 1926, and shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1926. 2. The Order in Council dated 26th April,

2. The Order in Council dated 26th April. 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920, No. 685), is hereby revoked.

3. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto to be paid in respect of the verification and stamping of weights, measures, weighing or measuring instruments, shall be substituted for the fees specified in the first Schedule to the Weights and Measures Act, 1889.

4. The fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall likewise be paid in respect of any weight, measure or weighing or measuring instrument which on verification is found to be incorrect. or defective.

5. No fee shall be payable in respect of any weight, measure or weighing or measuring instrument voluntarily submitted to an Inspector for re-verification, provided that at the time of such submission, it bears a stamp of verification (which has not been defaced or obliterated in pursuance of the Weights and Measures Regulations, 1907, S.R. & O. 1907, .5116

No. 698, or of any other Regulations made in substitution therefor) and has not been altered, repaired or adjusted since the date of the previous verification.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms :-

"We, William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows :-

"There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or United Rectory of North Lew with Ashbury the Parish of North Lew whereof contains a population of 730 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 200 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of North Lew with Ashbury is £612 or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the United Rectory of Halwill and Beaworthy. The Parish of Beaworthy contains a population of 253 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 100 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Halwill and Beaworthy is £427 or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the pro-visions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the Parish of North Lew (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with red) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Beaworthy to which it is contiguous.

" The Patron of the Benefices of North Lew with Ashbury and Halwill with Beaworthy is His Most Gracious Majesty King George the Fifth and the Reverend William Romaine Hervey is the Incumbent of North Lew with Ashbury and the Reverend Francis George Powell is the Incumbent of Halwill with Beaworthy.

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows :-

" SCHEME.

" It is proposed to separate from the Parish of North Lew and annex to the Parish f Beaworthy all that part of the Parish of North Lew being a portion of the Winsford Estate situate within the Eastern Boundary of the Parish of North Lew the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed hereto and edged with red.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Halwill with Beaworthy shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from North Lew.

" That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Beaworthy but shall cease to pe entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish of North Lew.

" That any inhabitant of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Beaworthy as they might have had in the Parish Church of North Lew.

'That no alterations shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

" That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge arising out of the land proposed to be separated from North Lew and added to the Parish of Beaworthy together with all glebe land, if any, in the area so to be separated is to remain the property of the Incumbent of North Lew as heretofore.

" Consents.

"We, The Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, First Lord of the Treasury, the " We, Patron entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of North Lew with Ashbury, and The Right Honourable George, Viscount Cave, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Patron entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of Halwill with Beaworthy, The Reverend William Romaine Hervey the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of North Lew with Ashbury and the Reverend Francis George Powell the Incumbent of the United Rectory of Halwill with Beaworthy hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing herein contained.

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" In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our respective hands this first day of July. 1926.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Shipton Bellinger and South Tidworth duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

⁴⁷ And whereas the said Benefice of South Tidworth is now full, the Reverend John Percival Thompson being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Shipton Bellinger is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said John Percival Thompson has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect: "And whereas there is a Parsonage House belonging to each of the said Benefices of Shipton Bellinger and South Tidworth but neither of such Parsonage Houses is suitable for a Parsonage House for the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows. that is to say:---

"1. That the said Benefice of Shipton Bellinger and the said Benefice of South Tidworth shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Shipton Bellinger with South Tidworth ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Percival Thompson if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Tidworth shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of South Tidworth shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Shipton Bellinger and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied towards the cost of the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of South Tidworth having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Shipton Bellinger having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, 'n accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England. or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Winchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

⁴ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Little Wittenham is now full the Reverend Walter Francis Bennett Ward being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Long Wittenham is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

say:— "1. That the said Benefice of Long Wittenham and the said Benefice of Little Wittenham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wittenham ' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Abingdon but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Little Wittenham only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Long Wittenham and the then Incumbent of Little Wittenham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Long Wittenham only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Little Wittenham; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Little Wittenham if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Long Wittenham shall have been instituted to Long Wittenham subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice but if he shall have been instituted to Long Wittenham before

that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Long Wittenham following such avoidance of the Benefice of Little Wittenham and the then Incumbent of Little Wittenham shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Long Wittenham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Little Wittenham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied by us towards such works of improvement to the Parsonage House of the United Benefice as to us shall appear desirable and any balance of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Little Wittenham shall have the first and the third turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Long Wittenham shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices I:ave been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Oxford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid: And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

WEST HARTLEPOOL CORPORATION (TRAMWAYS ABANDONMENT).

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT:

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the West 1923 Hartlepool Corporation Act, (hereinafter referred to as " the Act of 1923 ") the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of West Hartlepool (therein and hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation ") were authorised to provide maintain and equip trolley vehicles and to use the same upon the trolley vehicle routes therein described :

And whereas it is enacted by Section 17 of the Act of 1923 as follows:

(3) Any Order made under the provisions of this Section may as from such date as may be specified therein provide for the cesser of all or any of the powers liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to any tramway or light railway to be abandoned or discontinued in pursuance of such Order and may provide for the removal of the rails of such tramway or light railway and the restoration of the portion of the road upon which such rails were laid to as good a condition as that in which it was before such rails were laid down.'

And whereas in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Section 5 of the Act of 1923 the Corporation have provided and equipped trolley vehicles along the route of the tramways hereinafter described; that is to say:-----

(1) Portion of Tramway No. 1 authorised by the Hartlepool Tramways Order, 1883, commencing at a point 1.13 chains or thereabouts measured in a north-westerly direction from the north-west corner of the Public Library at the corner of Clarence Road and Clarence Street, passing thence along and terminating in Clarence Road at the point of commencement of Tramway No. 3 authorised by the same Order.

(2) Tramway No. 3 authorised by the Hartlepool Tramways Order, 1883, commencing by a junction with Tramway No. 1 in Cleveland Road at a point $\frac{3}{4}$ chain northeast of the south-west corner of the Police Station, passing thence into and along Cambridge Road, otherwise known as Wellington Road, and terminating in Cambridge Road, otherwise known as Wellington Road at a point $\frac{1}{4}$ chain north-west of the west side of Stockton Street.

(3) Tramway No. 3 authorised by the Hartlepool Electric Tramways Order, 1895, commencing in Cambridge Road by a junction with the existing Tramway No. 3 described in and authorised by the Hartlepool Tramways Order, 1883, at the point of termination thereof and proceeding thence in a westerly direction along Cambridge Road Wellington Road Victoria Road and Grange Road and terminating at a point in that road at the termination thereof and opposite the entrance to the Ward Jackson Park.
